LOCAL POWER

ome time ago our neighbours in North Kilworth formed a Community Interest Company (C.I.C) partly to promote 'green' issues locally. Since then they have raised significant funds, most notably via the Lottery to equip the school, village hall and Sports Club with solar panels, to establish a major tree planting programme to capture more carbon dioxide and, via grants and long leases, a 6-house community housing development on the former Gandy's Roses site.

Recently they have been awarded £20,000 from the Government sponsored Small Communities Renewable Energy Scheme. The scheme is designed to promote the introduction of local, small scale energy generation projects. North Kilworth's grant will pay for specialist consultancy, which will identify sources of feedstock to power small local renewable energy plants and find uses and exit routes for any residues.

To minimise costs and infrastructure such operations would need to be located close to significant electricity users, allowing them to be more independent of the grid supply, cutting their costs and helping to support the local economy. One major site that has been identified is that of NBJ (London) which is the local joinery business adjacent to the Gliding Club off the Sibbertoft Road, and this will form part of the Report.

The scheme is at an early stage. Once the survey is completed it is proposed to hold Public Meetings in Husbands Bosworth and North Kilworth to evaluate the conclusions.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection



This month's picture comes from the private collection of Robert Constable-Maxwell. Robert's father, Major David Maxwell was a keen aviator, who flew his own aircraft from a landing strip he built in front of Bosworth Hall. During the 1950s and 1960s he hosted a number of 'flyins' at Bosworth Hall for his flying friends and business associates, attracting many titled and influential aviators of the day. Up to 40 aircraft would turn up from all over

the UK, Ireland and the Continent and spend the weekend flying and comparing notes! In the evening the Constable-Maxwells would lay on a sumptuous candlelit banquet in the Dining Room, followed by a filmshow and tour of the Hall. In April 1955 The Tatler & Bystander magazine whisked a reporter to the event, which was billed as 'the first international air rally in the Midlands since the war'. Our picture shows Richard Fairey of Fairey Aviation, who caused a stir when he flew into the event, landing on the lawn in front of the Hall in one of his company's new passenger helicopters!

David followed two of his elder brothers, Gerald and Michael, in their passion for aviation. Gerald had served in The Great War as a fighter pilot with the Royal Flying Corps and was credited with 27 'kills' over France. Gerald's younger brother Michael flew in World War II as a Battle of Britain Hurricane pilot and later commanded a Beaufighter night-fighter squadron in Kent and a Mosquito squadron in Bengal.

Anyone with an interest in wartime flying, with more than a hint of Biggles and the 'Boys' Own Paper'should seek out a copy of 'The Vivid Air', the biography of Gerald and Michael Constable-Maxwell, by Alex Revell.]

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Annual Open Meeting held on Tuesday, April 1st 2014.

One member of the public, District Councillor Lesley Bowles, PCSO Pete Willson and Full Council were present.

The Chairman opened the Annual Open Meeting

PCSO Willson reported little local criminal activity over recent months. He had visited the school and had been asked to bring to the attention of Council the overhanging condition of the hedge along School Lane. Council noted that work to this hedge might prove more problematic now that the ownership extended over four properties but Clerk was asked to contact those concerned. A general discussion about local policing, especially the closure of the Lutterworth front desk, ensued. PCSO Willson also noted speed issues between North Kilworth and Bosworth and agreed to bring this to the attention of his sergeant and the Road Safety Team. Nuisance parking around the village was discussed and PCSO Willson explained how the law viewed these matters. The continuing problem of insecure loads leaving the Pebble Hall waste plant was brought to his attention.

This was the first meeting that District Councillor Bowles had been able to attend. She gave her contact details and urged anyone with any matter relating to District Council business to get in touch. Council discussed problems getting responses from HDC departments when queries were raised and Councillor Bowles agreed to follow up some unresolved matters brought to her attention.

A member of the public thanked Council for their efforts in restoring the street lamps outside Fernie Court, which had been out for more than a year. Also discussed was the pothole problem in Broad Lane. Clerk explained that an inspection had been scheduled to be carried out but she had had no feed-back. A general informal discussion took place before the Chairman closed the Open Meeting.

Parish Council Meeting

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

Mrs. Hobson and Mr. Fletcher briefly outlined a meeting that they had attended called 'A day in the life of a Planning Officer', which gave them a better insight into the behind-the-scenes work of the planning department.

A representative of the Heartbeat Trust, which promotes the installation of community defibrillators, had been unable to attend the Open Meeting but would be invited to the next meeting in May.

Cemetery

After discussion Council agreed to hold cemetery charges at their present level and review them again in March 2015.

Playing Field & Play Area

Members noted that the clearance of the western margins of the playing field had been carried out by The Conservation Volunteers group before the nesting season began, and should be easier for the mowing contractor to maintain.

Allotments

Re-marking of plot boundaries had been carried out where possible. The project had proved more difficult than expected because in many cases the original lines of paths and boundaries had been lost and some plot-holders had been historically working to the wrong lines. Some re-alignment was made where plots were currently vacant and new tenants would be made aware of the full extents of their plots. A plot for possible sub-division was identified. Two plots had been relinquished and would be offered for re-letting.

Traffic Issues

Following problems with the Speed Indicator, Council agreed to arrange for the device to be returned to the supplier for repair and service.

Rural Broadband

Mrs. Hobson updated Council on the Superfast Broadband rural roll-out. She felt that there was some progress and was pleased that Husbands Bosworth appeared to be on the schedule for improvement work, subject to surveys, during summer 2014.

Any Other Business

Mrs. Hobson noted excessive dog-fouling in lower Bell Lane and it was agreed that, since the area is obviously a popular route for dog-walkers an additional dog-poop bin should be installed to encourage the owners to pick up the mess.

Mr. Brain was concerned about the slippery moss that covers the footpath by the bus-shelter outside Waterworks Way. Clerk was asked to bring this to the attention of Highways.

Although the ivy overhanging in Green Lane had been cut back the root-stocks had been left. Clerk was asked to point out that since the root-stocks were on the highway side of the wall their removal should be the responsibility of Highways.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, May 6th at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
