LAST POST

The Post Office is seeking the views of users of the village post office so that they can tailor the service to local needs. As you will probably be aware there is a proposal to relocate the post office branch to the new Springfields Store next door and the Post Office is looking at taking the opportunity, as part of a nationwide upgrade, to improve the counter service provided.

The move, if approved, would see post office counter services offered at the retail counter, as they are at Welford. This would simplify the facility and have the benefit of extending the hours that the post office is open, in line with the retail operation and make it easier and more convenient to access.

The Post Office has opened a consultation process and is asking users to share their views on the proposed move. In particular they are keen to hear what users think of the suitability of the new premises and the ease of access.

The consultation is open until February 8th 2016 and your views can be noted via the consultation website, www.postofficeviews.co.uk, where you can also find more information about the changes.

LOCAL NEWS IN BRIEF

■ Archaeologists from the University of Leicester have unearthed the remains of an Iron Age settlement on the site of the proposed new housing development off Newlands Road, **Welford**

■ Harborough District Council is to provide £12,000 towards the £40,000 cost of restoring the Whittle jet monument which stands on the A426/A4303 roundabout at **Lutterworth**

■ The police helicopter unit, based at **Sulby** which was to be disbanded later this year, has won a reprieve. The unit, which has been operational since 1994, was to be replaced by a regional air support unit based at East Midlands Airport

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Fun Guys!

First a word of warning; unless you're an expert mycologist, don't pick and eat wild fungi. Poisonous fungi can be particularly nasty; their toxins can damage the liver and kidneys, with deadly consequences.

However, this doesn't mean that we shouldn't try to identify specimens that grow in and around our village and learn something of their characteristics.

Take, for instance, the descriptively named Yellow Brain fungus (*Tremella Mesenterica*), also known as Witches Butter, that grows on fallen branches during the winter months. Its colour marks out this small variety, around an inch or so long and half an inch wide. The splash of fluorescent yellow in the undergrowth appears artificial and it's easily taken for a piece of litter.

Along the canal can be found examples of Dryad's Saddle (*Polyporus Squamosus*). This bracket, or shelf fungus, is generally a tan colour with darker scales or "squamules" on its upper side. It can grow quite large, sometimes up to a foot across and four inches thick. A dryad is a Greek mythological nymph that needed to be appeased before any damage was done to a tree, otherwise harm would befall the woodsman.

Another large variety, which grows locally, is the Giant Puffball (*Calvatia Gigantea*).

The pictured specimen (right) was roughly 14cm (5½ inches) in diameter, but monstrous examples of 150cm have been recorded. As they decompose they release trillions of spores into the atmosphere - that's a million, million spores!

And of course, we mustn't forget yeast, the unicellular fungus, which leavens the bread in our shop and ferments the alcohol in the pub.

Step forward those 'saviours of lost souls', local developers, Jelsons Ltd and Fernie Court, as we know it today emerged, literally, from the rubble...

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, December 1st 2015.

Four Council members were present.

Apologies received from James Shelley

Minutes of last meeting were read and approved

Matters Arising

■ Council noted that although some success had been reported on the restoration of lighting on Welford Road/High Street junction, lamps in two signs were still not working.

■ No response had been received from Highways regarding the worn road markings.

■ Council discussed a quotation for repairing the vandal damage to the pavilion guttering, fascia and roof tiles. The quotation was approved and accepted.

■ The cemetery paths had been sprayed as requested.

Cemetery

■ Council was still awaiting a response to concerns relating to wording proposed for a memorial.

■ Clerk was asked to seek quotations for cutting back the hedges and margins around the cemetery.

Playing Field & Play Area

■ Council agreed a quotation for repairing and replacing the broken slabs outside the Pavilion.

■ Members discussed proposals to open up the lower gateways onto the playing field beside the Scout Hut to enable access for maintenance and by contractors.

■ It was noted that the ground rent agreement for the Scout Hut was due for review in September 2016. It was agreed to carry out a review of this and the Tennis Club lease, which had expired.

Allotments

■ Clerk presented a detailed balance sheet for the allotments. A new padlock would be needed shortly as the old one was becoming unreliable. Clerk was asked to look into the cost of a numerical coded lock rather than issuing keys to plot holders.

Traffic Issues

■ A14 issues were evident in higher traffic volumes, especially when road closures were taking place. Luckily these were generally overnight.

Broadband

■ Council noted that the high speed broadband service was now fully active throughout the local exchange area. There was some discussion regarding the promotion of the local service, which was expected to be up to the service providers. Mrs. Hobson reported that a number of subscribers had already contacted their supplier and had upgraded their contracts.

Any Other Business

■ Correspondence had been received from Sarah Brown, volunteer co-ordinator for the Canal and River Trust regarding the parishes proposed canal adoption scheme. A meeting was to be arranged in the new year.

■ Clerk was asked to seek a response from Highways regarding the poor road condition in Broad Lane and to contact the Rights of Way officer regarding the condition of the School Lane to Butt Lane bridle track.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, February 2nd 2016 at 7.45pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
