

BOSWORTH WATCH

This month we are asking *Bugle* readers to help us build up a regular feature on criminal activity or anti-social behaviour issues that occur around the area.

The idea follows up a suggestion made at a recent Parish Council meeting where concerns were raised that the new Neighbourhood Watch information scheme isn't supplying enough specific information on local crime. Happily Bosworth isn't a hot-bed of criminal activity but we know that incidents do occasionally occur, few of which get any public airing.

We all know that we tend to step up our own security or awareness if something untoward happens close to home. So the *Bugle* hopes to use this same principle by publishing brief notes about local incidents to raise awareness, especially on minor issues that might not warrant police action. You might want to warn others that door-to-door sales people have been seen cold calling in the area or perhaps in a neighbouring village, that suspicious activity has been observed near outlying stables or that the lead has gone off Marston Trussell church again...

We're not looking for specifics - we definitely won't publish names or identify victims or informants. We won't be specific in locations either - a simple "burglary attempted at a home on Welford Road", or "break-in at farm workshop in Sibbertoft" is enough information to draw the attention of residents to what might be happening in the area.

All we ask is that you are reasonably confident that the incident is valid, preferably by first hand knowledge and that you supply your contact details, which we obviously won't divulge, to signify to us that the information is supplied in good faith.

Obviously if you suspect a crime is taking place or any reportable incident occurs you will call the police, either on 999 or the new non-emergency number 101. But if you hear of anything, after the fact, that you think would be helpful to other villagers give us a call on 880281 and leave a message or email: bosworth_bugle@talk21.com

If your 'tip-off' raises awareness it might prevent a further incident.

REGAL WAVE...

FLASH LIGHT...

Hopes that the Olympic Torch might pass through Bosworth on its way from Coventry to Market Harborough were soon dashed when the map of the official route was consulted. Instead of making the direct route, through Lutterworth and all the villages along the A4304 and increasing the 95% that Lord Coe tells us will be within 10 miles from the route, we find that the torch will take the barren M45 and M1 from Daventry to Northampton and on to Corby before doubling back to Harborough, Lubenham and Foxton. The A4304 route would have enabled the torch to have been carried by runners... presumably a cavalcade of Eddie Stobart trucks will carry it along the motorway...

CROSS-OVER...

On page 3 we carry a brief report of the recent Quarry Liaison Group meeting. At the meeting the question of the proposed north-eastern extension to the quarry and provision for crossing the Butt Lane bridle-way was discussed.

A plan of the proposal to install a dumper truck road for quarry traffic and controlled crossing point over the bridle-way between the new workings and the existing processing plant has now been published.

DRIVER WARNING

Be aware of a new crime trend when travelling alone in remote areas, especially in the dark. WATCH WORD

THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME WITHIN HUSBANDS BOSWORTH

In a recent crackdown Lutterworth and Market Harborough police issued fixed penalty fines of £60 plus an automatic 3 points on the licences of 29 drivers who were using their mobile phones whilst driving.

There has been a spate of car key burglaries in the county in the past couple of months. Over 20 homes in North West Leicestershire and Hinckley and Bosworth districts have been entered, car keys stolen and vehicles driven away.

A house in total darkness is a sure sign no one is at home and is an open invitation to burglars. Most criminals look for quick-win opportunities and won't want to run the risk of a confrontation. So simply leaving a light on to give the impression someone is at home is often enough to deter them. Timer switches can also be fitted to operate radios and lights if you're not back from work until after dark or if you're away for a few days. Leaving a low energy lamp on for 8 hours a day will cost less than 5p a week.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

A ROUND-UP OF LOCAL NEWS

QUARRY UPDATE

At the recent meeting of the Quarry Liaison group members heard that production at the Welford Road plant had held up well during the summer. Monthly vehicle movements averaged just under 800, of which approximately 60% passed through Bosworth. The landfill site has been open for a short period in order to cater for a specific contract in the autumn. Restoration works have commenced at the southern end of the site near Glebe Farm and are now near to the Scheduled Ancient Monument.

