

GROWING BOSWORTH

Harborough District Council is currently seeking the public's views on its Core Spatial Strategy. A key document of the Local Development Framework, this document is, in essence, the council's 'instruction book' on how to steer development within the district over the next 20 years.

The Core Strategy document sets out priorities, policies and targets for development areas, housing mix and commercial development and seeks to ensure that the local community infrastructure is maintained along the way.

The overall strategy outlines the need to develop a further 2,700 dwellings, over and above those already in the pipeline or planned, across the district. The proposals seek to focus development in areas where service and amenity provision is already established.

The key areas for development are, as expected, the larger communities. In Market Harborough the Airfield Farm 1,000 home and commercial centre scheme is in the forefront of thinking. In the next tier, Lutterworth and Broughton Astley are designated as key centres and deemed suitably placed to accommodate further development.

Closer to home, Husbands Bosworth has been identified, along with other villages such as Ullesthorpe, Billesdon and Great Glen, as a rural centre and deemed suitable for limited further development. Identification of areas for such development doesn't mean that it will automatically happen. Suitable sites need to be brought forward and demonstrate their commercial viability before they proceed into the due planning process.

The emphasis in schemes that are put forward will be on meeting diverse housing needs, including affordable housing, especially in rural areas, whilst safeguarding the individual character of settlements. The proposals also call for schemes to demonstrate green credentials and sustainable infrastructure and, hopefully, more than a passing nod for conservation and heritage issues.

The draft document 'Core Spatial Strategy: Pre-Submission Consultation' can be found on-line at www.harborough.gov.uk and views are currently being sought.

AIRCRASH MEMORIALS

During World War II, two aircraft, a Miles Master trainer and a Vickers Wellington, crashed close to Husbands Bosworth aerodrome, in the grounds of Bosworth Hall. Husbands Bosworth & District branch of the Royal British Legion, with the support of the Parish Council has decided to commemorate, with permanent memorials, those who lost their lives in these accidents and, indeed, all those who served at RAF Husbands Bosworth during the war.

Plinths and memorial plaques are to be erected at the sites of these accidents and an unveiling ceremony will take place on Saturday, December 4th. Two of the crew members of the Wellington who died were Australian, two were RAF and the aircraft was paid for by the people of Trinidad. A eucalyptus tree will be planted at the site of the Wellington crash, donated by the Royal Australian Air Force as a memorial to their countrymen who died.

Coffee, to welcome our guests, will be served at 10.00am at the Church Hall, Honeypot Lane. The unveiling ceremonies will take place at the crash sites at about 11.00am. The Royal British Legion chaplain will perform a dedication service and the Last Post will be played. Afterwards there will be a finger buffet and light refreshments in the Church Hall to which everyone is invited to attend. There will be a display of historical information relating to the RAF activities at Husbands Bosworth in wartime from the Historical Society's archive collection. This exhibition will also feature recent pictures of some of the wartime buildings that still remain today.

The crash sites are fairly close together but are in open agricultural land, part of which is cultivated. Therefore those attending the unveiling are advised to wear appropriate all-weather attire and robust footwear! A limited amount of transport will be provided to the sites and 4x4 motor vehicle access is possible nearby.

If you call the number you will hear a message and will already have been billed £15 for the connection. If you receive a card like this call Royal Mail Fraud on 0207 2396655.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday, November 2nd 2010.

Four Council members and two members of the public were present. Apologies received from Brian Smith. Visitors' Questions

Concerns were raised about school traffic using School Lane and incidents of inconsiderate parking by parents dropping off children at the school. The narrowness of the road and the lack of a properly defined raised footway were discussed. Whilst Council agreed to consult with Highways on behalf of the concerned parents and seek a site visit, it was felt that strong representation from the school authorities would carry more weight.

Matters arising from the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Council discussed the 'clouded' condition of the Butt Lane traffic safety mirror. It was noted that Highways cannot authorise the installation of these mirrors and that it would therefore be inappropriate for Council to directly support the replacement of the existing mirror. However, Council agreed to part-fund traffic safety measures for Butt Lane residents to administer as they felt appropriate.

The Clerk had obtained information about a universal padlock that could be opened by emergency services to gain access to the Playing Field and Play Area. It was agreed to purchase the required number. **Cemetery**

It was noted that the BTCV had completed the work to remove self-set saplings and trim back the overgrown yew trees in the cemetery.

Playing Field

A quotation for the installation of a surfaced pathway to the skatepark had been received. It was agreed not to progress this project at present but to seek further quotes in the next financial year. It was agreed to authorise the safety related repairs to the play equipment and skatepark, which were highlighted by the recent RoSPA report.

Council briefly discussed the condition of the pavilion after the Conker Championships. However, it was felt that this matter would be better aired at the next Playing Field Committee meeting. **Allotments**

Clerk informed Council that one plot had been relinquished. This had been offered to an applicant on the waiting list.

Traffic Issues

Funding for the Speed Indicator Device has been received and the progress of the project is now waiting for the results of the structural survey of the sites and authorisation by LCC.

Neighbourhood Watch

Concerns were raised that the NW automated messaging system was changing. Some Council members

had followed instructions on how to register for the new system on-line but were concerned that their submitted information had not been logged.

Correspondence & Planning

Council noted that Station Road had been omitted from the highways winter gritting schedule. Clerk was asked to ask LCC that the road be included. A letter outlining proposals for the High Street Garage site was discussed. It was agreed to await the formal submission of plans before making comments.

Any Other Business

Clerk informed Council that the waste bin for the High Street bus shelter site is to be erected. It was agreed to consider the Clerk's salary review at the next meeting.

Next meeting

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, December 7th at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.


