GREEN LIGHT FOR BETTER BROADBAND!

Those who suffer from poor Broadband connectivity within Husbands Bosworth will be delighted to know that, after a long period of inaction, definite progress is being made towards improving the service.

The Broadband Leicestershire Project, using funding from County and District Councils, has now identified the first areas to receive help in bringing faster broadband to (mostly) rural areas in the county. Surprisingly, after much prevarication, Husbands Bosworth is now right up there in the first group of exchanges that will be upgraded between summer 2014 and summer 2015.

Firm dates for the upgrade works will not be available until next spring as each area is still subject to survey. Communities will be notified three months in advance of fibre-broadband being available in their area and are then likely to see new Superfast Broadband cabinets appear close to existing BT cabinets.

But what does this mean for you? Maybe nothing, if you are a light Broadband user, living very near to the exchange/cabinet and happy with your current speed. On the other hand, if you are a moderate to heavy user or live away from the centre of the village and suffer constant frustration with your download/upload speeds, then this will be good news indeed. You could see your speeds increase to the upper limit of your contract instead of floating around the lower levels. You may be able to take the opportunity to upgrade or change your contract to a Superfast one (at additional cost), something which few of us in rural areas have had the opportunity to do.

You will probably be aware that, the further away you are from the exchange/green BT cabinet the lower your speed becomes, as the signal degrades with distance (and the cables do not necessarily run in straight lines!) To find out your service speed, just input "ADSL checker" into your search engine, then click on the BT Wholesale website. After inputting your telephone number and clicking "submit" you will be able to see which exchange your line comes from, together with a cabinet number if appropriate and speed. If you could e-mail this information to our broadband representative at: patriciahobson45@yahoo.com this will help plot the routing from the exchange. Please include your phone number, name and address on the e-mail.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

This picture, recently passed on by former villager, Michael Salter, is a detail taken from a wider photograph of The Square in Market Harborough and dates from 1908. It features the 'Bosworth Flyer', which was, for many years, the village's only regular connection with the outside world.



The Cross family ran *The Wheatsheaf* public house on Bell Lane for many years and were also the village carriers. As early as 1861 John Cross is noted in the Census as 'carrier & beer house keeper' and the *Post Office Directory* of 1876 tells us that he carried to Leicester on Wednesdays and Saturdays, Lutterworth on Thursdays and Market Harborough on Tuesdays. Anyone wishing to go into town could be carried as a passenger and goods, parcels, etc., which had been ordered, could be collected from, or delivered to, a central point. In Market Harborough this was *The Cock Inn*, on The Square, where our picture was taken.

The horse is probably in stabling behind the inn, having a bit of a breather ready for the loaded haul back to Bosworth. The long journey back from Leicester was more arduous and a fresh horse had to be sent out from Bosworth to meet the 'Flyer' at the bottom of John Ball Hill, near Shearsby. In 1901 the return fare to Lutterworth and Market Harborough was 6d $(2\frac{1}{2}p)$ and a shilling (5p) to Leicester.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, October 1st 2013.

Five Council members present. Apologies were received from Mr. Fletcher and the Clerk. Mr. Forman took the chair and Mrs. Fisher took the Minutes.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

Members queried if a reply had been received regarding the grant for renovation of the War Memorial.

Concerns were raised about the standard of the grass cutting this season. Clerk had asked for a meeting with the contractors but nothing had been arranged.

Council sought further clarification regarding the finishing of grave plots after burials. Mr. Fletcher would be asked to give a report of his meetings relating to the Pebble Hall developments.

Cemetery

Council noted that only one quote for the proposed renovation of the Chapel of Rest had been received.

Members reiterated their concerns that work to the margins around the cemetery had not been carried out.

Playing Field & Play Area

A meeting of the Playing Field Committee had been held. Mr. Fletcher would be asked to give a report at the next Parish Council meeting. At the meeting concerns were raised that two redundant rollers were preventing the mowing of the field boundaries and were harbouring vermin. Mr. Brotherton agreed to move these to a more convenient position.

Allotments

It was noted that two new tenants had taken over the plots previously abandoned.

Members agreed to set a date for a meeting with allotment-holders to discuss general matters relating to the site.

The need for positive marking of the boundaries of the plots was again discussed. Council noted that a concrete pot had been dumped on site.

Traffic Issues

SID had been removed from Welford Road whilst Seven Locks Housing work was carried out. **Rural Housing Scheme**

Council heard that an official opening of the Knights Close development was being planned. Members had not been officially informed of a date.

Correspondence

Council discussed a request from HDC for an update of 'important green areas' within the village. Members felt that some clarification of this matter was necessary as this had been carried out last year and HDC had, at that time, issued plans confirming their agreement to sites designated by Council. No changes would be needed.

Any Other Business

Concerns were raised regarding vegetation obscuring roadsigns. The condition of the road surface on Welford Road between Sibbertoft turn and Wheler Lodge was discussed. Members felt that this on-going problem now constituted a safety hazard to road-users and would ask the Clerk to contact Highways regarding these matters.

Council agreed that the Parish Council have a bonfire (and beacon lighting) on the Playing Field for Bonfire Night. Date would be the weekend of November 2nd/3rd or 8th/9th, to be agreed. Clerk had suggested that we provide soup rather than a barbeque. No fireworks, but 'Sparklers' or light-sticks would be allowed.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, November 5th at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
