RAISING THE ROOF

The Trustees of the Turville Memorial Hall are pleased to announce that Tarmac, the operators of Bosworth Quarry, have donated over £48,000, through the Landfill Communities Fund, towards the restoration of the hall roof.

Works to replace the roof of the 120 year old hall are underway and are expected to be completed by September. As the hall is situated in a Conservation Area, the roof has to be replaced with the same material and so will be fixed with new clay roof tiles. The opportunity is also being taken to insulate the building, something it currently lacks, whilst the roof is stripped back. Part of the grant is going towards replacing interior light fittings with LED lighting, to reduce energy consumption.

Tarmac estates manager, Tim Deal, said: "We're delighted to be able to support a project that will provide so many benefits when completed. Engaging with the communities in which we operate is something we strive to do across our business and providing a well needed grant for the village hall is a great way we can involve ourselves."

The village hall is a vital resource for many groups locally, both young and old, including a much-needed facility for the school, concerts and shows. The hall was gifted to the village 120 years ago, and is a registered charity which is maintained and managed by a dedicated team of volunteers. The grant provides an ideal opportunity to ensure the building operates for many more years without worries of the roof failing.

Samantha Bell (Chairman), said, "On behalf of the village of Husbands Bosworth, we are delighted and thankful that we have been awarded the grant to enable us to replace a very old, deteriorated roof before it fails completely. It would have taken us years to raise the funds to replace it."

MEGA PARK ON HOLD

Proposals to extend the Magna Park warehouse and distribution centre have been put on hold by Harborough District Council following a legal review of the planning process. IDI Gazeley's plans related to land to the north west of Mere Lane, in Bittesby parish. The application, to create a storage and distribution centre and ancillary infrastructure at the Magna Park business park, was originally given approval at an extraordinary meeting of HDC Planning Committee back in January. However, following legal advice, the Council is re-considering the application in light of advice relating to the nearby Bittesby Deserted Medieval Village - a national and statutorily protected heritage site and Scheduled Ancient Monument (SAM).

The application proposes a massive storage and distribution centre, on a greenfield site, outside the present curtilage of Magna Park. The proposal also includes the creation of roundabouts, partial realignment of Mere Lane and upgrading of the A5 road to dual carriageway. The committee meeting to re-consider this application will be held on Wednesday, July 13th at Bruntingthorpe Proving Ground. Two further planning applications for storage and distribution centres at Magna Park are set to be considered by the council's planning committee later in the year.



WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Common Buzzard: *Buteo buteo* These articles always seem to be full of doom and gloom, but occasionally there's good news in the world of wildlife.

For instance, I recently spotted a red kite in the area. These birds almost vanished early in the 20th century and only survived in the wilder parts of Wales. But after reintroductions, protective laws and work by the RSPB, their numbers have recovered to around 1,600 breeding pairs across the UK.


Similarly, ospreys are doing well, though you're unlikely to see them in the Husbands Bosworth area. However, through the wonders of the internet, you can 'watch' them. Have a look at the Rutland Water website, www.ospreys.org.uk. Their Manton Bay camera is trained on an osprey nest. This year's chicks should fledge around the first of July but, like all youngsters, they return home to beg for food!

The third raptor, whose numbers are increasing, is the buzzard. This is a bird you will certainly see in our local countryside. You'll also hear their distinctive call. When courting, or grumbling at harassing corvids (crows, rooks, etc.) they make a noise which sounds a lot like a squeaky toy. For such a bruiser of a bird, it's an incongruous squawk.

Their diet consists of anything they can get their talons into, which includes carrion, small mammals, birds, reptiles, large insects and even earthworms. I once saw one tucking into a chicken. Coincidentally, it was Christmas time... By the way, the females have the biggest talons and beaks!

