BOSWORTH BUCLE

MUDDY WATERS

Some time ago, in response to calls from walkers, dog walkers and canal users the Parish Council contacted the waterways authority, the Canal & River Trust (CRT), with a view to working together to improve the parlous state of the towpath through our parish. Of particular concern was the stretch between Honeypot Bridge and the tunnel eastern portal, where the path has for long been muddy, eroded and barely passable in all but the driest times.

Unfortunately, CRT, set up in 2012 as an independent charitable trust. carried over much of the administrative baggage that had hampered its predecessor, the government controlled quango, British Waterways. One of the trust's many hang-ups was its lack of understanding of how to deal with offers of help, in particular, volunteering.

Whilst CRT, to give them credit, were



quick to slip volunteer lock-keepers into their roles, they seemed very wary of allowing amateurs to actually wield tools around the infrastructure.

Some determined local authorities, however, did manage to establish agreements in this brave new world. Notable locally is the partnership established at Braunston, near Daventry. These pioneering community involvement agreements have literally paved the way, proving that such partnerships can be of great benefit to the local communities and the charity.

Our offers, three years ago, to get involved seemed to fall on barren ground at the time. Recently, however, a bubble of interest has surfaced from the murky depths of CRT, offering the Parish Council the opportunity to consider 'adopting' our piece of the waterways.

As the *Bugle* goes to press the initial meetings have yet to be arranged but CRT's own promotional literature lists examples of typical community involvement projects. These include maintaining the towpaths, simple infrastructure maintenance such as painting and signing, fund raising, historical interpretation, promotion and educational events and helping to combat anti-social behaviour such as graffiti and vandalism.

Also noted is the possibility of community involvement in the future development of the canal. In our case this could, eventually, see the provision of visitor mooring spaces and improved access from the canal to the village, which could encourage boaters and walkers to pause awhile in Bosworth and perhaps savour some of our facilities.

We know from responses to our earlier calls that many villagers do, for various reasons, value 'our' canal. The canal through Bosworth is over 200 years old, but as well as being of historical interest it is also an important social, environmental and potentially, commercial, asset. As far as we're concerned an opportunity to have a greater say in how it is managed and maintained can only benefit the community.

Hopefully we will have more on this in next month's *Bugle*, at which time we may be calling in some of those earlier expressions of interest!

GREATER MAGNA

recent meeting of Welford Action Group (WAG) discussed proposals put forward by IDI Gazeley for the extension of Magna Park distribution centre. The plans, as tabled, are for an initial 1,000,000 sq. ft. warehouse and storage facility for DHL Supply Chain on land immediately to the west of Mere Lane. Further proposals would see the development of the whole of a 540 acre block, for which Gazeley hold an option, west of Mere Lane, effectively doubling the size of Magna Park.

In a separate proposal, plans are being drawn that would also see 3,000,000 sq. ft of warehousing, known as Symmetry Park, constructed south of the A4303 behind the existing Semelab facility. WAG members are concerned that these proposals will lead to further pressure on traffic passing through Welford and along the A5199 to access the distribution sites, especially when problems arise on the A14 and M1.

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau (NFIB) has received several reports of a rental property fraud whereby empty premises are being targeted by criminals.

The criminals will seek out an empty rental property and enter for the purposes of changing the locks and set it up so as to convince the victims that they own the property. They then advertise it for rent on online platforms, such as Gumtree. The fraudsters then arrange for interested victims to visit the property for a viewing. Parties that are interested in renting the property are then requested to pay a deposit and/or rent upfront in cash.

In some instances the victims have moved into the property only to be evicted by the real property owner or have found that the locks have been changed, once they have received the keys. There are instances where this fraud has left victims homeless.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Welcome House Guests

This year saw the welcome return of housemartins (Delichon urbicum) to our property. There were two nests in 2014 and six this year. As their numbers are falling, it's good to see ours are doing well. Two reasons for their decline have been suggested - pesticides and a shortage of suitable mud for their nests.

