### **LETTING OFF STEAM**

ommissioning work at the Welland Waste Management's Renewable Energy Generating Facility (REGF) at Pebble Hall is being carried out as the plant winds up to full operation.

Recently the plant has been undergoing day-time steam and pressure testing, which has produced intermittent steam plumes that have been visible off-site. The nature of the operation, to convert inert wood waste into combustible gases to drive electricity generating units, means that the exhaust from the plant is primarily steam. Silencers and scrubbers in the exhaust outlets are installed to reduce the environmental impact.

The unit, which is planned to treat 72,000 tonnes of wood waste per annum in order to generate 10MW of renewable electricity alongside a thermophilic food waste digester plant, is part of a £47m development on the site - enough to supply Market Harborough and all the villages to Lutterworth!

### **TOPPLE TESTERS**

arborough District Council is planning to carry out a headstone survey of Husbands Bosworth churchyard during May. The work is to be carried out for safety reasons, in line with Ministry of Justice guidelines and will entail 'topple-testing' the stability of every memorial in the churchyard. The work is being undertaken in seven council-controlled churchyards and cemeteries across the district.

Any memorials found to be unsafe will have a notice placed next to them informing of their instability. Any found to be dangerous will also be either supported using temporary stakes, cordoned off or laid down, as appropriate.

Although Bosworth churchyard has been closed since 1908, it contains the graves a number of established local families. The memorial owner is responsible for the safety and condition and where possible the memorial owner will be contacted and asked to arrange for any remedial work to be carried out.

### **BOSWORTH IN FOCUS**

### A TASTE OF BOSWORTH **Apricot Fruit Cake**

A very moist fruit cake, using tinned apricots, provides an alternative to a traditional fruit cake.

175g Self raising flour & 1 dessert spoon Pinch of salt

100g glacé cherries - halved

425g can apricots, drained

125g butter

115g caster sugar

2 large eggs, beaten

2 tablespoons milk

100g sultanas

100g raisins

100g currants

### Method

Heat oven to 160°C / Gas 3. Grease and line 900g (2lb) loaf tin. Sieve flour and salt together. Take halved cherries and roll three quarters of them in a dessert spoon of flour to coat - keep remainder for topping. Drain apricots and chop finely. Cream butter and sugar until light and creamy, then beat in eggs, adding a tablespoon of flour with the last amount of egg. Fold in the rest of the flour, milk, chopped apricots and all the dried fruit except the cherries for the topping. Spoon into the prepared tin and arrange the remaining cherries on top. Bake for 2 hours, until risen and firm to touch. Leave to cool in tin.

Once cool this cake can be frozen by removing the paper, and wrapping in a double thickness of foil. To defrost unwrap and thaw at room temperature for 4 - 6 hours. Store in the fridge wrapped in foil for up to one week.

### WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Banded Demoiselle - Calopteryx splendens Like the ferns we covered recently, damselflies have been around for over 300 million years. There are about twenty species in the U.K. and I know it's a cliché, but they truly are jewels of the riverbank none more so than the Banded Demoiselles. The male of the species is a luminous metallic

blue colour with dark bands on its wings, while the female is an incandescent emerald green. Damselflies are smaller than their cousins, the dragonflies. They also have slimmer bodies and fold their wings along their bodies when resting. For most of their lives, usually two years, they live underwater as nymphs and they thrive in clean water, so they're a good indicator of water quality. They're voracious eaters, and very aggressive hunters. Virtually everything that moves is on the menu; mosquito larvae, bloodworms, tadpoles, etc.. As they grow, they moult numerous times until finally, on a sunny day, they climb out of the water and moult one last time; this time emerging in their adult form. They retain their predatory instincts and use their amazing flying skills to capture insects on the wing.

Males compete for breeding territories and court passing females with a special display flight. If the courtship is successful, the male uses claspers, which protrude from his hindmost segment, to grasp the female behind her head and the couple fly in tandem while they mate. Whilst still joined together, the female lays her eggs on submerged vegetation. Two weeks later the eggs hatch into nymphs and the life cycle begins again.



# BYGONE BOSWORTH Images from the Historical

### **GHOST SIGNS**

The picture here shows a familiar ghostsign on the frontage of what was once The Graziers Arms public house on High Street. The pub was named for the graziers who farmed much of the renowned grazing land in the upper Welland Valley, around the village. Until fairly recent years there were an unsually high number of farms within the core of the village. These farmsteads had few associated buildings and were isolated from their farmland, which was out in the free-draining fertile valley land. The livestock would feed on the lush grass throughout the grazing season and were slaughtered before winter, which explains why extensive winter housing wasn't needed.