During the first half of the last century they disappeared from many areas of the country. The cause was shooting by gamekeepers, the myxomatosis plague and pesticide pollution. But, with legal protection and more favourable countryside practices, by 2013 their numbers had recovered to around 68,000 breeding pairs.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection



Back in April we featured a similar picture to this one, of the corner of Bell Lane and High Street, and in particular Mather's Garage, which occupied the site of the present day **Cheney Court.**

Subsequently we were contacted by reader, Clifford Smith of Kibworth who had come across our mention of Mather's during an internet trawl. His interest lies in a motorcycle that he has recently restored; a BSA Model 'L' 350cc. The machine was purchased from Mather's Garage on May 8th 1928 by a Fred Stamford Greaves of Mowsley Road, Husbands Bosworth. The actual records show 'Market Bosworth', but as Mr. Smith notes, a plate on the tool-box clearly states 'Mather's Garage Husbands Bosworth'.

A postcard in the Society's Archive Collection declares that Mather's, at this time, as well as providing general motor repair facilities, also sold tyres and accessories and hired motor cars.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Annual General Meeting held on Tuesday, May 3rd 2016. Three Council members and PC Nicola Diaper and PCSO Pete Willson were present. Apologies received from Sue Fisher, Patricia Hobson and County Councillor Graham Hart.

Visitors' Questions

- ■PC Diaper discussed local crime issues, including recent suspicious activity that could relate to thefts of lead.
- ■PCSO Willson reminded dog owners of the dangers of leaving their pets in unventilated vehicles during the hot weather.

Minutes of last meeting were read and approved Matters Arising

■Clerk informed Council that the Tennis Club lease documents had been drawn up, ready for signing.

Cemetery

- ■Work to re-board the Chapel of Rest east door was being carried out. It was noted that a number of slates had slipped and Clerk would arrange for these to be fixed at the same time.
- ■Council noted that the grass cutting contractors had not cut into the margins. Chairman would chase up the contractor on this issue.
- ■It was also noted that some trees close to the margins needed lower branches removing. Playing Field & Play Area
- ■Council members had met in the Play Area prior to the Meeting. A RoSPA report on the condition of the skatepark and play area equipment was now due. It was expected that some minor repairs would be needed.

Allotments

- ■Clerk informed Council that one plot needed strimming, whilst a villager was to look at a recently relinquished plot with a view to taking it on.
- ■Problems were reported with the new padlock, where the combination had accidentally been changed. Chairman agreed to sort this out

Traffic Issues

- ■Mr. Forman reported that he and Mr. Smith had met with their SID counterparts in Welford to compare notes on the operation of our respective devices with a view to co-ordinating data readings and the possibility of jointly publishing them. Lubenham, North Kilworth and South Kilworth would be invited to join the forum.
- ■Isolated incidences of particularly very high speeds had been noted, which could relate to specific offenders. Mr Smith would be asked to identify the times and locations of these incidents, so that the Road Safety Team could be informed.
- ■It was noted that Welford were able to obtain results from the Northants Road Safety Team and PC Diaper was asked why their Leicestershire counterparts were reluctant to divulge Bosworth camera data.

QUARRY NEWS

Village representatives met with the quarry management team to discuss local issues at a recent Quarry Liaison meeting. An update of quarry operations showed a sustained recovery within the construction market with increased tonnages of aggregates moving off the site during the year. Changes in the industry meant that much of the material was now leaving as bagged product on high capacity lorries, reducing vehicle movements.

Landfill traffic into the site had been maintained, with a number of large contracts from the Leicester area. An extension to the landfill area was planned to cope with expected demand.

Work on the restoration of the Welford Road site was likely to be completed within the next two years, where a small pocket of aggregate was recoverable, after which the land would be restored to agriculture, wetland and amenity lakes.

Meanwhile, work on the Butt Lane site is providing sufficient aggregate for current production. An extension of the extraction area here, was being considered as part of the Leicestershire Minerals Plan review. The group heard that a number of thefts and criminal damage incidents had led to a recent update of the CCTV and