Subject to planning approval, the company intends to start work on the northern extension site off Butt Lane in spring 2012. The first stage would be to establish the bridleway crossing and new fencing. Initially work would concentrate on establishing a silt disposal lagoon.

It was noted that the security system had been activated on a number of occasions recently. The meeting heard that the site is monitored remotely and intruders are warned via Tannoy to leave. The security company can call in their retained team or the police to investigate intrusions. It was confirmed that a fuel bowser had been stolen from the site in August.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

The Historical Society's Periodical Journal

A report from the *Harborough Advertiser* dated 1936, noted that Market Harborough Rural Council was actively addressing the problem of insanitary and unsatisfactory housing within Husbands Bosworth, under the terms of the Housing Act 1935.

Five houses in Satchell's Yard, off School Lane, were to be demolished and new housing built on the site. The Housing Committee had inspected the houses and the owner had agreed to sell the property and also the adjoining gardens for additional housing.

The Committee also recommended that two houses in Bell Lane should come under a Demolition Order and that two further houses in Leicester Road, belonging to a Mr. Moore, be reconditioned and converted into one. Four houses in Berridges Lane would come under a Clearance Order, along with nine houses of similar status in Butt Lane.

At a later meeting it was agreed to purchase the five houses and garden land belonging to Mr. Satchell, at an agreed price of £250, the Rural Council to carry all costs.

Twenty-two cases of overcrowding were noted elsewhere in the report.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, November 1st 2011.

Present: 5 Parish Councillors, District Councillor Brian Smith and 1 member of the public.

Apologies: Mr. Forman who was at another meeting but would attend later if possible.

Visitors' Questions

A resident attended the meeting to discuss Council's proposals for celebrating the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012 and to offer help from FOBS. After discussion, Council agreed to allocate a session at the beginning of the December meeting and to invite other groups/individuals to come along with ideas and offers of help.

District Councillor Brian Smith informed Council that the application for a wind turbine on Pincet Lane, North Kilworth had been refused.

The Speed Indicator Device had been returned to the manufacturers to sort out a condensation problem. Further fixing points for the device were being sought, in conjunction with Leicestershire County Council, to record exiting traffic as well as incoming traffic. Thanks were expressed to District Councillor Smith for his work on this project.

At the recent meeting of the Quarry Liaison Committee it was learned that the problems with the new alarm system had been addressed. However, there had been more thefts from the quarry premises, including a fuel bowser.

Matters Arising from the Minutes

Aggregate for the cemetery drainage work had been obtained at a discounted price from Lafarge Aggregates.

Three quotations had been received to re-build part of the cemetery wall.

An East Midlands Housing Association officer would attend the December meeting to give an update on the progress of the Rural Housing Scheme.

Councillors had viewed the Country Properties building to assess the possibility of purchasing it to use as a Parish Office. The Clerk was looking at possibilities of grants and other funding for the project.

Cemetery

The soakaway had been installed in the extension.

Council had previously agreed to seek tenders for grass cutting for the 2012 season.

Playing Field/Play Area

It was agreed that the money precepted for works at the pavilion was for the specific purpose of providing a more user-friendly floor covering in the tea room and would be withdrawn if not used for this purpose.

It was noted that works to the play area equipment had not yet been fully completed. Clerk to make sure that the non-returning gate into the playing field was dealt with.

Following consultation with a tree surgeon it was found that a second tree needed to be felled rather than reduced.

Traffic Issues

It was noted that contractors' vehicles had been parking on the grass verge opposite Bosworth House on Berridges Lane.

The poor state of the footpath on Leicester Road leading to the canal towpath would be reported to Leicestershire County Council Highways.

Correspondence and Planning

A resident asked if the Council would agree to money being raised to put a canopy with lighting over the skatepark area so that the facility could be used in the winter months. Councillors would discuss this at the December meeting.
