
DAMAGED GOODS

At the recent meeting of the parish council it was noted that the pavilion was suffering at the hands of vandals. Since that meeting further vandalism has been found where paving slabs have been used to damage the fascia, roof and gutters.



history of the Church and some new illustrations. The booklet contains a handy index for ease of reference and is an invaluable source for family history researchers.



WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

English Oak Quercus robur

Doubtless some of you saw the recent BBC documentary, 'The Oak'. This excellent programme observed the life of an oak tree over 12 months. It got me thinking about the specimen at the bottom of Mowsley Road. While our tree isn't as venerable as the BBC's, a measurement of its circumference and a formula from the Forestry Commission, gives it an approximate age of 150 years. This means the acorn from which it grew germinated around 1865. A measurement of its shadow and some school mathematics gives its height as 25.3 metres.

There are two varieties of oak native to the U.K., which are differentiated by the terms 'pedunculate' and 'sessile.' These reference how their acorns are attached. Pedunculate means 'grown on a stalk', sessile means 'stalkless'. Mowsley Road's specimen is pedunculate. Of course, the tree doesn't exist in isolation. It forms a micro

environment for a menagerie of creatures: insects, birds and mammals. Climb to the top of the tree, look closely, and you'll see it's teeming with aphids, caterpillars, weevils, lacewings, etc. In the summer, I watched house martins circling the canopy and picking off any insect foolish enough to leave the foliage. With winter approaching, mice, squirrels and jays will begin to hoard the acorn harvest to keep them fed through the icy months. Around the country, some ancient



trees are given names such as 'Old Snoozy' and 'The Big Belly Oak'. *Mike Chanter*

This month's picture of the doctors' surgery in the process of being built takes on additional interest as we look forward to the prospect of a new doctors' surgery being built in the village. The picture was sent in, with a host of other pictures by Dr. David Roberts, who was one of the clinical partners until he left the practice and moved to Hertfordshire. It's no surprise to hear that David thinks that the builders were Begleys. He adds that all the administration and dispensing was carried out in the back rooms and the waiting room was where the dispensary is today. As patient numbers increased it became necessary to extend the building and a new waiting room was constructed on the front, again by the Begleys.

It is interesting to note that the building, on closer inspection is made of prefabricated panels, with stud walling for all the internal walls.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, October 6th 2015.

Four Council members and PCSO Peter Willson were present.

Apologies were received from Mr. Fletcher and the Clerk. Mr. Forman took the chair.

Visitors' Questions

- ■The Chairman invited PCSO Willson to address the meeting. Council heard that recent cases had reached the courts where tractor drivers had been prosecuted for not wearing seat belts. Seat belts are a legal requirement on all tractors where there is a risk of overturning and it is reasonably practicable to fit one.
- ■PCSO Willson discussed winter home safety precautions as the dark nights are now upon us. He advised householders to leave lights on when the home is left unattended to deter casual burglaries and to check security lighting.
- A number of internet frauds involving car sales had come to light recently. A simple internet check can be made regarding the tax and MoT status of cars for sale at www.gov.uk
- ■Council asked PCSO Willson to see if he could get any response from Highways regarding the worn road markings and the unlit junction and street lighting on Welford Road.

 Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

- ■A number of matters arising were held over to the next meeting as they required response from the Clerk.
- ■Council members queried the alleged foot trap problem with the ski stepper, as highlighted in the recent RoSPA report. Clerk would be asked to consult with the installers.

Cemetery

■Council noted that the pathways were overgrown and required spraying before the winter.

Playing Field & Play Area

- ■It was noted that vandal damage was evident on the fascia and roof of the Sports Pavilion. Clerk would be asked to open up dialogue with the Playing Field Committee regarding repairs.
- ■The fence and gates onto the playing field from the play area car park had been removed to allow access for the grounds maintenance contractors. ■Council members discussed the possibility of extending the car parking area to alleviate parking problems at busy times when overflow parking tended to spill out onto the roadside verges. It was suggested that bollards could be installed on the verges to deter parking. Clerk would be asked to contact Highways to discuss the matter.

Allotments

■Nothing to report.

Traffic Issues

■Council discussed a traffic data survey that had been circulated. The data compared traffic flows on the A4304 from 2001 and 2011. Slight increases in traffic movements of between 1.7% and 3.7% had been noted.

Broadband

- ■Mrs. Hobson informed the meeting that she had been in contact with the commissioning authorities regarding the inference that the delays were caused by the parish council not agreeing the positioning of the cabinets when this had been resolved in February.
- ■Council noted that work had now been carried out to install the second cabinet. Mr. Forman undertook to ensure that the defibrillator would be unaffected by the construction work which was being carried out nearby.

Correspondence & Planning

- ■Council discussed a number of queries that had arisen with the granting of permission for the proposed micro-pub in the Post Office building. Concerns were raised about the flow of traffic and car parking space. It was agreed to monitor the situation closely once the business was in operation.
- ■Members discussed the roadside fencing to 7 Butt Lane, which it was understood was the subject of an enforcement order. Clerk would be asked to clarify the situation with the district council.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, November 3rd at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.

Letter from the Rectory

In these days when many people head off for foreign holidays each year and news of what is happening across the world is broadcast into our living rooms several times a day in our news bulletins, the world can seem a very small place. We are perhaps more aware of other nations' cultures than previous generations have been, and more tolerant in this country of other religions. But what do we know of other nationality's Christian customs? Christianity is a worldwide religion, probably now also the most persecuted religious group, but also an ancient one and present in some small way in all parts of the world.

Our Christmas Tree Festival this year has the theme, for those who want to follow it, of 'Christmas around the World', and invites us to investigate Christian Christmas customs from far and wide and depict them in the dressing of our trees. Not everywhere celebrates by giving presents. In some places Christmas is celebrated on January 7th, after our celebration of Epiphany. There is great variety in ways to celebrate the arrival of Jesus as a baby in Bethlehem 2000 years ago.

So, let us celebrate the diversity of our world in a positive way in our Christmas Tree Festival this year (28th/29th November) and join the worldwide church in welcoming the Christ-child. Very much looking forward to seeing you there. *Liz*
