Plans have recently been filed with Harborough planners that could bring about the biggest change in the face of Husbands Bosworth in over forty years.

Proposals to build 41 homes on farmland outside the village have recently been tabled by developers, Davidson Homes. The scheme would comprise a mix of three, four and five bedroomed homes on the 2.5 hectare plot and include the provison of a new general practice surgery, two housing association controlled bungalows and an area of public amenity open space.

A preliminary scheme and scoping report, which proposed the building of about 22 homes on the site was brought before a public meeting in the village Sports Pavilion last summer. From that meeting and subsequent discussions with planners, consultants, the Parish Council and local residents, a refined scheme that would include the provision of a much-needed replacement for the doctors' surgery in Kilworth Road has evolved.

Although nominally outside the permitted building line of the village, the site has previously been identified in Harborough District Council's Strategic Land Assessment. The assessment suggested that the land satisfied most of the criteria for development in a Rural Centre village and could be considered for development within the next six years.

The next stage of the process is for the scheme to satisfy the wider planning rules, especially when considering the prospect of development within the open countryside, on green belt land and outside the village curtilage.

To some extent it is expected that the community benefit of the provision of the new surgery and the provision of a small number of social housing units within the scheme will overcome some of the planners' concerns.

Harborough District Council has identifed six villages within the district as Rural Centres, which are judged to be able to sustain further development due to the facilities that are available locally. These facilities include: a primary school, a general store, a post office, a doctors' surgery, a scheduled bus service, a community hall, recreation area/public open space and a pub.

The six settlements are: Billesdon, Fleckney, Great Glen, Husbands Bosworth, Kibworth and Ullesthorpe.

SPEED MERCHANT

It is four years ago this month since we first rolled out the Speed Indicator Device, our helpful little traffic management

tool, in the village.

In that time SID has been activated well over 2,000,000 times as traffic has passed through his beady 'eye'. It may be debatable if the sudden flashing of actual recorded speeds of passing vehicles on the instrument's display deters speeding. However, when the device is active but not displaying we find readings are consistently about 2 mph faster.

The device does also gather valuable information about traffic movements, vehicle numbers and average speeds that we can use, especially in the *Bugle* SID Report,

Crime is generally low in Husbands Bosworth and in the past two months there has only been one crime reported, where a car was broken into and some items stolen from it. If you leave your vehicle in the street overnight police advice is always that you should leave it in a well-lit position. If you park on your driveway overnight, a motion-sensor security light to light the area where your vehicle is parked, is a good idea. Thieves don't like to be seen and just love 'working' in the dark... so light up and make it more difficult for them to commit their crimes! Remove all tools from the vehicle when you have finished work for the day. Items that cannot be removed should be stored in a fixed secure box. With the better weather we usually see a rise in 'Garden Crime' with sheds and outbuildings targeted. Fit a sturdy lock and consider an 'alarmed padlock', which will not only secure the access but will also sound an alarm when tampered with. Window shock alarms will also sound an alarm if the window is tampered with. Again, fitting external lighting, securing gates that lead to the rear of your property are all recommended security measures. 

Last year, at Bosworth Festival, the British Legion with the Parish Council, planted a memorial tree in Bosworth Park, the first of five trees to commemorate The Great War.

Amongst those invited were a number of aviation 'dignitaries' including Tony Everard, of the Leicester brewing dynasty, who was to pilot his own helicopter from his home at Ratcliffe Hall near Thrussington.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, March 3rd 2015.

Full Council was present.

Minutes of the previous meeting were circulated and agreed

Matters Arising from the Minutes

- ■Council discussed the grass cutting contract and especially the prospect of taking on the maintenance of areas previously cut by HDC. A schedule of works had been forwarded and an agreement setting out responsibilities and the payment had been accepted. Members agreed to monitor the situation as the season progressed and reassess the matter next year.
- ■The bus service continues to cause problems with late and overcrowded buses. Clerk was asked to contact the County Transport Co-ordinator and suggest amendments to the mid morning services, which would make the service more convenient for local users.
- ■The county footpath maintenance team had hoped to carry out path reinstatement work to the Dag Lane to Mowsley Road footpath but had been unable to access the site from the lower end because of unfavourable ground conditions.

Cemetery

- ■Council agreed to authorise the replacement of guttering and repointing of the Chapel of Rest. Full refurbishment couldn't be contemplated at present. Further avenues of funding would be sought in due course for the remainder of the work.
- ■It was agreed to provide funds for regular maintenance of the cemetery margins, the play area margins and around the Scout HQ.

Playing Field & Play Area

■The ski stepper adult exercise apparatus has been installed. A weekly inspection of the equipment installed in the play area would be undertaken.

Allotments

- ■It was noted that there may be a small number of plots available for the coming season. **Traffic Issues**
- Faulty street lighting on Welford Road and Kilworth Road had been tracked down to an underground cable fault. The service provider, Western Power, would need to liaise with Highways to carry out the necessary repairs.
- ■Clerk was asked to contact Highways regarding the poor road markings and dirty signs. **Rural Broadband**
- ■Mrs. Hobson reported that progress seemed to be being made as the service moves closer to Bosworth. The projected roll-out was still summer 2015. Problems with underground obstructions had meant that the location for one of the cabinets on The Green needed to be amended slightly. At a site meeting an alternative site had been agreed.
