

MAJOR SURGERY

At the recent Parish Council meeting David Bell of the Harborough Medical Centre and Sarah Taylor of Husbands Bosworth Surgery outlined recent improvements to medical services in the village.

The surgery is now run in conjunction with the Harborough Medical Centre, which will enable the Husbands Bosworth centre to offer a wider range of facilities. Core GP consulting services will be carried out at Bosworth by Dr. Jon Crowley, Dr. Hugh Delargy, Dr. Clare Cavanagh and Dr. Stacey Harrison. They will be supported by Extended Nurse Practitioner Sister Elaine Curley, who will carry out minor illness clinics, diabetic specialist Sister Zen Manship and Nurse Practitioner Sister Debbie Warner. Blood test clinics will increase to three sessions per week, and simple joint and muscle injections will be possible at Bosworth. Additionally, minor out-patient surgery that would previously have been carried out at hospital, will be possible at Bosworth, whilst more complex minor surgery procedures, perhaps requiring local anaesthetic, will be offered at Harborough Medical Centre.

Patients will also have the opportunity to make appointments to see specialists at Harborough, with all medical records available at both centres. Improvements to telephone bookings should be evident shortly, following the installation of a new telephone system. In addition, internet booking is being rolled out.

Longer term improvements planned for the surgery, including extending the consulting facilities, will require more extensive treatment, and is likely to involve building a completely new surgery complex within the village.

TRADING STANDARDS ALERT

Leicestershire Trading Standards has recently received reports of elderly and vulnerable residents who have received cold-callers offering to jet-wash paving, carry out home or garden repairs.

Large sums are charged for little work and once the resident agrees to have the work carried out and the traders gain access to the property pressure is applied on the resident to have other jobs done.

No cancellation rights are given and the traders start work straight away, without any written agreement or specification.

A training day for volunteers will take place on Saturday, April 6th at St. Peter's Church, Tilton on the Hill.

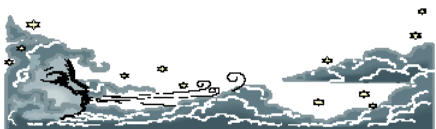
LOCAL NEWS IN BRIEF

SCHOOL REPORT

HUSBANDS BOSWORTH C. of E. PRIMARY SCHOOL Head Teacher Louisa Morris

This half term has been busy with the return of sporting action in the form of football and cross country running. Our children (and staff and parents!) have battled sleet, snow and rain to train and participate in local competitions. Our cross-country runners still have one more race in which to compete before the selections are made for the area team. Meanwhile, our young and inexperienced football team battled hard to score an overall draw in the recent Syd East Football Tournament. Huge thanks to all our parents who supported us by transporting children and cheering along on the sidelines. An especially big thank you to parent-governor, Kenny Anderson for volunteering his coaching skills.

Thanks also to all members of the village community who came along to the recent FOBS fundraising Tabletop Sale. There was a variety of stalls; with the refreshments proving particularly popular! Well done to Hayleigh Turner, our budding pianist, who provided entertainment and raised money for the school and Comic Relief while doing so. On the same day parent and school governor Marc Rowley donned a pirate outfit for a sponsored run from Market Bosworth to Husbands Bosworth; again a big thank you for a spectacular effort which saw the run completed in an impressive 4½ hours. The money raised by these events is still being counted, but will be used to support and enhance the enjoyment our children have for learning. My final thanks are of course to our hard-working FOBS volunteers who put so much time and effort into organising events to support our children.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

The Historical Society's Periodical Journal

Villager Pat Heighton has recently passed to the Historical Society a rent book that belonged to Thomas Henry Porter, who was a saddler in the village in the first half of the twentieth century. The ledger meticulously logs his expenses, the repairs carried out, the tradesmen that he employed and the returns generated for a number of properties that he owned in Husbands Bosworth and Welford from 1906 to 1952 and makes a fascinating social history.

Thomas bought 3 cottages in West End, Welford in 1906 for the sum of £180. A cottage in Back Street, Welford cost £60 but expenses for renovations for the Welford portfolio cost over £100.

Later he notes that he paid £275 for two cottages on the corner of Church Street and Church Lane (then known locally as Gilby's Lane) in Bosworth in March 1911, adding the two cottages adjoining these on Church Lane for £175 soon after. The records show that the Bosworth cottages returned £27.10s (£27.50) in their first year, but expenses of over £10 left a return on capital of only 3¾%. Thomas was obviously reasonably pleased with this, as he notes that he gave each tenant a one shilling (5p) Christmas box! It is interesting to note the local businesses that he dealt with. Gilby, the painter and decorator and later Mr. Leago are mentioned in numerous transactions - Leago being paid £8.10s for painting the outside of the four Bosworth cottages in 1935. Knights did most of the major building repairs - 6/9d (34p) in 1924 for fitting a chimney pot on Mr. Martin's house [Mr. Porter allowed himself 7/6d (37½p) in the account for providing the pot!]. The pumps and wells were obviously troublesome; expenses for repairs to these featuring regularly in the accounts.

Mr. Porter also notes in the book his purchase of 10, High Street, Husbands Bosworth for his own occupation, from Mr. M. Wells, the proprietor of the woodyard, for £450 for which he needed a £250 mortgage.

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, March 5th 2013

Apologies were received from Mr. Brain and District Councillor Smith.

Visitors' Questions

Mr. David Bell of Harborough Medical Centre and Mrs. Sarah Taylor of Bosworth Surgery updated Council on changes proposed for the surgery and reiterated their commitment to developing the facilities within Bosworth. Some discussion of the matter took place.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

Concerns were raised regarding communications with HDC via the central switchboard. These concerns would be brought to the attention of District Councillor Smith.

The ivy overhanging Green Lane appears to be the responsibility of the Highways authority rather than the adjacent landowner. Matter to be brought to the attention of Highways. The unstable wall on the south side of the lane had been reduced in height.

The poor condition of the Butt Lane bridle path past the quarry extension had been noted by the quarry management who had taken steps to rectify the problem. It was further noted that the gates to the new workings were not always closed when work was in progress.

Cemetery

A site meeting to assess the work to the Chapel of Rest would be called as soon as the weather improved.

Overgrowth under the boundary hedges needed cutting back before the growing season commenced. Clerk to consult with the contractors.

Playing Field/ Play Area

Clerk informed Council that she had been unable to contact a mole clearance contractor to deal with the mole problem. Further inquiries to be made.

Traffic Issues

The results gathered by the Speed Indicator were now posted in an analysed format on the County Council's www.bealocalhero.com website.

The meeting heard that the problem of unsheeted wood-chip loads from Pebble Hall was being monitored by Lutterworth Police. Loads seen recently were now generally sheeted.

Rural Housing Scheme

The meeting heard that work was due to start on March 18th.

Correspondence

A letter was circulated relating to stray dogs wandering onto the highway on a number of occasions recently. Clerk to check if HDC still had a dog warden to advise on the matter.

Any Other Business

It was agreed to host a village day on Sunday, June 2nd to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the Queen's coronation. A barbecue would be provided and the beacon would be lit in the evening. The Pavilion would be open and villagers could bring their own picnics and make their own entertainment during the day.

Council heard that preliminary meetings relating to the provision of high-speed Broadband had indicated that Bosworth would be unlikely to be within the initial area for development.

Mrs. Hobson urged villagers to continue to register their interest on the BT website.
