SIGN LANGUAGE

We pricked up our ears when we heard that work to improve road signs in Market Harborough was due to start recently. Leicestershire County Council unveiled plans to remove 58 signs and install 25 re-designed ones around Market Harborough to help reduce

roadside clutter and help to alleviate driver confusion.

Here in Husbands Bosworth we would be pleased if the Highways authority could find the money to arrange for someone to scrub our signs up a bit. Our picture shows the parlous state of the Give Way sign at the Welford Road junction.

A few months ago former villager, Graham Eldridge questioned, in a letter to the



Harborough Mail, the legal enforceability of the '30' speed limit signs on the Lubenham Hill approach to Market Harborough. Lo, within days the signs were miraculously scrubbed! Can we get our signs cleaned? Apparently it isn't much of a priority; neither are the road markings that have worn out... Presumably those of us privileged to live out in the sticks should be prepared to put up with grubby and obscured signs.

And what about roadside clutter? Of the Harborough sign rationalisation programme a County Council spokesman said: "By redesigning signs to incorporate more than one message we will be able to reduce the amount of space they take up on the pavement, which will benefit pedestrians. A reduced number of signs will also reduce the amount of money required for maintenance in the longer term."

Surely, then, the clutter of signage on The Green is ripe for a cull!

The eagle-eved reader will have noticed that the

HEARTBEAT

defibrillator stickers have appeared on the old phone box on The Green, indicating that the village's defibrillator is now active. The Parish Council is hosting an introduction and awareness session on Thursday June 25th at 7.30pm in the Church Hall but in the meantime villagers can rest assured that the device is live and is now linked to the emergency services. If an emergency arises the device itself can be accessed by calling 999. The operator will issue a code and instructions that will open the cabinet. Once released from the cabinet the device itself will give concise instructions on how to prepare the casualty, how and where to apply the electrostimulation pads and how to activate the device. The device will only work if it detects that it has been applied properly and that defibrillation is the safe



and correct course of action for the casualty. In essence, it is fool proof!

Come along to the awareness evening and the Community Heartbeat team will demonstrate the intricacies...



BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Although this month's picture from the Archive Collection is not very dynamic it does serve to illustrate the original layout of the churchyard and entrance to the church. Before the hairpin bend was straightened in the early 1960s the main entrance to the church was opposite the Hall Lodge, as shown in the picture. The road realignment shaved off a vast swathe



of the churchyard and the opportunity was taken to move the gateway to Church Street. A recent article in the Leicester Mercury, 'On this Day - 50 years Ago', described the concerns raised in the village caused by the driving behaviour of the drivers of heavy goods vehicles travelling along High Street following the road improvements.

At the Parish Council AGM in May 1965 villagers expressed their concerns that vehicles travelling on High Street were indulging in 'double driving', which we assume was driving two abreast, or overtaking. Councillor J. R. Knight attributed the practice to the increase in traffic due to the 'extraordinary growth of Corby' and the need for this extra traffic to pass through the village to get to the newly opened M1 motorway.

He also felt that the recently installed HALT sign at the Berridges Lane junction with High Street and the straightening of the hairpin bend by the church encouraged the fast flow of traffic. The Parish meeting duly called for the County Council to install double white lines to discourage overtaking.

The picture was probably taken just after World War I when a Band of Hope march, promoting sobriety and temperance, passed through the village. The banner reads: 'Fear God Honour the Word

Report of the Parish Council Annual General Meeting held on Tuesday, May 12th 2015.

Four Council members were present.

Acceptance of Office were received

- ■Representative to the Sports Pavilion Committee Melvyn Forman and Bill Fletcher were elected
- ■Representatives to the Husbands Bosworth Charities Committee Sue Fisher and Patricia Hobson were elected
- ■Representative to the Village Hall Committee Sue Fisher was elected
- ■Representative to the Woodland Trust Committee Patricia Hobson was elected
- ■Representative to the Quarry Liaison Committee Melvyn Forman and Patricia Hobson were elected

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, May 12th following the AGM

Minutes of the previous meeting were circulated and agreed

Matters Arising from the Minutes

- ■Council noted that the upgrading of the footpath between Dag Lane and the Mowsley bridle track had not been carried out. Clerk was asked to raise this matter with LCC.
- ■No response had been received from Highways regarding the re-painting of the highway markings and cleaning of signage in the village.
- ■Council noted that Community Right to Bid information had been circulated to members with a view to identifying village assets that would benefit from the protection that may be afforded under the legislation.

Cemetery

- ■Brickwork, repointing and gutter work of the Chapel of Rest had been completed. Work to seal the carriage doorway to the southern aspect would be undertaken when funds allow.
- ■Quotations were being sought for repainting the railings on the front wall. Remedial pointing around the railings had been carried out. Clerk was asked to ascertain if the pathways had been sprayed.

Playing Field & Play Area

- A villager had volunteered to paint the goal posts on the practice pitch.
- ■Now that the grass cutting season had commenced it was noted that an inspection should be undertaken to ensure that the work was being carried out as per the contract, especially with regard to the field margins.

Allotments

- ■Clerk informed Council that all plots were taken and rents paid. However, a couple of plots were not being tended and Clerk was asked to write to the tenants regarding the letting conditions that plots should be maintained in a productive, weed and rubbish free condition.
- A skip for rubbish would be provided over the Whitsun Bank Holiday weekend.

Traffic Issues

■Council noted increasing traffic congestion outside the entrance to the Supermarket forecourt. Concerns were raised that the problem would be likely to get worse when the store was opened. It was agreed to monitor the situation.

Rural Broadband

■No further news had been noted for the proposed High-speed Broadband connection to Husbands Bosworth. It was noted that cabling appeared to be being carried out at North Kilworth and that South Kilworth had apparently been connected.
