BUILDING PLOT...

With things stirring on the Begley's Yard site off Church Lane local residents have recently renewed their original concerns about the proposed development of the site.

Although the decision on the Begley site was initially deferred by Harborough planners, plans for 11 homes on the site were eventually passed two years ago, controversially without any community contribution element to fund access improvements or local infrastructure. The decision was contested at the time by local residents who felt let down that their concerns regarding access, traffic and the overbearing nature of the proposed development had not been taken into consideration and their loss had been compounded by the lack of Section 106 funding.

Now the group is seeking a review of the decision to waive the community funding, which they felt had been based on the owner's calculations of the viability of the site. The then Chief Executive of the Council, Sue Smith, refused to divulge information about the feasibility of the project as it was deemed to be financially sensitive to the applicant, Peter Begley. A renewed application to the new Chief Executive now reveals that the waiving of the S106 contribution was based on the 'viability of the site'; an argument, the group feels, that any developer could use to wriggle out of their social responsibility.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

The Historical Society's Periodical Journal

This month we dip into a bound copy of the Parish Magazine of 1885, which was recently presented to the Society by Aneurin Owen.

Today we take for granted our accessibility to books and newspapers. However, in 1885, reading and the knowledge that it brought, was mostly a privilege of the better off members of the community. The Victorians' thirst for knowledge and information spawned the formation of community reading rooms across the kingdom, where newspapers and books were available for general use.

"Mr. Stratton has kindly placed at our disposal two rooms in the house lately occupied by Mrs. Colston *[now Caldecott House, Kilworth Road]* for the purpose of a Village Reading Room." Within a month the membership stood at 40 and villagers were encouraged to use the facility: "...we feel sure such a visit....would lead to more general interest in the welfare of the young men of this Parish. It is hoped that eventually a Reading Room and Village Hall will be built."

Funds for the running of the Reading Room services and for building the new Reading Room and Village Hall, which it was estimated would cost in the region of £250, were raised throughout the year by various activities. A Sale of Work and Bazaar was to be held in the Rectory Gardens in August, for which contributions of fancy and plain work, books, magazines, periodicals, mechanical toys and other "…useful and ornamental Articles" were sought. In the event the bazaar was postponed until December, as it was discovered that four other bazaars were planned locally at about the same time as the one planned for Bosworth!

A successful Art Loan Exhibition was held during Whitsun-tide in the village National School, with a large number of valuable and interesting items kindly lent for the occasion. Lectures were given on the microscope and the phonograph, and a magic lantern show was presented. A sum of £15 was duly raised after expenses had been paid.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, August 2nd.

Full council present and 2 members of the public. District Councillor Brian Smith had a prior engagement but arrived later.

Visitors' Questions

Welford resident, Nigel Brotherton, updated Council on Welford village's application for an Amenity Weight Restriction. Welford Parish Council understood that the estimated cost of additional signing, upgrading of alternative routes and the redirection of HGV traffic would be about £1/2m. In the present economic climate it was unlikely that the work would progress.

Mr. Brotherton, who mows Bosworth playing field and cricket pitch on behalf of the Parish Council also noted extensive rabbit damage and dangerous holes especially on the practice football pitch. It was felt that the rabbits were coming in off the adjacent fields and that now the fields had been cut measures could be taken to control them.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising from the Minutes

Council agreed to contact the school governors offering to support a call for a 20mph zone along Welford Road past the school.

An extended 3 year insurance deal at an advantageous rate was approved.

Council noted that the long-awaited road works may be imminent on Bell Lane and Berridges Lane.

Members discussed the rebuilding scheme for the wall between the cemetery and the allotments. It was agreed to obtain quotes for rebuilding another section, which would complete the repairs of the unstable sections.

Playing Field

The recent RoSPA play equipment report had highlighted a number of minor defects. Clerk was asked to contact the contractors with a view to carrying out the necessary repairs.

Traffic Issues

Council discussed recent data collected by the Speed Indicator Device. It was agreed to seek permission to move the station at the bottom of Berridges Lane as it was felt that readings may be affected by slow-moving traffic turning right out of Bell Lane.

Neighbourhood Watch

No response had been received from the local co-ordinator regarding Council's concerns about the lack of local relevance in information received.

Rural Housing Scheme

No further information had been received concerning the progress of the scheme. District Councillor Smith agreed to contact HDC.

Correspondence

Council had received correspondence outlining Planning Procedure for new councillors. It was felt that an update for all members would be beneficial. Councillors therefore agreed to invite a member of the HDC planning team to address a meeting and invite members from neighbouring villages.

Any other business

Council noted that most of the storm drains around the village and on Welford Road were silted up. Clerk was asked to contact Highways.

The problem of dog mess on the bridle track between School Lane to Butt Lane was discussed. As the track is outside the curtilage of the village it was felt that the problem was outside the jurisdiction of the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 2000. It was suggested that the problem be highlighted in the *Bosworth Bugle*, urging dog walkers to pick up and deposit their dog mess in the bin provided on Butt Lane. *The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, September 6th at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall. Councillors will meet at the Play Area at 6.45pm.*
