POWER SURGE

The promoters of the Pebble Hall Farm energy generation plant, off Theddingworth Road, are preparing a planning application to modify the existing planning permission for a Renewable Energy Generation Facility (REGF) at the site. Although the existing permission was implemented in part, and wood waste has been treated at the site, the power generation facility, due to commercial reasons, was never constructed.

A new planning application is necessary as the building would be moved within the site for operational reasons and to improve access between the fuel preparation area and the power plant. The new application will also seek to increase the power generated. Total traffic movements using the site access will not exceed those already agreed with Leicestershire County Council as all of the existing workshops/storage units will be removed.

The planning application is likely to be submitted to Northamptonshire County Council in September.

BOSWORTH HOMES

Further to our piece in last month's Bugle we now have more: we now have more information about the application procedure for the new homes being built on Welford Road. The scheme offers affordable housing to applicants who have a local connection and the first criteria is that applicants should be registered on the District Council Housing List.

There will be two 2 bed houses available to purchase under the Shared Ownership Scheme. These properties are being marketed by Hello Homes (part of East Midlands Housing Group) and anyone interested is asked to contact the team for more information on 0844 892 2506.

There are also six rented properties, consisting of four 2 bed houses, 1 x 3 bed house and a 2 bed bungalow and these will be let and managed by Leicestershire Housing Association. Call their management team on 01530 278080 for more details.

Editor's Note: This development is to be called Knights Close to commemorate the Knight brothers, keen village cricketers who played on the field on which the new homes are being built when it was the village cricket field.

DOG TIRED...

Tarborough District Council enforcement team are cracking down on dog owners following a sharp rise in fouling incidents. Residents are urged to report incidents so that patrols can be better targeted and culprits caught and fined.

Dog fæces can carry harmful infections, such as toxocariasis, a parasite which causes serious eye infections which can lead to blindness. Council enforcement officers are appealing to dog owners to pick up after their pets. On-the-spot dog fouling fines of £50 can be issued, which increase to £75 if the bag is dropped as litter. 

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection



Just in case anyone doubted the picture view from the top of the church spire, which we featured in last month's Bugle!

Note the ladders crudely lashed together. No doubt the Health & Safety officers of the day lay awake at night worrying about situations like this! The steeplejack does however appear to be wearing the regulation flat cap, just in case he should take a tumble...

We think that this was likely to be the last time anyone has ventured up the spire, and we guess from the full photograph, and the view from the top in the previous one that we featured, that this was before the roadworks straightened out the corner in 1960. Does anyone remember this work on the spire?

As we noted last month, the Historical Society has the original weathercock, which we assume was the focus of the steeplejack's attention at this time. Made of soldered tin and roughly gilded, the weathercock carries the obligatory scars of service; a number of bullet 'wounds'.

Interestingly, the weathercock itself appears to be missing in this shot. Presumably it had already been taken down, or had fallen down, and the steeplejack is preparing the spire's stone finial ready for its replacement.

Incidently, the weathercock stands about 3 feet (100cm) tall, and would have been up to the man's waist in this view.

HARBOROUGH-ON-SEA
