With over £5,200 taken on the gate, indicating more than 1,300 paying 'guests', it's likely that with classic cars, stallholders, exhibitors and those who came for the evening there were over 2,000 visitors during the event.

This year the organisers have been able to donate over £2,000 to the event's 'headline' charities and make contributions to a dozen

## SPEED LIMITER

**L**eicestershire Highways have applied for a Temporary Traffic Restriction Order to install a temporary 40 mph speed limit on the A5199 Welford Road approach to the village, as a safety measure, whilst work on the adjacent Davidsons housing development is taking place.

The temporary restricted 40mph zone will commence approximately 10 metres south of the entrance to the parish allotments and close at the existing 30 mph restricted markers.

It is anticipated that the Order will come into force on July 31<sup>st</sup> 2017 and will remain in place for a maximum period of 18 months.

## POLICE FILE

Lutterworth Police are able to report that there have only been a few crimes of public interest in Husbands Bosworth in the last month. These include a house burglary, a theft of a JCB and a number of thefts of plants from gardens.

In the warmer weather please ensure that you always lock and secure doors and windows, even if you are only nipping out for a few moments. Don't leave ladders loose, these can be used to gain access to upper floor windows and be mindful of anything in your garden that could be used to stand on to reach lower floor windows. Lock rear and side gates and ask your neighbours to keep an eye on your property when you are away. Remember also to arrange for your mail to be taken in if you have a glass porch or front doors. Cancel milk and newspaper deliveries.

This is the time of year when thieves may target gardens where plants and garden furniture are often targeted. If you have something on the front of your property that is of high value or sentimental to you, it may be worth having a look to see if there is a way of securing it. Some residents have secured hanging baskets with a discreet padlock and chain.

# BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

## A TASTE OF BOSWORTH

### Spicy Burgers

These spicy burgers make a delicious alternative choice to the typical hamburger and are ideal for the BBQ. *The tikka paste can be substituted with Thai curry paste.*

### Ingredients

450g lean minced beef  
2 spring onions, finely chopped  
3 tablespoons freshly chopped coriander  
5 tablespoons tikka masala curry paste  
1 medium onion, chopped  
1 tablespoon sunflower oil

### To Serve

Raita, warm mini naan bread, mango chutney

### Method

Heat oil in heavy-based pan, add onion and cook slowly until soft. Add curry paste and fry for 30 to 45 seconds. Remove from heat and allow to cool. In a large bowl combine cooled cooked onions with remaining ingredients.

With wet hands shape meat into rounds for the burgers, making sure they are equal size. Flatten slightly and grill steadily until cooked through and the juices run clear. Serve in the naan with raita and mango chutney.

If making the Thai alternative serve with mini pitta breads, coriander, plain yogurt and sweet chilli sauce. *Jackie Kerr*

## FOXTON STEAM

Meanwhile The BoilerHouse Museum on the site of the Victorian Boat Lift is featuring a new display for the summer, highlighting the role of women on the canals, especially the story of the 'Idle Women' who were recruited during World War II to work the boats whilst the men were away fighting.

## WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

### Ladybird - *Coccinella septempunctata*

*Coccinella septempunctata* derives from the Latin 'scarlet seven-spots'.

There is a story from the Middle Ages that tells of farmers praying to the Virgin Mary when their crops suffered a severe infestation of insect pests. When they were saved by swarms of little red beetles, they named them Our Lady's bird.

Across the Christian world, they are frequently linked to religious themes. In Germany, for instance, their name 'Marienkäfer' translates to Marybeetle. They are also associated with good fortune in such diverse locations as Italy, Turkey, America and China. As emblems of health and safety, they are popular motifs on infants' clothing.

Ladybirds live a three-stage life; egg, larva then beetle. Females choose a spot close to a food source to lay their eggs, which hatch about four days later. As soon as they emerge, the larvae begin a life obsessed with eating; starting with the remains of their eggshell and any unhatched eggs in their vicinity.

Like the ugly duckling, the larvae are not the most beautiful creatures; resembling miniature alligators, with black scaly skin. They devour aphids by injecting them with digestive juices, then ingesting the resultant soup! As they grow and mature they moult until, on the fourth and final time, they pupate and metamorphose into an adult.

The adults' bright colours, that we find attractive, are a warning to predators of their foul-tasting nature; what biologists term - aposematic. They also exude a vile yellow fluid from their knees when attacked. Like the larvae, the adults feed voraciously. Indeed, the females will continue eating during sex! In total, they consume around 5,000 aphids over their yearlong lifespan.

As the year draws to a close, they seek out a sheltered spot to overwinter, emerging from their hibernation around April the following year.