They are often confused with three similar looking birds; sand-martins, swallows and swifts.

House-martins have a bright white underside. The rarer sand-martins are similar but have a dark band around their chins. Swallows have red chins and deeply forked tails and swifts are stubby birds with dark undersides and scythe shaped wings.

Martins, like other aerial feeders, perform spectacular aerobatic manoeuvres in pursuit of their quarry of flies and aphids. They tend to hunt at a higher level than swallows, so the two don't compete for the same food resource.

The only downside to their residency ('downside' being an appropriate word) is the amount of poop the chicks produce. But the delight of watching these enchanting characters raise their offspring surely outweighs the hassle of cleaning up the mess.

Soon they'll be off on their epic migration to sub-Saharan Africa. In days of yore, naturalists believed they spent winter hibernating. Gilbert White in "The Natural History of Selborne" -1789," opined that; newly fledged chicks lacked the strength to make the journey, so undoubtedly hibernated.

We still don't know precisely where they over-winter, but as tracking devices get ever smaller and lighter, the answer should soon be known. More information can be found on The British Trust for Ornithology website: www.bto.org.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection



This month's picture of Bosworth is as interesting for what is still there as it is for what has disappeared! As we await the impending opening of Bosworth's new superstore we can look back at the origins of the shop building as the workshops of County Motors, the new extension to the rear appearing to have been recently built in this picture, which probably dates from the 1950s. Certainly we know that the cottages, at the extreme right, on the corner of Bell Lane opposite the Post Office, where cobbler Job Cheney plied his trade, were demolished in 1961.

The Post Office building is much as we find it today apart from the fenced yard to the side nearest The Green, which was later replaced by a single-storey extension. On the gable facing us you can just make out the ghostly outline of the cottage that previously abutted the Post Office. At least two cottages occupied the site of the garage forecourt, with the original Cherry Tree Inn on the roadside next to them.

The old Cherry Tree was swept away in a fit of public-house rebuilding in the 1930s when the 'customer base' changed from local village drinkers to the newly mobile motor car driving drinker. The new pub was set back to accommodate the essential car-park and a beer garden was provided at the rear so that the family could share in the day out in the countryside. In the picture you can also see the roof terrace at the back of the Cherry Tree, where you might sup your Watney's Red Barrel or Double Diamond - the height of decadence! The Cherry Tree sadly failed to catch sufficient passing traffic as tastes changed and, despite a gallant effort to lure customers in with a flurry of topless barmaids, it closed in 1987.

Just in shot, next to the pub is Porter's saddlery shop. Note also the rash of productive gardens in this shot - perhaps a legacy of the Dig for Victory campaign and war-time austerity. The motor car trundling along High Street looks like a Morris Eight. At launch the Morris was priced at £301, but for a mere £115 more you could have the up-market Wolseley

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, August 4th 2015 Three Council members and one member of the public were present. Apologies for absence were received from Mrs. Hobson

Co-option of Parish Councillor

■ James Shelley was nominated for co-option onto the Parish Council and was duly elected. *Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.*

Matters Arising

- ■Work on the Highcroft field footpath had still not been carried out. Clerk agreed to contact Highways to see what the problem was now that ground conditions were favourable.
- Wording for a new sign for the Play Area updating the facilities and the emergency procedure details had yet to be finalised.
- ■Costs for fabricating an entrance barrier for the Play Area car-park were being sought.
- ■No response had been received regarding the reason why only part of Broad Lane had been resurfaced. Clerk to contact Highways again on this matter.

Cemetery

■Council noted that the paths had been sprayed as per the schedule.

Playing Field & Play Area

■Repairs and refurbishment work had been carried out on the 'half-pipe' in the skate-park. Small repairs on other areas had been undertaken at the same time.

Allotments

- ■Plot 21 had been relinquished. The plot had been left overgrown and littered with redundant materials, which were cleared at Council's expense.
