BIGGER BOSWORTH?

In last month's *Bugle* we lauded the commencement of Davidsons' 41 home Welford Road development. The project, which includes a new doctors' surgery building as the developer's community contribution, has been looming amidst much speculation, for almost three years. So, the start of ground works on site at the beginning of last month was generally welcomed.

However, concerns have been raised that assurances that the surgery element would be tackled first don't seem to be reflected in the work that is going ahead. Instead, the site of the new surgery building seems to have been excluded from the initial ground works that are presently being carried out.

Concerns have also been raised regarding the bird-proofing of the hedge at the back of the site, which suggests that Davidsons are looking at the possibility of extending the site into the fields to the east of the permitted area. At present the bird-proofing has been justified to enable the developer to remove the section of hedgerow in order to establish an off-site storage compound in the adjacent field. However, if approved for development later, this could see more housing stretching across to Butt Lane.



OUT OF BOUNDS?

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) is currently undertaking an Electoral Review of the District Council. Draft recommendations suggest a council size for Harborough of 34 councillors (3 less than the current 37) and are proposing a pattern of district wards to best achieve the objectives of the review.

The review aims to ensure that each local councillor represents roughly the same number of people, so that the value of each person's vote is the same regardless of where they live within the local authority area. The review also seeks to reflect the interests and identities of local communities and maintain local ties where boundaries are easily identifiable.

BUGLE POSTBAG

From PCSO Peter Willson, Lutterworth Police

Like Walcote, there is a recognised speeding issue in Husbands Bosworth. In a recent half-hour traffic session monitoring traffic travelling eastbound towards Market Harborough at the Welford Road/Kilworth Road cross-roads we logged 122 vehicles, of which 15 exceeded our speed threshold. [The Bugle has withheld the registration numbers captured in the exercise]

We felt slightly heartened by the fact that there are a few considerate drivers who do adhere to the limit and slow down the strings of traffic, otherwise there would have been more incidences of speeding. We noted a particular risk in Husbands Bosworth, where the A5199 crosses the A4304 - it is a staggered junction. During the half hour of our monitoring exercise, there were two occasions when the north side of the A5199 had either slow moving traffic or a parked car on it and long vehicles were trying to cross the A4304 with their trailer blocking the carriageway. I will recommend that the speed camera vehicle attends at regular intervals to give drivers the impression that the spot is regularly monitored. We will re-visit in a few weeks.

Have you lost the bezel off your doorbell? A number of bell-push bezels have gone missing around the village in recent weeks. They're not the sort of thing that come off easily, so it would seem someone has removed them...

POLICE FILE

What is ANPR?

Automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) is a technology for automatically reading vehicle number plates. It is used by law enforcement agencies in the United Kingdom to help detect, deter and disrupt criminality including tackling organised crime groups and terrorists.

How does ANPR work?

As a vehicle passes an ANPR camera, its registration number is read and instantly checked against database records of vehicles of interest. Police officers can intercept and stop a vehicle, check it for evidence and, where necessary, make arrests.

Why is ANPR used?

Since the introduction in the 1980s for counter terrorism purposes in Northern Ireland ANPR systems have been shown to be extremely powerful tools in addressing crime at all levels including serious and organised. Many criminals rely on vehicles to commit crime and ANPR is designed, through speedy access to criminal intelligence databases, to make it difficult for the criminal fraternity to use vehicles for illegal purposes. Where are ANPR cameras placed?

In line with national policy, we do not disclose details of our fixed locations as this information is likely to be of benefit to offenders and if known could reduce the value of ANPR to policing.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH Leek and Bacon Quiche Ingredients

3 Leeks 25g butter

50g smoked bacon - chopped
75g cheddar cheese, grated
1 level teaspoon dry mustard
1/2 level teaspoon dried sage
Freshly ground pepper
2 eggs made up to 1/2 pint with milk

Ready made pastry case baked blind for 15 minutes at 200C

Method

Preheat oven 180C, Gas 4

Thinly slice leeks and wash well then drain. Melt the butter add bacon and leeks and sauté for 5 mins. Then remove from heat, stir in mustard, sage, pepper and cheese. Pour mixture into base of pastry case. Pour beaten egg and milk mixture over leeks. Bake for 25 minutes until set. Serve with mixed salad.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Collared Doves - Streptopelia decaocto First a lesson in ancient Greek. Streptopelia comes from streptos, 'collar,' and peleia, 'dove'. I'm sure lovers of words will decipher decaocto; as deca, 'ten,' and octo, 'eight', giving eighteen.

