

## BOSWORTH SUPERSTORE

**W**ork, which should see the new *Springfields* supermarket on the High Street Garage site in the centre of the village open for business early in the new year, is set to get underway now that planning approval has been granted.

The latest proposals, to build two 2-bed flats above the shop premises and remove the petrol filling station element from the previous plans was approved by Harborough planning committee at their meeting on September 10<sup>th</sup>.

Husbands Bosworth is recognised as a Rural Centre within Harborough District Council's planning strategy and, as such, merits special attention where provision of services is concerned. Harborough planning officers felt that the sustainability, vitality and viability of the community would be enhanced by the improved shopping facilities that the applicant proposed. They also felt that the provision of these services would reduce the need for villagers to travel outside the village, promoting a wider sustainability picture.

The removal of the petrol filling station will enable the pump pedestals and canopy to be removed, which will improve the visual appearance of the frontage of the development and allow more vehicle and pedestrian manoeuvring space.

### BYGONE BOSWORTH

*Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection*

Villager Neil Hankin reminds us that 2013 is the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of the opening of the canal through our parish. So, we rummaged in the Historical Society's Archive to find an appropriate picture to commemorate this milestone.

The canal route between Leicester and London was originally planned to make a high-level crossing on a great embankment across Lubenham Hill to Farndon. From here it would have followed the line later taken by the Bampton valley railway to Northampton. However, the faltering financial situation saw the construction of the canal stall at Debdale Wharf.

Eventually a compromise was cobbled together, which left Market Harborough with the truncated canal of the original line and a direct link made from the constructed section near Foxton village to the mainline at Norton, near Daventry. This entailed a rise of 75ft at Foxton, which was achieved by a double staircase of 10 locks and a corresponding fall at Watford Park. The two flights are separated by 20 miles of level waterway and substantial tunnels at Husbands Bosworth and Crick.



The tunnel at Husbands Bosworth is 1166 yards long and was completed in 1813. Over 2,000,000 bricks, made in a brickworks set up specially for the purpose, adjacent to Honeypot Farm Bridge, were used in its construction.

*This picture, taken in the 1920s, shows the North Kilworth portal of the tunnel. The more optimistic and sharp-sighted readers will be able to see the light at the end of the tunnel!*
