ollowing on from our article last month about the community taking more control of its own destiny with regard to service provision, we now hear that the county council are prepared to recompense parish councils that are willing to tackle their own grass cutting.

Faced with a further shortfall in their budget the county has once more cast its corporate eye over services and, with their grass cutting contract coming up for renewal they are now graciously offering parishes the option to take over the service and 'reward' those that do with a notional refund.

Whilst the compensation is unlikely to cover the full cost of all the work that the parishes will be obliged to undertake, it will be a useful bonus. This is especially welcome where, due to the poor service that we have been getting of late, our Parish Council was poised to take over the work anyway.

With this in mind the Parish Council authorised the purchase of a parish mower and over recent weeks villagers will have noticed the improvement in grass cutting around the village's public areas. Much of this work has been carried out voluntarily by Parish Council Chairman, Bill Fletcher, who should be applauded for his contribution.

As Bill has gone around merrily mowing, other villagers have expressed an interest in maintaining areas close to their homes and the germ of an adoption scheme is forming. If you would like to adopt an area that is of concern to you - it needn't be grass cutting; it could be weed pulling or strimming and could even extend to litter picking, give Bill or Jackie a call on 880910.

The work is to replace the ageing cast-iron supply pipes with more durable plastic piping. Full road closures are unlikely, but variably placed mobile traffic controls are likely along the approach from Leicester during working hours, whilst the work is being carried out.



BYGONE BOSWORTH

The Historical Society's Archive Collection

FLOWER SHOWS AND FEUDS

Quite when the annual horticultural show started in Bosworth is open to debate. However, in the Historical Society's Archive there are Minute and Accounts Books for 'Husbands Bosworth Flower Show' for the years 1873 to 1877, which at that time appears to have run in conjunction with a sports day. The minutes show that among the fruits and blooms there were occasionally some sharp knives!

Anyone who has ever had anything to do with village committees will recognise the opening entries in the Minute Book for 1873. At the April committee meeting only four members were present. Three more potential members were identified but at the May meeting those who attended heard that none of the ones that had been asked to serve was willing to do so. Mr. Whiteman proposed that the show should be discontinued, but Mr. Shackleford proposed that it should carry on, but as a "cottagers' show". Mr. Harrison disagreed and said that the show should continue as usual and that if it was just a cottagers' show he would withdraw. Eventually the Shackleford proposal was carried and it was resolved to have a cottagers' show and also run an 'Athletic Sports' (with prizes) at the same time and place. Mr. Whiteman, presumably in high dudgeon, resigned. Mr. Harrison retracted his decision to withdraw and decided to stand for election after all, but had clearly ruffled some feathers because nobody would second his nomination. At this juncture Francis Fortescue-Turville from Bosworth Hall and John Trueman Mills from Highfields House came to the rescue, perhaps to curry local favour and help to protect the Conservative vote.

At this time the show was held in marquees in the grounds of Bosworth Hall and it's not hard to imagine the scene on Flower Show Day, with everyone dressed up for the occasion, excited children awaiting their races, Union Jacks flying, the scents and colours of flowers, fruit and vegetables spilling over the trestles.

But there was trouble brewing... In the Class Open To All Ladies "the arrangement of the bouquet must be the work of the competitors themselves". There were also queries regarding the eligibility for entry of Benjamin Bale: "He being part of his time employed under a gardener." Two committee members were duly dispatched to visit his garden to check him out and declared him eligible, which must have pleased Bale, who went on to win 10/6d. At the committee meeting following the 1875 show it was agreed to enquire if Theddingworth and North Kilworth were interested in joining for the next year's show, and the secretary was instructed "to write or call upon the Leading Men in those villages" to see what they thought. Kilworth remained aloof, but Theddingworth came on board and for 1876 the show was run under the auspices of the Husbands Bosworth and Theddingworth Floral and Horticultural Society. The wider remit did little to temper the competitiveness and a Mr. Everitt complained to the committee that "in the mile race John Gilby hit George Timson on the head and knocked him out of the race and also tried unfairly to stop Collis, the winner." There was also "the disputed case of the winner of the open handicap race", with, after some correspondence the committee resolving that: "the medal should be awarded to young Bray on condition that he gives proof of his age, satisfactory to the committee." Surprisingly the show turned out to be a financial success, with receipts of over £74, prize money of more than £12 and, after all other expenses, a profit of just over £11. To end the show it was agreed ".. that Mr. Goodman be empowered to select from his London list a *quantity of fireworks to the value of £5.*"

Here the records end, but flower shows and the occasional fireworks, have been part of the Bosworth scene ever since.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The next meeting of Husbands Bosworth Parish Council will be on Tuesday, August 5th at 7.45pm.

PLEASE NOTE that due to the on-going refurbisment work at the Village Hall the meeting will be held in the Church Hall, Honeypot Lane.

Parish Council meetings are open to all. If you have a matter of parish interest that you would like to bring before the meeting please contact the Parish Clerk, Jackie Fletcher on 880910. Visitors are normally invited to address the meeting before the formal business of the meeting is conducted.

OUARRY NEWS

At the recent Quarry Liaison meeting members heard that the site now employs 5 full time staff at the quarry and 9 full time staff at the bagging plant. Sales of product this year have improved on last year with the year-end figure likely to be around 140,000 tonnes, 40,000 tonnes up on 2013. This is mainly due to an increase in demand from new house building in south Leicestershire and Northamptonshire.

Since the last liaison meeting the quarry access road and car park have been resurfaced to help reduce off-site contamination. CCTV has been installed to deter theft and vandalism, and has proved very effective to date. The Tannoy system is tested on Saturdays rather than on mid week evenings, to avoid unnecessary neighbour disturbance and winter lighting has been redirected to avoid directional glare.

Extraction is now east of Butt Lane and is likely to continue here until the end of 2014 to enable the clean water lagoon to be constructed. Once that is achieved, extraction is then planned to move back to west of Welford Road to complete the removal of remaining sand and gravel from that area, which is likely to take around 15-18 months, with mineral conveyed through the Welford Road tunnel back to the processing plant. The conveyor system needs considerable repair and haul-truck transportation from the tunnel is being considered when work resumes on this phase.

The landfill site re-opened in March and has been busy with inert waste from house building projects in Market Harborough and Great Glen.

The planning permission end dates for the site remain as permitted, to December 2017 for extraction and restoration on the Welford Road area and to July 2020 for restoration of the processing plant site. Planning permission for the landfill area expires in December 2015 but due to reduced landfill quantities during the recession the company is likely to be applying for an extension to enable completion.

Some restoration work is planned for this summer adjacent to the Welford Road site and also on completed areas of the landfill site, returning the land to agricultural use.

The company are looking at the prospect of future workable reserves and exploratory works are to be carried out later in 2014 to determine the extent of mineral deposits eastwards in the Bosworth Hall Estate land. Mature trees around Gravel Pit Spinney would be a landscape feature which would be preserved in any potential working scheme. Worthwhile deposits to the south of the Welford Road site are not recoverable due to the proximity of the canal and extensive badger activity.

The County Council has approved the restoration scheme for the Welford Road site. The scheme provides for two water bodies but most of the land will be restored to agricultural use and will be managed by the Council's Property team when restoration is completed.
