

CATTHORPE PROGRESS

Welford Action Group recently organised a meeting of interested parties to discuss the progress of the major roadworks at the M1 Junction 19. The meeting was hosted by Skanska, the main contractors, at their site offices adjacent to the works and included a tour of the site. The meeting was attended by representatives of the local communities, Skanska, the Highways Authority, Northamptonshire County Council and was chaired by Chris Heaton-Harris, the MP for Daventry.

The meeting heard that the works, which commenced in January, were slightly ahead of schedule, mainly due to the favourable weather conditions earlier in the year. Construction work was progressing well, with little disruption to motorway or A14 traffic. Obviously the volume of traffic using the junction and the lack of suitable alternative routes, meant that closures needed to be kept to a minimum and temporary slip-roads have been laid to by-pass the main sites in order that work could be carried out without closing the carriageways.

The next major challenge will be in January 2015 when it will be necessary to close the A14 to complete the free-flow connection with the M6. Although the closures and alternative routes will be well-publicised in advance, concerns were raised that redirected traffic would be displaced onto the A5199 and A4304. To help offset this Skanska proposed a full off-peak closure from Friday evening to Sunday morning, which was likely to be less disruptive than a series of shorter closures over a longer period.

Queries were raised about the 'No Access to A14 at Welford' signs, which have been littering the verges along the A4304 for most of this year, when we all know that there is access. Apparently these are related to the works at Catthorpe and were installed to deter traffic from using A14 junction 1, although nobody seemed to appreciate the significance of them only facing easterly flowing traffic. They disappeared for a while not so much because we made a fuss but because the signing company felt that if they stayed in place for too long drivers would notice that the junction wasn't actually closed!

The scale of the operation, which is costing in the region of £190m, was evident on the tour of the works, where construction was being carried out on numerous sites within and around the junction. Co-ordinating this around a traffic flow of up to 10,000 vehicles an hour through the junction must rank this project as one of the most complex ever undertaken on our roads system and the feeling of the meeting was that by good project management, disruption away from the site had so far been minimal.

Unfortunately house burglaries have become a feature of the area crime figures for the last few months. Some burglaries are occurring during the day while the occupants are out and Police have increased patrols to deter this. Keep your doors and windows secure at all times even when at home.

You can help to secure your home from burglary by restricting access to the rear of your property, as this is by far the most common way for a burglar to enter a house during the daytime. Consider using window shock alarms on large windows and patio doors. If you have an intruder alarm don't forget to set it, as an alarm is a proven deterrent. Intruders won't normally hang about to search your house once the alarm goes off even if they have broken in.

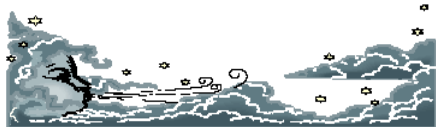

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection



At this time of remembrance, and especially as we remember the start of the bloodiest conflict the world has ever known, we have pulled out a poignant picture from the Archive Collection, which shows a tangible link between that war and Husbands Bosworth.

The picture was taken in 1919 and shows the 'thankful men' of Husbands Bosworth - those who returned home from the horrors of The Great War. A committee had been formed to organise a welcoming return for those who had fought. A public subscription Welcome Home Fund was set up to show the village's gratitude and to ease the financial burden of those returning to Lloyd George's 'land fit for heroes'. The return, however, was quite different, with food shortages, rampant unemployment and escalating costs the reality as the nation pulled itself up off its knees.

We can count 50 men in this photograph, taken under the gay bunting and flags in the school playground. Tragically, fourteen village men didn't return and are now little more than memories on the village War Memorial.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, October 7th 2014.

Four Council members and 6 members of the public were present.

Visitors' Questions

■ A member of the CS17 group opposing the solar park development at Theddingworth updated the meeting on the situation regarding the proposal. Harborough planners had asked for further information from the developers, especially the visual impact which they felt had not been addressed adequately. Additional information relating to the archaeological and landscape assessments was also requested.

■ A group of residents attended the meeting to discuss the impact of the Pebble Hall electricity generating scheme. The Chairman understood that both elements of the scheme had now been passed by Daventry Council despite the fact that the renewable energy generation scheme to produce electricity from waste wood was recommended for refusal by the planning officers.

