
YOUR BUGLE CELEBRATES 20 YEARS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Speckled Wood [Pararge aegeria] A common sight in our hedgerows is the Speckled Wood butterfly. When they are looking to breed, the males commandeer a sunlit spot and await passing females. If you happen to take a walk during one of their breeding spells (they produce two or three broods a year), you'll frequently spot one of these butterflies in every dappled glade along the way.



As the sun moves, and their perches become shaded, they flutter about, seeking a new spot in the limelight.

A good place to see them is along the canal from Kilworth bridge towards the Bosworth tunnel. Sometimes you'll find a pair of males performing aerobatics as they fight over a prime location. However, some energetic males eschew this 'Territorial Defence strategy' in favour of roaming the woods looking for receptive females; a 'Patrolling strategy'.

For the females, mating is a once in a short-lifetime experience (one to three weeks), though luckier males mate multiple times. An unusual feature of this species, is that they can overwinter as either caterpillars or chrysalises.

Their preferred food as adults is the honeydew excreted by aphids in the treetops. In their larval stage, the green striped caterpillars feed on a variety of grasses.

Due to climate change, they have migrated into areas of scrub, hedgerows and even gardens, and their range now extends to far northwest Scotland. As a result, it's a good news story in terms of their numbers. *Mike Chanter*

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Back in June we featured an article about the fuel delivery pipeline that supplied aviation fuel to Bruntingthorpe airfield and, in particular, the pipe bridge that crosses the canal between Bosworth and Theddingworth. A while back, Michael Salter, sent us some pictures he had taken surreptitiously of Bruntingthorpe whilst the site was in the throes of the US Air Force takeover of the former WWII RAF base in the late 1950s. Michael's pictures show the massive earthworks that were necessary to convert the site to American use, (and abundant mud!). The old aerodrome was almost totally rebuilt and a 2 mile long bomb-proof runway constructed as the airfield was destined to become a front-line strategic bomber base; code name 'Big Thunder' and home to the colossal six-engined Boeing B47 Stratojet nuclear bomber.

Further to our previous piece about the pipe bridge itself we hear from John Begley that the Begley family building empire had a hand in the construction of the pipeline. John recalls that one of the first jobs he did after leaving school was to help construct the stop-tap chambers for the pipeline. The brick-lined chambers were installed at 2 mile intervals along the line from the Kelmarsh storage depot to the airfield and accommodated a stop valve controlled by an enormous wheel 'tap' which, along with the associated pipe work, was all painted with red oxide paint.

John remembers that they got the job of painting the pipe-bridge itself and were given sufficient

metallic silver paint and instructed to give it three coats. Father Jack Begley obviously felt that three coats was a bit extravagant and told the 'lads' to give it just one good coat and leave it at that! Maybe because it was a Sunday and they would rather be elsewhere, John recalls that they slapped the paint on so liberally that the canal surface soon developed a silver sheen beneath the structure!

HORTICULTURAL AND CRAFT SHOW 2016

Inside this copy of the Bugle you should find the Schedule for our Village Horticultural and Craft Show to be held on Bank Holiday Sunday, August 28th.

The Show began about a hundred and thirty years ago as a very serious, competitive affair for the gardeners of the 'big houses' in the vicinity, to show off their prowess in growing flowers, vegetables and fruit, in both native and exotic varieties. About a hundred years ago, it was taken over by HB branch of the British Legion, together with the Women's Institute and became one of the major events of the summer. Now it is one of the few traditional village horticultural shows left in Leicestershire, with all the profits being ploughed back to Bosworth organisations. The show helps to define us as a community, so let's keep this old tradition alive by exhibiting, or just come along and be amazed how many talented folks live in Bosworth, and enjoy homemade cakes and play tombola!

Over the past few years the show has grown in the Childrens' and Craft Classes. The produce area has been more difficult for many reasons including (once more) the weather. Still, it's dry inside the Village Hall and Friends Of Bosworth School have organised an exhibition of horticultural paintings by school and pre-school children. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

20 MPH SCHOOL LIMITS

At a recent meeting the school governors welcomed proposals recently tabled by Leicestershire County Council to install Advisory School 20mph Zone controls on the highway approaches to Husbands Bosworth C. of E. Primary School.

The zone will straddle the A4304 and A5199 junction, bounded by Kilworth Road, Welford Road and High Street and be indicated by 20mph flashing light warning masts, similar to those installed in Lubenham.

Within the flashing light zone the 20mph speed will be operational for a short period during the morning and afternoon periods of the day when pupils are attending and departing the school; times to be confirmed and agreed by the school prior to installation.

WELFORD ACTION GROUP

At a recent meeting with Christine Zacharia, leader of Harborough District Council's planning enforcement team, Welford Action Group members discussed specific problems with traffic to and from the Bruntingthorpe Proving Ground site. Although HGV traffic in general causes major problems through Husbads Bosworth and on the narrow Welford High Street, in a recent survey the group identified Bruntingthorpe traffic, and particularly the high number of car transporters, as being a significant proportion of the total.

At the meeting Ms Zacharia outlined the constraints laid down at the time of the original planning permission for the car storage site in 1996. The total number of car transporter movements were restricted to 200 per week, with a maximum of 45 on any one day.

However, the permission for subsequent use of the site for car auctions in 2010 seems not to have a set limit on transporter movements for that enterprise, the restriction being held only at three auctions a week. The group felt that this anomily and omission could be a

major contributory factor in the high volume of car transporter traffic experienced through Bosworth and Welford.

The problem may also be exacerbated by the fact that no designated route for traffic using the site had been enshrined within the granted permissions. However, it was noted that Mannheim Auctions, the chief operator for the auction site, did issue a Designated Route card, using Pincet Lane, the A4304 and M1 junction 20, to all their contractors, but admitted that the use wasn't controlled.

Ms Zacharia admitted that mistakes had been made in the planning process and that more rigorous enforcement of movements and monitoring would be expected in future, where traffic to and from the site was causing concerns in local villages.

Whilst many questions were still unresolved, the group was pleased that HDC had taken on board their concerns and had opened a Planning Enforcement case to look into the matter.
