WASTE-GATE

A lthough the planning application currently being considered for the Renewable Energy Generation Facility (REGF) at Pebble Hall, lies within the domain of Daventry District Council, Leicestershire Highways department have called for an in-depth Transport Assessment, as access to the site is off the A4304 within Leicestershire.

If approved the REGF would use waste wood to produce up to 9MW electricity per hour, which would be exported to the National Grid. The applicant, Carbonaris, is seeking permission to modify the existing planning permission which was passed in 2008.

Local residents have voiced their concerns that this application and another one, by Welland Waste Management Ltd to produce energy from processing food waste by thermophilic aerobic digestion (TAD), which will run in parallel, should be considered together.

Although the two applications are being brought forward by two different developers the Transport Assessment takes into account the effects of traffic movements over both applications.

In the Scoping Report the projected movements for the REGF plant are put at 64 per day, whilst the food waste unit would be expected to generate a further 32 movements. The limit set by a previous planning permission is 240 movements per day.

The applicants argue that the removal of the presently-consented B8 (Storage and Distribution) use at the site could actually see a notional reduction in traffic, but concede that in a worst-case scenario an additional 30 vehicle trips per day may be generated, increasing movements to 219 vehicles; still within the permitted limit.

Current monitoring of the access to the site shows an average of 189 vehicle movements per weekday, much of which are vehicles transporting processed material off the site. The new developments would see almost all material being used on site and little exportable waste produced.

Objectors to the proposals are concerned that the operations at the site are out of character in what is essentially a rural environment and that the facility would, in effect, become an industrial complex. There are also worries that the nature of the waste, which would be processed would be likely to result in storage and environmental problems, noise, smell and toxic emissions.

ENTRY LEVEL

s you travel about locally you may have noticed the posh new Harborough District boundary signs that have sprung up on some grass verges recently. They are primarily designed to raise the profile of the district and welcome visitors to Harborough. The signs also promote a sense of 'belonging' to those of us that have the good fortune to live here and highlight the geographical extents of our district. Harborough is the largest authority in Leicestershire by size but has the smallest population.



Harborough District Council's jurisdiction stretches from High Cross in the west to the borders of Rutland in the east and from Catthorpe junction in the south to Thurnby village somewhere 'up north'!

Plans are in hand to extend our cheery welcome to visitors by linking the new boundary signs with additional tourism signage that is to be installed around the district.

SCHOOL REPORT HUSBANDS BOSWORTH C. of E. PRIMARY SCHOOL Head Teacher Louisa Morris

Learning about the world around us is an essential life-tool in a world that seems to be shrinking daily. A number of our parents tell us that they work with people all over the world; some without even needing to leave the village! There are many compelling reasons why we teach children about life in other cultures: to open their eyes to new experiences; to encourage an understanding and empathy for others; to encourage enquiry and cultivate creativity; to look for new ways of learning and to gain skills needed to work in a global economy.

The International Schools Project is so important because it helps teachers and children to make links with schools all over the world. In order to receive the full International Schools Award, each term we have to take part in an international project to develop our global awareness. For this term's activity the children were placed in mixed aged groups to learn about Places in Europe; Food from Mexico; Life in Africa and Chinese New Year. Activities included map and atlas work, making enchiladas, Chinese painting and discussion and debate. The children thoroughly enjoyed their week of activities and are looking forward to continuing our project next term.

BYGONE BOSWORTH Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Aneurin Owen has been in touch with a correction and some additional information, for the *Bygone Bosworth* piece in last month's *Bugle*, which featured The Old Green.

Aneurin tells us that the Coronation Oak was in fact planted for the coronation of Edward VII in 1902, not for George V as we stated.

He also notes that the proposal to build a school on the green was to be an extension to the school that existed at the time in Church Lane. This school was built in 1827, the architect being Thomas Cook of Welford Road, Leicester and was run under National School rules.

The extension was deemed necessary following a School Inspector's Report, which found that the school was overcrowded, having almost 90 pupils. As the plot was Common Land, an Act of Parliament was needed to allow any building to take place. Leading local 'dignitaries' George Fortesque Turville, Admiral Mason, Augustus Hubbard Lafargue, Rev. Costobadie and Rev. Wood



were enlisted to progress the application, which was drawn up by architects, Pearson & Jenkins. The proposals were be be presented by Turville & Mason in 1852, but it was decided to build a completely new school on the Welford Road before the plans went before Parliament.

This month, to make amends, we publish a picture of Church Lane. The two principal buildings on the right of the junction with Mowsley Road, (number 15, and Aneurin's home, number 17) were the headmaster's and teacher's houses. The school itself stood behind the gable-ended building on the middle right. The throng of children were presumably from the school. (The gabled building was originally the village post office.)

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, February 4th 2014.

Five Council members and 12 members of the public were present.

Allotment Holders' Open Forum

Council had called an Open Forum to discuss proposals for the future management of the Allotments Site. Mr. Forman has agreed to take the Council lead on allotment matters and addressed the meeting.

A number of issues relating to the management of the allotments site in general, and uncultivated plots in particular, were discussed. Council felt it was unfair to those that tended their plots diligently who were being let down by those who abused the facility and discussed a number of measures that they are considering to improve the situation.

The Forum closed after some further discussion and suggestions from the floor and the formal meeting commenced.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

Council noted that a meeting with the grass-cutting contractors had taken place and had resolved misunderstandings, at the time of a change of work-force, relating to work around the margins at the cemetery.

A second quote for the refurbishment work to the Chapel of Rest had been received, with a third promised. Clerk now in a position to seek grant opportunities.

It was noted that LCC had acknowledged the poor road surface condition on the A5199 Welford Road between the Sibbertoft turn and Welford Wharf by putting up roadside notices.

Whilst a lot of work appeared to have taken place in relation to the failed street-lighting in lower Berridges Lane, Council noted that the lights were still not working.

Cemetery

No reasonable response had been forthcoming regarding the undertakers' period of responsibility for new graves. Chairman agreed to arrange to meet the undertakers on site to discuss the matter.

Playing Field & Play Area

Council noted an area of subsidence under part of the matting behind the swings had been rectified and that temporary levelling had been carried out in the Play Area car park to fill in the potholes.

Matters discussed at the Open Forum

Traffic Issues

Council members felt that there had been a recent increase in traffic, presumably related to the commencement of work at Catthorpe.

Correspondence & Planning

A letter had been received from a circus operator who wanted to set up his show on the Playing Field in March. Council felt that, due to the wet winter, the site was unlikely to be suitable.

Council noted that clearance work at the Kilworth Marina site had begun.

A resident of Ashacre Close had contacted Council regarding a street-lamp that wasn't working in the Close. Council noted that although the Close was unadopted by the local authority a bond had been lodged to cover any maintenance work. Clerk confirmed that the matter had been referred to Highways.

Accounts

Accounts for the period 03.12.12 to 04.02.14 were presented and approved.

Any Other Business

Concerns were raised concerning the condition of a number of trees under the control of Council. It was agreed to authorise a professional survey. Mr. Forman and Mrs. Hobson agreed to attend a Planning Enforcement meeting organised by HDC on February 24th. Mr. Forman also intended to attend a Canal & Rivers Trust meeting in Leicester in March.

It was noted that the storm-water gullies had been cleared on Welford Road.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, March 4^{4h} at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.

WOODPECKER TREE SURGERY
