

CATTHORPE CONCERNS

There was conflicting information coming from the recent Caththorpe Junction works presentation at Swinford, relating to the possibility of up to 50,000 tonnes of surplus material being removed from the site. Concerns were raised that any surplus would find its way to local landfill sites, with Bosworth Quarry being a likely destination, as one of the nearest. Villagers are worried that any landfill traffic generated will add to existing problems on the local road system.

However, Skanska, the main contractors, say that a new assessment of quantities and landscaping would see surplus material accommodated on-site.

Work at the junction is already well under way, with off-carriageway works progressing. Lane closures, motorway contra-flows and short-term overnight stoppages are planned to come into force from March 2014 on the M6 and June for the M1. Motorway traffic will be signed off the affected sections, with the M1 designated diversion route being the M6/A426. Complete closures of the A14 through-route are planned to be short-duration and overnight, mainly when work across the carriageway, such as bridge structure, is being carried

out. The local road link to the motorway system will be permanently severed, the infamous double roundabout system removed and direct access from Swinford through to Caththorpe village will be cut, to be reinstated in September 2015.

Meanwhile, Welford residents are concerned about traffic management whilst the interchange work is taking place. Despite contractor's assurances that they will direct construction traffic away from the local road system, the fear is that 'other traffic' will choose to avoid hold ups at the



roadworks. Traffic avoiding the work area by using the minor roads can only be 'advised' by signed diversions, which are likely to be ignored.

With this in mind, the Welford Action Group, supported by their parish council, have requested that a temporary weight restriction be placed on the A5199 during construction. This proposal is currently opposed by council officers and police of both counties.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

This month's picture from the Archive is a view that we don't have today, and shows some interesting features. The bare ground on the left was where Maurice Elliot's farm buildings once stood. Bosworth developed as a grazier's community and nine farmyards were established within the core of the village, their land outlying beyond the built-up areas. Dairy cows would be brought up through the village for milking but most growing livestock would stay out at grazing during the summer, only coming into the barns to over-winter. Elliot's buildings were demolished to make way for the Mowsley Court housing development in 1976.

The big house in the centre was where the Marsh family lived. They farmed land off the Mowsley bridle track and at Honeypot Farm. The Marsh sisters, spinsters Gertie, Maggie and Tiny, seldom threw anything away and their hoarded 'goodies' eventually formed the basis of the Historical Society's Archive Collection - God bless 'em!



The oak tree in the foreground, which still stands there proudly today, was planted by Mrs. Turville-Petre to commemorate King George V's Coronation in 1911. The green itself was earmarked for the site of the village National School in 1851, with plans prepared and the land transfer agreed before the present site was finally chosen.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, December 3rd 2013.

Five Council members and one member of the public were present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Visitors' Questions

A resident of Green Lane outlined his concerns regarding ivy growing on the roadside wall and damaging his property. He had trimmed some of the ivy to allow better access but he was concerned that it should be the responsibility of Highways. Clerk informed the meeting that the matter had already been referred to Highways and it had been noted that the rootstock originated outside the resident's property. Clerk agreed to follow the matter up.

Matters Arising

Clerk noted that the undertaker had still not replied to her query relating to the period of responsibility for grave maintenance in the cemetery.

No further quotations for the refurbishment work to the Chapel of Rest had been received.

Clerk to contact builders that had been approached originally to ascertain their interest.

No response had been received from Highways with regard to the poor road surface on the A5199 between Sibbertoft turn and Welford Wharf. Clerk was asked to press for a response.

Cemetery

Clerk informed Council that she had now got a firm date for a meeting with the grass-cutting contractors to look into trimming back the overgrown margins.

Playing Field & Play Area

Council noted that an area of subsidence under part of the matting behind the swings had been repaired and that temporary levelling had been carried out in the Play Area car park to fill in the potholes.

Allotments

Clerk discussed a letter received from an allotment holder regarding a misunderstanding relating to the letting of plots. Chairman agreed to send a letter explaining Council's position.

Traffic Issues

Council heard that the Speed Indicator was to be returned to Welford Road now that nearby housing works had been completed.

Rural Housing Scheme

A new date for the official opening of the Knights Close development had been arranged.

Correspondence

A letter had been received from a Theddingworth resident asking for support in their opposition to a proposed wind turbine at Theddingworth Lodge Farm. Council heard that Mr. Forman, as Parish Heritage Warden, had made objections to the proposal. Council would comment after seeing Mr. Forman's comments.

Accounts

In view of the likelihood that the parish will be expected to provide some services presently provided by the District and County Councils, Council members agreed to increase the Precept figure to £27,800.

Any Other Business

Concerns were raised concerning water coming from the sewage plant on Broad Lane and running down to the canal. Although this had now stopped, the flow of water had eroded the already poor road surface. Clerk was asked to contact Highways regarding the matter.

Mr. Forman had attended a Canal & River Trust meeting at which community involvement was discussed. Under their new charitable status CRT were seeking input from local communities, especially in towpath maintenance. Funding was currently being sought for work at Husbands Bosworth and CRT promised to keep Council informed of progress. CRT don't want to start work before funding is secured.

A recent inspection of Butt Lane bridleway had found that the crossing had been cleared by the contractors and that the track, although muddy due to the farm traffic and the weather conditions, was reasonably passable.

Concerns were raised that the street lighting outside Fernie Court had not been repaired. Clerk informed Council that it had now been referred to Central Networks as a supply fault.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, February 4th at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
