

DOCTOR'S ORDERS

Plans for a 41 home development in the village, to include provision for a new doctors' surgery, has passed the first hurdle. Outline plans for the development on land to the east of Welford Road, presented by home builders, Davidsons Homes and property developer, Keir Group, were approved by Harborough Planning Committee at their meeting on July 7th.

Highways Authority objections to the creation of a second access to the site have meant that the previously advertised plans, presented at a public meeting in August 2014, have had to be modified. The new proposal is to create a common access point at the site of the existing field gateway within the 30 mph limit.

Being outside the current village boundary and building line such a development wouldn't normally be considered under current planning rules. However, the proposal to provide a new surgery complex within the project was considered a contribution of sufficient beneficial interest to the community that this element effectively over-ruled the normal objections. The developers have consulted freely with parish councillors and representatives of Husbands Bosworth Surgery from an early stage in the planning process. The Parish Council, taking into account the positive benefits to the local community, has supported the proposals that have been tabled.

Currently the Section 106 community infrastructure contribution details, between the developers and the local authority, are being thrashed out. More detailed plans on the layout of the site are expected to be submitted by the proposers in the near future.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH



A Herb by Any Other Name

Herb Robert - *Geranium Robertianum* In the undergrowth, in the gaps in the canopy of cow parsley, you'll often find a little pink flower known as Herb Robert. However, it has many names - more aliases than a master criminal...

Stinky Bob refers to its smell, which is so bad it is said the juice of the plant repels mosquitoes.

Numerous names refer to its red colour: Red Robin, Bloodwort, Dragon's Blood, Red Bird's Eye. As the plant ages, its stems and leaves turn crimson. This colour change also occurs in sunny locations where the sunlight stimulates production of anthocyanin, a red coloured compound, which absorbs ultra-violet light and protects the plant from damage. In other words, the plant manufactures its own sun block!

The flowers develop into seed pods, which resemble a beak. Geraniums with this characteristic are called Cranesbills. When the pods ripen, the 'beak' segments spring violently apart and cast seeds away from the parent plant.

The remains of the pods resemble five outstretched claws, hence the plant's epithets, Crow's Feet or Dove's Feet.

Finally, here are some of the herb's more arcane names: Knife and Fork, Little Bachelor's Buttons, Granny Thread the Needle, Hop O'My Thumb, Squinter-Pip and the morbid, Death Comes Quick. Not forgetting my favourite, Kiss Me Quick... *Mike Chanter*

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

For this month's picture I am indebted to former villager, Michael Salter who has reminded me of Dick Protheroe and Bosworth's connection with the high-powered world of motor-sport.

Dick was a renowned entrepreneur and racing car enthusiast, who drove alongside the 'greats' of the sport, Stirling Moss, Mike Hawthorn and Phil Hill in the 1950s and 1960s. Our picture shows Dick on the forecourt of his car showroom in Bosworth, where Cheney Court stands today, with the Post Office in the background.

Born Elmer Richard Protheroe in 1922, Dick flew Wellingtons and Lancasters with Bomber Command during the war, rising to the rank of Flight Lieutenant and gaining a DFC for his endeavours. He returned to the RAF after the war, flying and instructing on the jet Valiants and Victors. Part of his time was spent as a test pilot, which presumably spawned his later desire to push boundaries in a racing career.

Returning from service in Egypt in 1952, he came to live at Highfield House with his second wife Rosemary (neé Massey, of the Massey tractor family) and set up workshops, garage facilities and an Austin dealership in the village. He quickly gained a reputation for his engine tuning skills and started to enter competitions himself, successfully campaigning a string of specially light-bodied Jaguars that he race-prepared himself. As his successes mounted he transferred his allegiance to Ferrari and raced the 330P shown in our picture: Graham Hill's Ferrari works car. Formula racing was beckoning and it is likely that Dick would have followed Moss, Hill *et al* into works machines. However Dick's career was cut short when he was tragically killed while practising for the 1966 season at Oulton Park, Cheshire.

Editor's Note: The Protheroe garage business continues, of course, today in Market Harborough. There is a memorial plaque to Dick inside the parish church, on the wall above the font.
