SPEED MERCHANTS

We make no apologies for bringing the village's Speed Indicator Device onto the *Bugle* front page for the third time in four months. The device has been up and running now for four months and has been quietly gathering 'evidence' of traffic speeds, vehicle movements and flow characteristics.

Whilst generally traffic speeds within the core of the village are, on average, close to the 30mph limit, some striking readings have been noted. We reported in last month's *Bugle*, top speeds of 103mph on Welford Road and 95mph on Kilworth Road. Such speeds beggar belief. Perhaps more worrying are speeds of over 60mph on the High Street in the centre of the village. Being in control of the device means that we can direct it to where we feel it will be most effective. So, you may find that the SID lingers longer at some locations!

Data gathered by the device is presently being analysed and will shortly be presented before the Road Safety Partnership with a request for more frequent speed enforcement camera visits. The information can also be used to call for more permanent road safety measures, such as a 20mph zone near the school or improved road markings.

Editor's Note: If you've not seen SID yet the chances are that you've not activated it - award yourself a few Brownie points!

FESTIVE FARE

Despite a decidedly inclement start to the day, Bosworth Festival 2011 was deemed a success by the organisers and all who participated. A record number of stalls served slightly fewer customers, due possibly to the overcast weather. Whilst exhibitors and stall holders did note "difficult trading conditions", probably due to the general economic situation, everyone seemed to enjoy the day and felt that it was a worthwhile venture.

Although the gate takings were slightly down, the returns from stall holder donations and exhibitor contributions boosted the overall takings and ensured that £1,200 was again available for distribution to worthy causes. Chief beneficiaries this year were Harborough FM, Loros, Leicestershire Clubs for Young People, St. John's Ambulance, the British Legion and the Help the Heroes Appeal.

The evening Picnic on the Lawn gains in popularity year on year as a community event. This year it was particularly encouraging that large numbers of local families and young children stayed to bop the night away to Stuart Begley's music.

The Man of the Match Award must go, as always, to Nobby Clarke for his enthusiasm, without which the Festival would undoubtedly struggle. Thanks must also go to Robert and Susan Constable-Maxwell for allowing vast numbers of strangers to take over their Park and garden.

WATCH WORD

THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME WITHIN HUSBANDS BOSWORTH

Police in Leicester city have issued an urgent warning to people to be vigilant following reports of people posing as plain-clothed police officers in order to commit robbery. The people, who are usually a man and a woman, are not in uniform, but claim to be plain clothes officers. They stop a person and ask to search them before making off with items from the victim's bag or pocket. Genuine police officers will always show their warrant card which contains their photograph, rank and collar number. All officers carry these, even those not in uniform.

Although these incidents have occurred in the city, police suspect that they will move out into the county if they are not apprehended.

CALL 101

Police forces across England and Wales are ready to roll out 101 as the new police nonemergency number - the number to call when you need to call your local police but when it's less urgent than 999.

101 will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and is due to be adopted by every police force in England by early 2012.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

The Historical Society's Periodical Journal

The Turville Memorial Hall

When the Harborough Advertiser reported the official opening of the Turville Memorial Hall in 1896 they noted: "The memory of Sir Francis Turville is still green in the recollection of all who knew him, and the desire to erect some suitable memorial to him has long been cherished. During the past few months inhabitants of Husbands Bosworth have witnessed the realisation of their hopes by the erection of a convenient Village Hall." The fabric of the building was completed at a cost of £880. A Grand Bazaar was held in November 1894 to raise funds to provide heating and furnishing for the Hall and was opened by Her Serene Highness Princess Henry of Pless. A concert in the evening was well supported: "...a crowd assembled and there was a crush like one would see at a London Theatre. The Hall quickly filled... and every vantage was seized, even the high window ledges, which required some exercise of climbing skill to reach. It is estimated that some 250 were present."

BUGLE CRACKER