Not so long ago Husbands Bosworth could boast no less than eight public houses, three of which, The Cherry Tree, The Red Lion and



The Graziers Arms were on the High Street. The Butchers Arms was on Church Street, and The Wheatsheaf on Bell Lane. The Bell Inn, of course survives, as does the Wharf Inn at Welford Wharf, but the Union Anchor at Kilworth Wharf, sadly, is no more.

### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, March 7th 2017.

Four Parish Councillors, County Councillor Graham Hart and two members of the public were present. Apologies were received from James Shelley

### **Visitors' Questions**

■The meeting was preceded by a Section 106 funding meeting, which was attended by representatives of the school Open the Book group, the Parochial Church Council and Bosworth Tots. Two members of the public remained for the Parish Council meeting.

### Minutes of last meeting were read and approved

### **Matter arising from the Minutes**

- ■Power has been restored to the defibrillator box on The Green.
- ■New fencing has been erected adjacent to the Sports Pavilion car park.
- ■A professional survey of the trees bordering the Playing Field had highlighted the need for the removal of one tree and dead-wood removal and reduction on all others.
- ■No response has been received from the Scouts regarding the new lease.

### Cemetery

- ■Work to trim back overhanging yew trees has been carried out.
- ■Two new memorial benches for the cemetery have been delivered.
- A slate has been dislodged from the roof of the Chapel of Rest.

### Playing Field & Play Area

- ■Clerk reported that the roadside gateway padlock had been broken to gain access to the rear of the Old Bowling Green.
- ■Council noted that the new gate/barrier had been installed on the Recreation Area car-park. Clerk was asked to arrange for a warning sign to be made.
- ■Work has commenced on replacing the fencing and installing a wider gateway from the Recreation Area car-park to the lower playing field.

### Allotments

- ■Allotment holders have reported problems with the allotment roadside gate padlock. Mr Fletcher agreed to look into this.
- ■Clerk informed Council that rent letters had been sent out and that one plot was still vacant, with immediate access.

### Traffic Issued

■County Councillor Hart informed the meeting that County would be receiving central government funding for average speed enforcement cameras. Walcote on the A4304 was one of five sites around the county where persistently high speeds were noted, and where cameras would be sited.

### Neighbourhood Plan

■Council formally agreed to proceed with a Neighbourhood Plan following a positive response at the inaugural meeting in February. It was agreed to seek a paid secretary/co-ordinator for the steering group.

### S106 Developer Funding

■[A S106 meeting had preceded the Parish Council meeting] Council agreed to continue promoting the availability of developer funding, despite poor response from community groups. Mr. Fletcher agreed to co-ordinate the group. It was agreed to hold another meeting of interested parties prior to the Parish Council meeting on Tuesday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Guidance notes for S106 funding would be circulated to all group representatives who had attended the first meeting.

### Accounts

■Monthly accounts were presented and approved.

### Correspondence

■Council had been invited to submit road names for the new development off Welford Road. Townend Close and Marsh Drive were suggested as having local historical relevance to the site.

### **Any Other Business**

- ■Council discussed the present arrangement regarding the grant in lieu of booking fees for Parish Council led meetings in the Village Hall. Mrs. Fisher would discuss the matter with the Hall Trustees. Neighbourhood Plan meetings would be invoiced separately as a grant was to be sought for NP expenses.
- ■It was noted that the allotment noticeboard post had broken. Mr. Forman agreed to reinstate it and fit the new noticeboard.
- ■Clerk was asked to bring the matter of illegible road markings and silt blocked storm drains on Welford Road to the attention of Highways.

The next meeting will be the Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday, April 4th, 2017, at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall. The meeting will be an informal open meeting with no official parish business conducted.

### FROM THE RECTORY

Did the few sunny days in the middle of March, when all the daffodils were at their brightest, the snowdrops were not quite over and the crocuses and primroses were in full colour make you start to think about what needed to be done in the garden to get it ready for this year? The warmth of the spring sunshine lures us out to take a look and see what has happened over the winter, to see if there is repair work to be done as a consequence of storm Doris and what will need to be done in order to plant this year's crops and flowers.
