

GREATER BOSWORTH

You've no doubt all seen the flyer posted around the village recently by Carter Jonas, with the proposal for further housing development off Welford Road. The scheme, which proposes the erection of 32 homes on the green field site adjacent to Knights Close, is still in the early stages. Carter Jonas, who are acting as agents on behalf of Leicestershire County Council, which owns the land, are promoting the development. The proposal is being pushed forward, in part, on the back of the outline planning permission granted in 2015 for the Davidsons 41 home residential development on the opposite side of the road.

A contribution towards community infrastructure is normally sought by planners in any major development, usually in the form of a proportion of social or low cost housing. The Davidsons proposal offsets some of their community contribution responsibility by offering to provide a new doctors' surgery.

In the development proposed by Carter Jonas for the Welford road west site, they are seeking to include a dozen or so 'affordable' homes.

One of the concerns raised by the Parish Council early on in negotiations, was the cumulative effect that a total of over 70 new homes will have on the ability of the village school to cope. The school is effectively up to capacity at present and it has been suggested that if permission is to be granted, a contribution towards upgrading the school should be included as a planning condition.

Pre-planning assessments of the site have been carried out and plans are likely to be presented before Harborough planners, seeking outline planning permission in the autumn. *The site was identified in a Strategic Housing Land Assessment in 2014, which constitutes part of Harborough District Council's Local Plan.*


LIVE AT THE VILLAGE HALL

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH

A nice and easy no-bake cake that will appeal to both children and adults alike. Very quick to prepare and will keep up to 1 week in an airtight tin.

Malteser Cake

85g butter

2 tablespoons golden syrup

2 tablespoons cocoa powder

170g digestive biscuits - crushed

1 x 175g Maltesers (½ crushed and ½ left whole)

450g loaf tin lined with cling film

Method

Melt butter and golden syrup in a small pan. Stir in cocoa powder, digestives and crushed maltesers until well combined. Allow to cool slightly, then stir in whole maltesers. Spoon mixture into loaf tin and press down well. Chill until set (approx. 2 hours). Slice, serve and enjoy! Store in an airtight tin up to 1 week.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Slugs and Snails and...

Two months ago, I mentioned slugs in the article on hedgehogs and it occurred to me that I know next to nothing about these creatures, other than they comprise one third of the constituents of little boys! After some research I discovered...

Slugs are molluscs and gastropods (belly-footed), and not everything they do is bad. In the wild they help to recycle the nutrients in decaying matter, they promote plant diversity and disperse seeds and spores through their waste.

Anatomically, they have a breathing hole on the right side of their head and two pairs of tentacles. The upper, larger pair, have eyes at the tips. The lower, shorter pair are taste organs and are used to check the edibility of potential food. Slugs are hermaphrodites, having dual sexuality, but they prefer to seek out a mate if possible. The acrobatic individual shown is a 'Black Slug' [*Arion ater*]. This species lays several clutches of eggs in dark, moist locations during late summer/early autumn, and dies shortly thereafter, rarely surviving into a second year.

Slugs are indeed slimy. They manufacture three types of slime. The first provides an all-over coating to prevent dehydration. The second, stickier variety, is laid down to aid locomotion, and, as it is unique to each species, it helps them track down potential mates - an important consideration when your top speed is around two inches a minute! Thirdly, they produce an unappetising mucus to deter predators.

Surprisingly, black slugs are edible but apparently they taste horrible; an opinion I'm content not to question...

All in all, perhaps we should be more forgiving when they reduce our vegetables to naked stalks. Maybe the best solution would be barriers between the areas where they are welcome and unwelcome.

OUR PARISH CHURCH

All Saints Church, Husbands Bosworth has been well supported by its community in recent times, especially following the theft of lead from the north aisle roof. All at the church are most grateful for the support received. We are pleased that this work is completed and the north aisle roof is now waterproof.