Minutes of the previous meeting were circulated and agreed

Matters Arising from the Minutes

■ Clerk informed Council that she had been assured that the Dag Lane to Mowsley bridle track footpath was scheduled to be resurfaced. No further response had been received regarding the re-statement of the footway between the Station Road turn and Sibbertoft Road turn on Welford Road where the footway was non-existent.

■ No response had been received regarding the overgrown roadside hedge to the Knights Close development.

■ Clerk agreed to ask for an extension to the December 2014 deadline for completion of restoration works to the village War Memorial to enable the work to be carried out in the spring. Grant funding had been received towards the cost of the work.

Cemetery

■ Council agreed to work around the margins of the cemetery and on scrub clearance behind the tennis courts on the Playing Field to be carried out by the The Conservation Volunteers.

Playing Field & Play Area

■ Council heard that it was hoped that cricket would return to the Playing Field next spring possibly with junior coaching and the possibility of junior rugby coaching was also discussed. Council reiterated its support.

■ Queries raised by our insurers relating to some elements of the pavilion insurance would need to be brought before the Pavilion Committee as soon as possible. RoSPA high-lighted work that had now been carried out on the play equipment and essential repairs to the skateboard equipment had been done.

■ A new seat had been installed in the Play Area.

Accounts

■ Accounts were presented and agreed

Allotments

■ No outstanding issues were raised.

Rural Broadband

■ Mrs. Hobson updated the meeting on the current situation regarding the upgrading to high-speed fibre optic Broadband. Summer 2015 was still being quoted by BT for the upgrade to be completed in Bosworth although Council took heart in the fact that the wayleave payment for the proposed cabinets on The Green had been received.

■ It was noted that Superfast Broadband was apparently now available in Lubenham.

Any Other Business

■ Clerk was asked to bring to the attention of Highways the generally poor and overgrown condition of the footways on the approach roads to the village and ask if there was a schedule of clearing. The Chairman informed the meeting that he had arranged to store the parish mower in the pavilion garage and would be returning it and the parish strimmer to supplier for servicing.

■ It was noted that the 'No Access to A14' signs had reappeared.

■ Following queries raised by a villager regarding access and mooring facilities for canal users. Clerk was asked to contact Canal & River Trust to ask if any improvements were scheduled. The possibility of providing a notice board on the canalside to promote village facilities was also discussed.

■ Concerns had been raised by bus users about buses running late following the recent changes to the timetable, which often left travellers with little time in town or meant that they had to catch a later bus back. It was noted that the 10.27 bus was up to 45 minutes late and was invariably overcrowded, often with passengers standing. Clerk was asked to contact Leicestershire County Council transport department and alert them to the problems on the Route 58 service.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, November 4th at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.

From The Rectory

I don't think it can have escaped anyone's notice that this year marks the centenary of the start of World War I. Already here in the village there has been a tree planted during the Bosworth Festival to mark the first year of the war, and during our Remembrance Sunday service we will be thinking further about the sacrifice made by so many people in active service during that time.

If there had been television at the time of that war, no doubt we would have been horrified to see pictures beamed into our living rooms of the scenes of battle, of the conditions in the trenches and the carnage, just as we are with shots of carnage in Syria or Iraq today. With no TV coverage back then we just have written memories to speak of the horrors and the heroism that took place.

The Bible Society have published a book 'Hear My Cry' which gives psalms, poetry and stories significant to that time and many of the anecdotes told there are very poignant - like Thomas Winter, too old to fight who set up the YMCA to support soldiers in the front line; Walter Culliford who found his faith in God grew deeper through those years and came through without a scratch; Elvas Jenkins, whose bible took a bullet meant to kill him and saved his life one day, only for him to be shot and killed the next day; or there is the W.B. Yeats poem about an Irish airman reflecting on how the people he loved were far removed and unaffected by the war he was fighting in. At the front of the book there is a prayer which I offer for your use:

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we remember with thanksgiving those who made the supreme sacrifice for us in time of war. We pray that the offering of their lives may not have been in vain. By your grace enable us this day to dedicate ourselves anew to the cause of justice, freedom and peace; and give us the wisdom and strength to build a better world, for the honour and glory of your name; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
