

KEEPING BOSWORTH TIDY

There has been a lot of interest recently in the lack of service that we get from the local authority. In particular residents have been concerned about the overgrown roadside verges and weed-strewn pavements, especially within the village and the message that this untidiness sends out to visitors and passers-by.

We quite rightly expect that we should get the same service as residents of Market Harborough or Lutterworth, since we pay the same Council Tax but it seems that the services go to those who have a greater voice. Unfortunately, as we all know, the local authorities are working within restricted budgets on the one hand and are seeing costs of providing the services rising on the other. The consequence of the widening gap between income and expenditure is, of course, the trimming of services that we are seeing. The immediately visible signs are our roadsides but policing, emergency service provision and social care are all being cut back.

Perhaps the answer to this is the government's much-lauded 'localism', where local communities are actively encouraged to take on direct responsibility for providing some of the services where our local authorities are falling short.

At the end of the day it is us that benefit. With this in mind the Parish Council has undertaken extra mowing of the village greens, covering the periods between Highways Authority cuts and has recently purchased a mower in order to be in better control of the situation. Other areas where the community could take control might be litter-picking, sign cleaning, footpath maintenance and weed clearing. If we are to take pride in our own environment and Keep Bosworth Tidy, we may have to resign ourselves to providing these services. Of course there is likely to be a cost, and at local level, this can only be covered by the Parish Council's element of the Council Tax, the parish precept.

BROADBAND UPDATE

There is still no indication of a date for the arrival of Superfast Broadband in Bosworth. Cllr. Patricia Hobson, the Parish Council's lead on Broadband issues, attended a recent meeting of the Broadband Stakeholders Group at County Hall. Information was provided about areas in the county where publicly-funded work to provide faster Broadband had already commenced, mainly in the areas of Charnwood, Harborough and Melton. Husbands Bosworth is in a group of exchanges which is scheduled to benefit from better Broadband by summer 2015, but what no-one knows yet is exactly when. Of course, that is precisely the piece of information for which residents are waiting.

The standard way of introducing Superfast Broadband is for BT to add a new cabinet next to the existing green street cabinet, which normally acts as an intermediary between the telephone exchange and the customer. This is not straightforward in Bosworth, since most Bosworth residents are routed straight from the exchange to their property, with no intervening cabinet. As it is tricky to add on a new cabinet to a non-existent one, then the first action will be to route all the "Exchange Only" lines through a new cabinet, and subsequently a new fibre cabinet can be added.

Next Steps:

1. A survey is required to determine the feasibility and location of new cabinets and the Parish Council will be notified shortly before this takes place.
2. A planning application for new cabinets will probably provide residents with their first indication that Openreach is about to start the relevant work.
3. A newsletter from the Broadband Project will be circulated to keep residents up to date with the process.

The project to bring fibre broadband to rural communities is scheduled for completion in 2018, by which time most residents, even in the slowest broadband areas of the county, should have seen some kind of improvement in broadband quality.

Further information is available on the LCC Project website, www.superfastleicestershire.org.uk. This is for businesses as well as individuals and a Project Officer is now in post in the new Business Support Unit at County Hall, which offers one-to-one assistance to businesses on broadband issues.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection



Fowler Class 4F- C 44244 rolled out of the Derby works on April 30th 1926. By the time this picture was taken, as she passes under the Leicester Road bridge on the way to Market Harborough in April 1963, she is looking decidedly care-worn and weary. The engine was withdrawn from service on the last day of December 1964, and after a short period in store at Wellingborough yard, was unceremoniously dispatched to Cohen's scrapyards at Kettering to be cut up - one of 173 engines that Cohen's disposed of.

The Rugby to Stamford line itself was cowering under the Sword of Damocles at this time - goods traffic ceased on April 6th 1964 and the line finally closed on June 6th 1966, a victim of Dr. Beeching's economic scalpel.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, June 10th 2014.

Three members of the public, Dist. Councillor Lesley Bowles and 5 Council members were present.

Visitors' Questions

Concerns were raised about poor service from the local authorities and lack of response where these issues have been raised. Of particular concern is the state of footpaths and roadside verges. Dist. Councillor Bowles agreed to bring the matter directly to the attention of the council officers.

Representatives of the Tennis Club addressed the meeting and asked if the grass behind the courts could be cut back. Council explained that this is within the contract for the grass cutting of the playing field but problems with the new sub-contractors meant that none of the work had been done satisfactorily.

The condition of the goal posts on the practice pitch was discussed and Council agreed to make a site meeting to assess the situation.

A request was made for the kerb at the entrance to Highcroft to be 'dropped' to facilitate wheelchair users. Clerk explained that a request had been made in the past and it was assumed that the work would be carried out as soon as possible. Dist. Councillor Bowles agreed to find out what progress had been made.

The visitors left the meeting and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

Nothing had been heard regarding Highways inspection of the state of Broad Lane, which should have been carried out. Clerk was asked to chase this up again.

The Village Hall Committee had agreed to allow Council to use the storage area above the stage.

A dog-poop bin had been delivered for the lower end of Bell Lane. Mr. Forman was preparing a post and fixings ready for installing it.

Cemetery

Mr. Fletcher had arranged a second meeting with the contractors to try to resolve the grass cutting problems.

Playing Field & Play Area

Council noted that the Cricket Club rolls were still preventing access to the grass margins. Clerk was asked to write to the Club to ask that they be removed as soon as possible.

Allotments

The problem of untended plots was discussed. It was agreed to have a site visit to assess the situation and make a general inspection of the site. It was noted that there had been problems with the skip-hire company, which meant that the skip didn't come to the site at the end of May. A skip would be provided later in the year.

A letter supporting an allotment plot application was discussed. Council agreed to assess the content of the letter after a site visit.

Any Other Business

The state of the road signs was discussed. There appears to be no programme of cleaning the road signs. Dist. Councillor Bowles agreed to look into the matter.

Nobody seems to know who erected the 'No Entry to A14' signs. Clerk had notified Highways who were to come out to look at them.

Council agreed to sponsor a visit of the Chill-out Bus, which provides sporting and recreational activities for young people.

A donation to the Causeway Charity was agreed, to fund the hire of a mini-bus for their annual outing.

Council agreed to purchase a self-propelled mower so that interim cuts of the village public grassed areas could be made.

There will be no Parish Council meeting in July. The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, August 5th at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