Sadly the same cannot be said of the south aisle roof which leaks like a sieve and many receptacles are required every time it rains, to catch the various drips! Our 5-yearly condition survey of the building recommended that the south aisle roof repairs should be undertaken within 18 months. Quotations for the repairs are currently being sought and the cost is expected to be similar to the cost of repair to the north aisle roof (around £20,000). Monitoring of cracks in the masonry is also to be undertaken on the spire. Grant support will be sought to supplement the fund-raising that will be needed to effect these repairs. As custodians of this ancient building for the current and future use of generations in our parish, the Parochial Church Council would welcome any help that can be offered.

SCHOOL REPORT

HUSBANDS BOSWORTH C. of E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

NEW HEAD

The Governors of Husbands Bosworth School are pleased to announce the appointment of our new head teacher, Mr. Alan Eathorn. Alan comes to us from Meadowdale School in Market Harborough, where he was a Deputy Head. He lives in Corby.

20 MPH SCHOOL ZONE

Parents and residents regularly raise concerns about the speed of traffic and 'near misses' on the main roads where our children need to cross to and from school and where the secondary school children wait for their buses. Husbands Bosworth School has been engaging with the Local Authority to try to put in place 20 mph speed limit zones as a traffic calming solution to help keep our children safe. Research has shown that the risk of a child being involved in an accident is reduced by about two-thirds where 20 mph zones have been installed. Local consultation is of vital importance, to make sure that local communities have input into the development of the schemes, and plans for the Bosworth scheme will be made available to residents in the coming weeks.

Report of the Parish Council Annual General Meeting held on Tuesday, August 2nd 2016.

Full Council was present.

Apologies were received from County Councillor Graham Hart.

Minutes of last meeting were read and approved

Matters Arising

■ Clerk informed Council that the Tennis Club lease documents had been drawn up but were awaiting the return of signatories from their holidays.

Cemetery

■ Work, which had commenced, to seal the south door on the Chapel of Rest had been stopped due to a misunderstanding on what work was needed.

■ Some aspects of the grass-cutting work being carried out this season was not to Council specification. The Chairman agreed to have a site meeting with the contractor.

Playing Field & Play Area

■ It was noted that glass bottles were being taken onto the skatepark area and some had evidently been broken. Council suggested that a notice be erected pointing out that the facility would be closed if the safety of users was being compromised.

Allotments

■ Clerk informed Council that only one plot on the whole site was un-let.

Traffic Issues

■ Brian Smith had agreed to supply a break-down and analysis of speed recordings from the SID to pin-point times and sites of high speed readings.

Accounts

■ Monthly accounts were presented and approved. Accounts for Bosworth Festival 2016 were presented and approved. Council noted that £3,660 from the Festival had been distributed to charities and local good causes.

From the Rectory

Faith is a dual journey of discovery. There is the inward journey of discovering what or who it is we believe in and there is the outward journey of what the discovery of faith calls us to do or be in life. For all of us, what we do or do not believe in will affect our choices in life and who we become. We see this worked out both for good and for bad in our world. It would seem that some of those who have committed acts of violence against others, such as those who killed the priest, Father Jacques Hamel in France, were radicalised remotely by IS and had taken on board the ideology that shapes them and on the basis of that they killed. Others believe in basing their life on kindness and goodness and that moves them to spend their lives in the service of others, helping the poor and needy, giving shelter to refugees. Not everyone can be at the front line of other people's need, but we can all support through charitable giving, or supporting things like the foodbank, or caring for friends and family when they are in need. We all have free-will to choose what we want to believe in and base our lives upon - that is part of the gift of being human.

What the Christian faith teaches us is that God also has faith - he believes, to the core of his being, that human beings are worth loving. God is passionate about people and wants each one individually to know that he loves and cares for them. Having given people free-will, he cannot force them to respond to his love, just continue to offer it. His belief in people caused him to act too - to send Jesus, his son, part of his very self, to become one of us, to walk alongside us and share this life with all its ups and downs, so we could know more of his love. Do you accept his love? Where are you on your inward journey of faith? What does it lead you to do?