## BYGONE BOSWORTH

*Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection*

From records held in the Archive, and local newspaper reports, it appears that the earliest date recorded for what was initially called the Flower Show in Husbands Bosworth was 1866. By 1872 it was a 'Flower and Horticultural Show' with judges drawn from the senior gardeners of the many grand houses in the surrounding area. In 1873 it incorporated a sports day for all ages, for which all the competitors must be 'native born'! The show must have been a success in previous years for the Minutes of the Society indicate that it was to be advertised in the *Leicester Advertiser*, the *Market Harboro' Advertiser*, the *Northampton Herald* and the *Rugby Gazette*.

It was held in 1872 in the 'beautiful park adjoining the Hall' by kind permission of Mr. F. F. Turville Esq. Hundreds of inhabitants from surrounding villages attended, 150 bills were printed and 1000 tickets. Bands were hired to play until '10½ o'clock', with dancing commencing at 5 o'clock and continuing until nine-thirty, when a 'few select airs' were to be played until the grounds were cleared. Tenders were to be invited from Leicestershire Rifle Volunteer Band, the Rugby Steam Shed Brass Band, Wigston Brass Band and the Cockrill Band, Rugby. Tenders were also invited for refreshment booths from village publicans - Mr. Monk tendered 4 guineas for the sale of 'ale and spirituous liquors' and Mr. Blackwell 1 guinea for the sale of teas and wines. These were accommodated in tents measuring 28 yards by 14 yards. In 1873 the Secretary was requested to make enquiries concerning a special train to be run from Northampton!

In April 1876 it was decided that the Society, henceforth, be styled Husbands Bosworth & Theddingworth Floral and Horticultural Society and in the same year the class for nurserymen and gardeners was abandoned - were they scooping all the prizes? Later, perhaps as the result of a neighbourly rift, the Society dropped Theddingworth and aligned themselves to Hothorpe as the snappily named Hothorpe and Husbands Bosworth Floral and Horticultural Society, with shows held at Hothorpe Hall grounds and Bosworth Hall in alternating years.

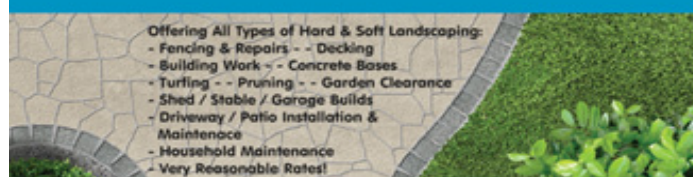

### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

The Husband Bosworth Neighbourhood Plan process continues to gather momentum. A significant element of getting the Plan accepted is the engagement of the residents. To this end an Open Event was held on Sunday, July 16<sup>th</sup> in the Village Hall. The turn-out was disappointing. Nevertheless, information was gleaned as to what some residents would like to see included in the Plan.

The school provided a splendid display of work that pupils had researched on the history of their own homes and art-work for the Plan document. It was interesting, informative and relevant to the event and we thank the staff and pupils for their efforts. Opportunities for further engagement will be in the form of a questionnaire that will be delivered to all households and the setting up of Theme Groups. Altogether six Groups are planned and we are seeking the assistance of residents who have an interest in any of the following:

- Development & Planning
- Services & Facilities
- Open Space & the Environment
- Business & Employment
- Traffic & Transport
- Landscape, Character & Heritage

Each Group will meet to draw up policies to be included in the Plan.

The next Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Committee meeting will discuss the drawing up of the questionnaire and embark on the process of setting up the Theme Groups. The date and agenda will be posted on the Parish Council noticeboard on The Green. These are not public meetings but residents are invited to observe and there is always a slot on the agenda where you can share your views on the way forward.

At the recent meeting of the Bosworth Quarry Liaison Group, members heard concerns about road cleaning on Welford Road. It was noted that improvements had recently been made to the wheel-washing arrangements to ensure that all vehicles leaving the site would pass over the wheel-wash. The meeting also noted soiling problems in the cemetery lay-by, due to lorries parking up after leaving the quarry. The Quarry manager agreed to arrange for the roadsweeper to routinely sweep the lay-by and to ask drivers to refrain from parking there. The condition of the Butt Lane crossing was also raised and assurances were made that crossing cleaning would be monitored, although it was noted that haul-truck traffic from the Bosworth Estate site was suspended for the next 18 months whilst aggregate residues were cleared from the Welford Road site.

The problem of silted drains was brought to the attention of the meeting. Whilst Tarmac agreed to carry out drain cleaning and flushing, they would need permission from Leicestershire Highways. The County Council representative agreed to put the matter before Highways.
