Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, September 6th.

Four council members and 6 members of the public were present. Apologies were received from Councillors Patricia Hobson & Susan Fisher and District Councillor Brian Smith.

Visitors' Questions

- •Residents of properties close to the proposed wind turbine on land adjacent to Pincet Lane outlined their opposition to the project. The meeting discussed the relevant planning and local policy issues and advised the opponents of the scheme to concentrate on the detrimental effect on the landscape character as being the aspect most likely to sway the planners.
- •The meeting discussed the Begley's Yard development. Council noted that the plans had been approved and that the only way the layout could be modified would be if the developer re-applied.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising from the Minutes

- •Council agreed to seek further quotes for excavating a soakaway in the cemetery extension.
- •It was noted that the cemetery paths appear not to have been sprayed.

Cemetery

•Clerk informed Council that quotations for rebuilding the cemetery southern boundary wall were being sought.

Playing Field

Councillors had met at the Play Area prior to the meeting.

- •Council agreed that the minor repairs highlighted by the recent RoSPA report should be carried out. Some wear and tear repairs would be carried out at the same time. No safety related issues on the Play Equipment or Skatepark apparatus were noted.
- •Clerk informed Council that the Highways Authority had identified one roadside tree adjacent to the Play Area as dangerous and requested that it be removed. Several other trees nearby had dead branches that needed removing. Clerk was asked to obtain quotes for carrying out the necessary work.

Traffic Issues

- •Council noted that the blocked storm drains on Welford road had not yet been cleared. Clerk was asked to contact Highways again.
- •Permission had been granted to move the Speed Indicator Device station from the lower end of Berridges Lane to a more suitable site outside Wing House. As the post was new a structural survey was not necessary.

Rural Housing Scheme

•Correspondence from East Midlands Housing, the developer likely to undertake the Exception Site development on Welford Road, indicated that they were still consulting with Leicestershire County Council regarding the release of the site.

Any other business

•Council discussed the problem of a large quantity of tyres dumped on Boat Horse Lane. It was noted that the site was off the public highway and clearing the tyres would be the responsibility of the landowner.

The next meeting of the Parish Council would be on Tuesday, October 4th at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall. Council members will meet at The Green at 6.45pm and will be carrying out an inspection of Berridges Lane, Dag Lane and Mowsley Road.


