

## PARISH SHARE

**I**n round figures it costs about £20,000 a year to 'run' our parish church. This is the amount needed to cover the share our parish makes towards the minister's salary, our contribution towards the work of the diocese and the day-to-day running costs of the church itself, such as electricity, maintenance and insurance.

We are fortunate in having a very active band of villagers who are committed to keeping the fabric of our church together and raising these much-needed funds. With their enthusiasm and the generosity of other supporters our parish church is able to carry on its role as a focus point within our community.

Over the past 50 or so years the nature of church ministry, especially within rural parishes has changed. Fewer people feel the need, or have the time, to attend church regularly and the weight of responsibility for the upkeep inevitably falls on a diminishing group.

Locally church members see the need for change and would like to modernise our parish church to encourage more people to visit. Historically, in the past the church was often the largest building in the area and the natural meeting place for the people, not only for religious meetings but also for social events. Our church still has an important role to play in the modern life of the village by providing the venue for weddings, funerals, memorial services and baptisms and with the pastoral care within its ministry. An urgent project on the 'wish-list' would be the provision of toilet facilities within the church, which would enable the building to once more stage impressive 'crowd-pulling' events!

A few weeks ago the *Bugle* distributed a flyer on behalf of the Parochial Church Council, which sought help from local residents, not just churchgoers, in their task of securing funding for the future of our parish church. The suggestion was that villagers might consider some form of regular giving to help the PCC plan their future financial commitments.

Some villagers already give in the form of covenants; a direct donation of £5 to £25 per month, which may be enhanced by the Inland Revenue to the tune of 28p for every £, under the Gift Aid Scheme. There are other ways of giving for those who can't commit to regular giving and, of course, any help that you can give at church fund-raising functions, and cleaning, flower arranging or maintenance would be most welcome.

## QUARRY PROGRESS

**A**t the recent Quarry Liaison Group meeting members heard that Lafarge Aggregates, the operators of the Welford Road Quarry site, have applied for permission to fill redundant workings with inert waste. The application, filed under Leicestershire County Council's Waste Development Plan, seeks to extend the quarry's existing landfill permission to 2026. Over recent years the site has seen reduced amounts of infill material presented, due in part to the recycling and reuse of inert waste within the building industry and also the general industry downturn, leading the quarry's back-filling and reinstatement programme to fall behind schedule. The application seeks to continue in-filling on the quarry's eastern site, off Welford Road, on land presently used for settling and silt storage. However, due to reduced amounts any work is likely to be carried out on a 'per campaign' basis rather than as a continuous process.

Proposals for re-opening the formerly worked site to the east of the Butt Lane bridle track are currently being considered by Leicestershire County Council. It is hoped that work to open up new settling pools can commence here later in the summer. A rethink by Lafarge on the operation of this extension site may see a conveyor system, rather than the previously discussed haul system across the bridleway, being used.

The meeting heard that throughput at the site, especially at the bagging plant, was significantly up on the comparable period last year and traffic movements were recorded at 640 per month; 70% of which turn towards Husbands Bosworth.

# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

## Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2011.

Four Councillors were present.

*Mrs. Patricia Hobson was co-opted, and accepted nomination, onto the Parish Council.*

**Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.**

### Matters Arising from the Minutes

Council noted that the cemetery paths had been sprayed. Generally the grass work by the new contractors in the cemetery was very good. It was noted that the extra grass cuts on the Village Green areas had improved the appearance markedly and it was agreed to continue this.

Members discussed the storage of information gathered with the Speed Indicator Device. Whilst the amount of information was extensive the actual file size in a digital format was relatively low so it was agreed to monitor the situation regarding long term storage.

### Cemetery

Clerk had still to get a quotation for excavating the soakaway drain.

### Playing Field

Repairs and renovations to the skatepark equipment had recently been carried out.

Following requests from dog owners members discussed the possibility of erecting a dog walking section within the playing field. After discussion it was agreed that any significant area removed from the field for this purpose would impinge on the pitch areas. Council also voiced concerns over suitable access to such a site and difficulties in preventing children accessing the area. Members felt that the village was well served with easily accessed public walking areas, including the Millennium Wood and bridle tracks, where dogs could be exercised.

### Allotments

*[Council members had met at the allotments site prior to the meeting.]* Council noted a number of overgrown plots and the Clerk was asked to write to the plot holders asking them to cut down any weeds before they seeded. It was agreed to produce a plan of the allotments site with plot holders names and delineating their plot boundaries and post this on the noticeboard for information.

### Traffic Issues

Council heard that a dossier of information from the Speed Indicator Device was being produced. Results would be monitored over a further period to enable more analysis and a report would then be submitted to the Leicestershire Road Safety Team with a view to calling for enforcement measures.

### Neighbourhood Watch

Members were concerned that the new scheme for transmitting information was of little use at a local level. Clerk was asked to contact the local co-ordinator voicing Council's concerns.

### Rural Housing Scheme

The meeting heard that the project was still 'live' but that funding may be stalling the project. Clerk was asked to contact HDC to find out at what stage the project was at.

### Correspondence

A letter from the Cricket Club regarding rabbit damage to the pitch was discussed. Council noted that any control measures would be difficult on the playing field due to public access. It was felt that the rabbits were coming in from neighbouring fields and that once the grass was cut the rabbits could be controlled from outside the playing field.

### Any other business

Council queried the recent spate of late working at the quarry. It was noted that this was due to a backlog of orders at the bagging plant. Council agreed to monitor the situation as it was felt that the operations were outside the site's permitted operating times.

Members discussed the lack of information regarding the proposed resurfacing of Bell Lane and Berridges Lane, which had been postponed from March and rescheduled for May but had still not been carried out.

*The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, August 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall. Council members will meet at the Welford Road cemetery at 6.45pm.*