The story behind this specific name comes from Greek mythology. A maidservant complained to the gods that her mistress paid her a pittance of 18 pieces a year. So, the gods changed her into a dove whose coo-coo-cooing would haunt the mistress. Most of us have seen collared doves in our gardens, particularly if there's some bread



or grain on offer. Males and females are similar in appearance (monomorphic), mostly grey-buff-pinkish, which is a little darker above than below, with a black collar edged with white around the nape of their necks.

The picture shows a nest in a local garage. They usually nest in trees, but are happy to use manmade sites such as satellite dishes, ledges or guttering. Indeed, they have a strong preference for living close to humans.

The eggs take a little over two weeks to hatch, with the female incubating them during the day and the male overnight. After a further sixteen days or so, the youngsters fledge. There are stories of parents encouraging reluctant fledglings to leave by gradually dismantling the nest one twig at a time. Depending on the food supply, they frequently raise three to four broods a year.

They first appeared in England in the 1950s and, though they don't migrate, they are dispersive (like to spread), and now they can be found all across the UK. Their numbers have declined from their peak of a million breeding pairs in 2009. But they are still one of the top garden birds, and assuredly worthy of some grain and small pieces of bread, which won't choke the chicks.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Spot the changes on the High Street! To orientate ourselves the cameraman of old set up his instrument where the pedestrian crossing is sited today.

At this time, the cottage with the 'eye-brow' dormer window was soon to be replaced by the much more substantial 10 High Street, although the 'entry' to the side remains today. The Cherry Tree looks fairly substantial itself in our picture, which was taken about 1908, but was also soon destined to be replaced by a modern 'of-the-era' 1930s pub. Stepped back from the roadside to accommodate a sizeable forecourt car park for his motorcar, the new pub catered for the burgeoning motoring drinker.

The new Cherry Tree was in turn uncerimoniously swept aside in 2000, despite a forelorn attempt in the late 1980s to bolster flagging custom by serving Double Diamond and Watney's Red Barrel beers and employing a bevy of topless barmaids. Today, all trace of the pub has gone and the view from this spot opens up to reveal the entrance to Cherry Tree Close.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Annual Open Meeting held on Tuesday, April 4th 2017. [The meeting was conducted informally and un-minuted.]

Full Council and two members of the public were present.

The Chairman opened the meeting to general discussion.

Points Discussed

- ■Concerns were raised about bushes overhanging the tennis courts and shading the playing surface causing the growth of moss. The bushes in question were not the responsibilty of the parish and the matter should be raised directly with the farm tenant.
- ■Discussion took place regarding Council's offer to coordinate a volunteer programme to help maintain the canal towpath. Clerk informed the meeting that there had been little response from Canal and Rivers Trust despite repeated requests and even a site visit by a CRT officer. Clerk to follow this up again.
- ■Traffic and speeding issues were discussed. Council had heard that the County Council had received funding from central government to install Average Speed Cameras and the A4304 had been identified as having a significant speeding problem. Initially Walcote would have cameras installed but it was likely that further cameras would be installed in the other villages along the road in a roll-out programme.
- ■The meeting noted that road markings especially along Welford Road were unclear due to the action of the road-sweeper from the quarry. No response had been received in the past. Clerk to report this to Highways again.
- ■Discussion took place concerning the site works on the Davidsons' development on Welford Road. Rumours had come back to Council that further development adjacent to the site was being considered and concerns were voiced that the doctors' surgery element seemed to have been sidelined. Clerk was asked to seek assurances from Davidsons and set up a contact with the company.
- ■Concerns were raised about the timing of work to be undertaken, in the birds' nesting season, to the playing field trees behind properties on Welford Road. Clerk informed the meeting that work necessary for safety reasons could be carried out at any time but expected that only one tree, which was to be felled, would need to be dealt with immediately. The other trees would entail less work and would be dealt with by the tree surgeon as soon as possible.
- ■Clerk was asked to arrange for a sign to be made and installed on the play area car park barrier. This would state that the barrier would be closed at specified times and include a contact number.
- ■Clerk was asked to arrange for the play area car park area to be re-graded, as a temporary measure, to level the uneven surface.
- ■The roundabout in the play area needs lifting and the bearings cleaned out. Clerk was asked to arrange for this to be done.
- ■Council discussed the need for a part-time clerk/secretary to help to coordinate the Neighbourhood Plan project and to assist the Clerk with general duties. Initially the hours would be 5 hours per week. The post would be advertised.
- ■It was suggested that the Clerk's email contact details be changed to make a changeover of duties easier to administer.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be the Annual General Meeting on Tuesday, May 2^{nd} . at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
