NEWS FROM BOSWORTH SURGERY

PATIENT PARTICIPATION AWARENESS WEEK

The first ever national Patient Participation Week will run from June 1st to 8th 2013 and is being organised across the country by the National Association for Patient Participation to promote assurance that the patient's perspective is at the heart of local health services. Market Harborough Medical Centre and the Husbands Bosworth Surgery have an active Patient Participation Group, which helps with securing patient feedback, improving services and promoting the services at the surgeries. In the last year, the PPG has been instrumental in encouraging the practices to improve their waiting rooms, to replace their telephone systems and to develop new services. The PPG also supports the surgeries at their open days and local community events.

We have 15 members across the two surgeries who help canvass patient opinion on a variety of topics and feed these back to the surgeries on a regular basis. Patients can get in touch with us through the practice websites or at our meet-and-greet sessions at the surgeries. The National Association for Patient Participation (NAPP) is a charity formed in 1978, which acts as an umbrella body for over 900 Patient Participation Groups across the UK. The NAPP web site is at www.napp.org.uk. The practices agree the content of a patient survey with the PPG each year, along with an action plan based on the results of the survey. The PPG holds an Annual Meeting each year which is open to patients and the public. BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

You could be forgiven for thinking that this was a picture of a war-time battle scene. It was taken about 1960, during improvement works to the Leicester Road as you approach the village.

The picture reminds us that the road from Leicester into the village once followed the line of the hedge in the left background of the photo, in a straight line down the hill and met Walton Lane at an acute corner, to the side of where Walton Lodge stands today. The gentle sweep of the road that we know today is marked by the raw excavations and new fence-line on the right.

Historically, Walton Lane was the original main route to Leicester, connecting through Peatling Parva to Welford Road, Foston and Welford Road, Blaby.



The building of the Northampton to Leicester Turnpikes in the late 1700s created the new road. A motorway of it's era, the turnpike studiously by-passed all the minor villages along it's path. Even today the village centres of Arnesby, Shearsby, Creaton, and Spratton lie off the main road.

Visitors' Ouestions

Mr. J. Clarke discussed proposals to create a new access onto Berridges Lane. He pointed out that the removal of the existing garage would enable vehicles to pull off the highway and turn within the property. Council felt that the dimensions of the area would be evident to planners and that the creation of a new access and objections to that, from Highways, would be more problematic for the planning application. Council members noted that the wall to be removed was within the village Conservation Area and as such would be afforded a certain degree of protection.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

It was noted that the quarry crossing gates on the Butt Lane bridle track were being left open during working hours, even when no quarry traffic was crossing. Council understood that the gates would be closed to secure the quarry site when not in use. Clerk was asked to contact the quarry management. Further complaints about woodchip fouling from the Pebble Hall processing plant, along the High Street, were noted. It was felt that although loads passing through the village were now sheeted, in some cases the sheeting was inadequate. Mr. Brain agreed to follow up this matter with the relevant authorities. Clerk had received one quote for re-grading the Play Area car park but Council asked that a quote for stripping and re-laying the area be sought.

Cemetery

Following a recent site meeting Clerk reported that she is in the process of drawing up a specification for the restoration of the Chapel of Rest. Clerk was also seeking information on grant opportunities.

Council noted that work to the hedges and margins of the cemetery had not been carried out.

Playing Field & Play Area

A meeting of the Playing Field Committee was scheduled for May 15th at which proposals to enclose the pavilion verandah will be discussed.

Following discussions with Mr. Brotherton, who has carried out the field mowing for a number of years, it was decided that it was uneconomic to refurbish the gang-mowers. Council agreed to take over the mowing of the outer field and would

seek quotes. The Cricket Club would continue to maintain the cricket 'square'.

Some damage was noted to part of the Skatepark equipment. Council agreed to remove the vandalised equipment on safety grounds.

Correspondence and Planning

Council heard that Harborough Planning Enforcement team had visited the High Street Garage site to ensure that the work carried out complied with the permitted plans.

Council members voiced concerns over some of the working practices on the site.

Any Other Business

Members agreed the format for the Coronation Day celebrations on the Playing Field. It was agreed to start proceedings at 4.00pm to culminate in the beacon lighting at dusk.

Council noted more weathering damage to the War Memorial plinth. It was agreed to discuss the options for repair with the contractors.

It was agreed to purchase two new benches whilst they were on special offer. One would be sited in the cemetery and one would replace one of the benches in the Play Area.

Mrs. Hobson had attended a follow-up Broadband meeting but was disappointed that Bosworth was apparently not in an area scheduled for up-graded service provision.

A request to metal-detect on the village Playing Field was rejected.

Council discussed renovating the Victorian horse trough opposite Honeypot Lane as a feature. It was agreed to hold a site meeting prior to next meeting.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, June 4th at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
