HEALTHY SIGNS FOR NEW SURGERY

It looks as if the new doctors' surgery, within the new development off Welford Road is back on track. As noted previously in the *Bugle*, concerns had been raised locally that the surgery element of the development seemed to have been sidelined by the contractors who have been preparing the site for the 42 home project - there being no preparation of the part allocated for the surgery.

However, recent communication between the Parish Council and Davidsons, the developer, has confirmed that transactions with the Harborough Medical Practice have now been completed and Field construction of the new surgery is expected to get underway shortly. The Practice has confirmed that the build period will be 28 weeks, so it is hoped that the new



surgery will be open in early January 2018. The new surgery will have five consulting rooms, three treatment rooms and will continue to provide pharmacy and dispensing facilities. The site will boast twenty four parking spaces.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING

The Husbands Bosworth Neighbourhood Plan process is well under way. The completed Plan will be a legal document that will guide future social and economic growth in the village, as well as influence developments in our built and natural environment.

An Advisory Committee has been set up and a consultant and part-time clerk employed by the Parish Council to lead this venture (grants have been obtained to cover these costs) *Search "Neighbourhood Plans" and the "neighbourhood planning govuk" site for more information about the process.*

An essential element is public consultation and to this end there will be an Open Event on Sunday, July 16th in the Village Hall, 12.00pm to 4.30pm. Here there will be an opportunity to share your views and ideas and see if you would like to be involved or join any of the 'theme groups' that will be set up in the next stage of the process.

The Plan looks toward protecting the community into the next generation so, to give the children and the younger families a sense of ownership and involvement, the school was invited to design a logo for the Plan, bringing forward some excellent artwork and ideas. Thank you to the children and staff for their efforts.

The Advisory Committee meets regularly - dates and agendas are posted on the Parish notice board on The Green. These are not public meetings but the public is invited to attend and there is always a slot during the meeting when you can air your views.

From Patricia Hobson, Parish Councillor, Superfast Broadband Lead

Amanda Parker has my sympathy regarding the lack of opportunity to upgrade a broadband contract to superfast speed. Many of us will know how frustrating this can be.

The Superfast Broadband project launched in 2013 with funds from the EU, the Government and District Councils, was always seen as a long-term project. So far, superfast has been made available to over 73,000 properties in the county. By September 2018, another 11,000 should benefit, bringing the total to 97% of properties in the county. We were fortunate to receive our new connections relatively early in the project and many villagers (who were able to)took up the available upgrades, despite the additional contract costs.

The difficulty was always going to be the more difficult to reach properties and it has recently been announced that a £5 million plan is set to roll out to try to achieve this. Visit the superfastleicestershire.org.uk website for information on the progress of the scheme and future plans, though it's often not right up-to-date. There is also the opportunity to enter your phone number to get individual information on progress, and there is an interactive map of the county's progress and a Q & A section. It would also be worth villagers from outlying properties checking to see if they qualify for the Better Broadband Subsidy Scheme.

Last month we reported on what seems to be an escalating problem with vehicles travelling the wrong way in the village's one-way system. We asked readers to let us know about incidents so that we could assess the problem. A number of you have contacted us with reports of incidents. Villagers Carole Lister and Samantha Bell also sent in these pictures to reinforce the issue.

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH

A simple summer starter or light lunch served with salad. These fish cakes are light and fragrant.

Thai Style Fish Cakes (Makes 6)

150g raw prawns, chopped
150g raw white fish, chopped
10g fresh ginger, finely chopped
2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
1/4 red chilli finely chopped
1/4 stalk of lemon grass, finely chopped
2 spring onions, finely chopped
10g fresh coriander, finely chopped
5ml soy sauce
Juice of ½ lime
Zest of ½ lime
Salt and freshly ground pepper
Sunflower oil for frying
To Serve: Sweet chilli sauce and remaining

Place all ingredients into a tall blending pot and blend until smooth. Mould the mixture into 6 small patties. Heat a small amount of oil in a frying pan and shallow fry the patties for 3 - 4 minutes on each side. Remove from the pan and drain off excess oil on kitchen paper. Serve with wedges of lime and sweet chilli sauce.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

The European rabbit - Oryctolagus cuniculus

We are surrounded by rabbits. Head out of the village at dawn or dusk and you will see them scampering into the undergrowth. Zoologists call animals that are active at these times 'crepuscular.'

They evolved in Spain and, for a long

time, academics argued over who introduced them to Britain; the Romans or the Normans. Recently, however, archaeologists unearthed some rabbit bones alongside a Roman cooking pot; placing their arrival about two millennia ago.

By the 1950s, the UK population was roughly 100 million. But in 1952, myxomatosis was illegally introduced to France from where it swept across the continent; reaching Britain a year later. Initially, the virus inflicted a 95% mortality rate, but since then there's been a battle between the virus's capacity to mutate and the rabbits' evolving immune system. At present, rabbits are in the ascendant, with a population of 60 million in the British Isles; that's roughly one for each and every one of us. However, there is a dark cloud on the horizon in the form of Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease (RVHD-2). This is a new strain of virus, which could become as devastating as the myxomatosis epidemic. And we shouldn't forget the impact it will have on their predators: foxes, stoats, weasels, buzzards, etc. While this is distressing to devotees of 'Watership Down', unsurprisingly farmers will hold a different opinion...

Undoubtedly, rabbits' renowned reproductive capacity will enable their numbers to bounce back. A doe reaches sexual maturity within a month of being born. After mating, gestation takes around 31 days and she can be re-impregnated within hours of giving birth. With litters ranging from two to twelve kits, unless checked by predation or disease, their numbers grow exponentially. Twenty-four rabbits released in Australia became 600 million in less than a century!

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

The school children have recently been doing a project on local heritage and the history of village buildings, and have been seeking information about various buildings.

Although The Old House on Honeypot Lane proudly boasts its antiquity in the 1712 date marked in brickwork, it's

likely that the oldest

dwelling in the village is The Wheatsheaf on Bell Lane, that may pre-date this by three hundred years!

Although today the main part of The Wheatsheaf appears to be Elizabethan with its ornate wooden framing and infill, the oldest part by far is the middle part, to the right, which is based on a cruck timber frame, which probably dates back to Medieval times.

The crucks, or curved timbers, formed a sturdy and stable framework around which the lighter brick, cob or stud walling was constructed and inside The Wheatsheaf the crooks are still part of the structure of the building.

Full Council and 20 members of the public were present

Visitors' Questions

CHURCH NEWS

All Saints Parish Church, Methodist Chapel & St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church

FROM THE RECTORY

We are currently living in troubled times, with one disaster happening after another. We can see images on TV and hear reports that maybe affect us deeply, things that are truly gut-wrenching. If we lived near to them we might be able to do something to help, but maybe we are glad that they did not happen near to us. We have been asked a number of times, with each event, to spend a minute's quiet to reflect, remember and maybe to pray for those affected.

This week I was in a hospital waiting room with someone when the nurse popped her head in to say that the hospital was observing the minute's silence, the TV went quiet, and conversations stopped and there was something of a sense of joining together, in a very informal ad hoc way, in something that was bigger than us all.

With each of the horrific events that have happened recently we have used our mid-week service at All Saints to pray for those affected and have lit a candle for those caught up in these things. It's something we can do together, but we can also do alone. A simple tealight candle lit and burning for a minute of two serves as a reminder to God and to us of the people who need help. Sometimes when we can't find the words to say as a prayer, the action of lighting a candle fits our purpose - God knows our intention even when we find no words to say.

Let us lay these prayers before him that people may find the help they need and for our nation's protection.
