SLOW TRACKING

Davidsons, the developers of the new homes site to the south of the village, have recently installed temporary 40mph speed restrictions on Welford Road.

The restrictions, installed for safety reasons whilst work on the site and the adjacent doctors' surgery site continues, reminds us that, several years ago, the Parish Council pressed for permanent speed reduction measures, including reduced speed limits, along this stretch of the road as part of the planning consent for the development. That request was casually brushed aside at the time by Leicestershire Highways Authority as unnecessary. The Parish Council has also been pushing repeatedly, but unsuccessfully, for the reinstatements of the road markings here, which have been eroded by quarry traffic and road-sweeping.

For the past 6½ years the Parish Council has monitored traffic movements for this entry to the village. So it will be interesting to compare traffic speeds, whilst the temporary restrictions are in place, with previous data from the same stretch of road when the limit was 60mph.

As part of the safety measures and to allow the doctors' surgery element of the development to be completed early, Davidsons are also installing a temporary access for construction traffic onto the site, which will be opposite the Welford Road cemetery. *Editor's Note: See SID readings (p.6) for Welford Road in-bound, where speeds of over 60mph have recently been recorded in the 30mph zone.*

LAND ROVER PARTS

Many mourned the passing of the Land Rover Defender when Jaguar-Land Rover ceased production of the model back in January 2016. However, the criminal element of society have welcomed the lucrative opportunity presented by this momentous occasion by turning their attention to the theft of Defenders and their parts. Nationally the theft of Defenders, many of which are simply driven off to remote country sites and stripped of valuable parts, has reached serious levels and locally police have seen a spate of thefts in recent months. Lutterworth Police remind our readers to take note of any suspicious activity relating to Land Rover Defenders in particular, and report this immediately on 999 if they suspect a crime is in progress. Owners are reminded to remove keys and immobilise their vehicles even when leaving them unattended for short periods of time, such as opening or closing roadside gates or parking up briefly in farmyards. BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH

Gratin of Tiger Prawns with Chilli & Cheese

A lovely lunch dish with a Mexican style to it - serve with salad and nice crusty white bread. *Serves 4*

Ingredients

400g frozen tiger prawns

- 2 large red onions peeled and thinly sliced
- 2 cloves garlic peeled and crushed
- 3 red chillies deseeded and finely chopped
- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 400ml double cream

150g fontina cheese or gruyere - grated

Juice 2 limes

Few drops Tabasco

Salt and freshly milled black pepper

4 x individual gratin dishes, lightly buttered

Method

Defrost the prawns and place in bowl with the lime juice and tabasco. Mix well and leave to marinate for 15 mins. Preheat oven to 200°c/Gas 6. Heat oil in frying pan and lightly cook onion for 3-4 mins before adding garlic and chillies. Continue to cook for another 3-4 mins. Divide onion mixture between 4 dishes, then drain prawns and divide these equally too. Season well. Pour cream over each dish of prawns split equally then top with grated cheese. Put dishes on baking sheet and bake in oven for 10-15 mins until prawns turn pink and cheese is bubbling.

WELFORD ACTION GROUP NEWS

Welford Action Group are promoting speed awareness in Welford by providing villagers with speed limit reminder stickers for their wheelie bins. It is hoped that these reminders will help reduce speeds, as many villagers feel the existing limits are regularly exceeded. Welford's speed indicator recently recorded a speed of 69mph in the 30mph limit.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Common Knapweed - Centaurea nigra

The Latin Centaurea is derived from the Greek 'kentauros' for centaur. In particular, the mythical Chiron, the offspring of the titan Cronus and the nymph Philyra. Chiron was known as "wisest and most just of all the centaurs," and the originator of botany and the medicinal use of herbs.

With such a pedigree, it's no surprise that herbalists propose a host of uses for knapweed; including the treatment of wounds, loss of appetite and constipation. The renowned herbalist Nicholas Culpeper, advocates its use in cases of sore throats and nose bleeds. A medieval name for the plant was 'Matte Felon,' which comes from its use as a remedy for felons. 'Felon' being an archaic word for an infected fingertip.



For the bite of an adder, a concoction of knapweed, birthwort and field scabious is recommended. Though personally, I'd visit A&E!

Two of its other names are Black Knapweed or Hardheads, and although it resembles a thistle it's more closely related to the cornflower. Around Husbands Bosworth, it can be found growing in the Millennium Wood, in field margins and roadside verges.

For a simple weed, it forms a surprising web of connections to the local fauna. Its flowering season runs from June until September, which is good news for the butterflies, beetles and bees that enjoy its nectar and pollen. In autumn, its seeds provide food for a variety of small birds. Also, late in the year, most knapweed kernels play host to a tiny fruit fly grub, which are avidly sought out by goldfinches.

Finally, folklore advises eligible young women who are looking for Prince Charming to wear a knapweed bud - when it blooms she'll know her true love is close by...


BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

On the Historical Society's stand at the Bosworth Festival at the end of June we were shown a copy of this photograph by a relative of someone who used to own the Fernie Lodge Hotel in the 1960s. We already have the same picture in the Society's Archive Collection, which depicts an old Stage Coach that used to stand as a feature, with several other horse-drawn carriages, amongst the flower beds in front of the hotel. No doubt someone felt that the twee image portrayed, would enhance the frontage of the hotel for visitors, notwithstanding the fact that the Fernie was originally a hunting lodge and was never likely to have been a coaching inn!

A closer look at the original photograph shows that the coach was the 'Peveril of the Peak'- an important mail coach line of the 1830s, which ran an express service between London and Edinburgh.

'The public are respectfully informed that this new superior safety coach, called THE PEVERIL OF THE PEAK, has commenced running from BLOSSOM INN, Cheapside, every evening at Eight O' Clock; through



It is interesting to note that the journey would likely have taken the line of the present A6 - nowhere near Husbands Bosworth or the Fernie! It is also interesting that this 'advertising' sheet, published in 1831, miss-places Derby between Bedford and Leicester... Only six coachmen and one guard were employed on the whole journey, with no overnight stops - a considerable saving that the promoters claimed saved one-third off previous fares. Quite what condition the passengers were in on arrival at their destination, however, after over 400 bone-shaking miles, is anyone's guess, given the condition of the roads at that time.

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, August 1st 2017.

Three Parish Councillors, one member of the public and County Councillor Blake Pain were present. Apologies were received from Bill Fletcher, James Shelley and Assistant Clerk, Claire Sheriff. Mr. Forman took the Chair.

Visitors' Questions

- ■Concerns were raised about the condition of parts of the skatepark equipment. Clerk informed the meeting that a RoSPA report was due and any necessary safety or repair work would be highlighted and carried out following this.
- ■Blake Pain, County Councillor and County Lead on Highways matters introduced himself to the meeting. Council took the opportunity to voice their concerns about a number of local highways issues, new developments and county funding.

Minutes of the previous Meeting

■Minutes were read and approved.

Matters arising from the Minutes

- ■No action had been taken on a maintenance contract for the pavilion shutters. Mr. Fletcher would follow this up when he is able.

Cemetery

- ■Council noted better mowing in the cemetery following talks with the contractor.
- ■A new memorial bench, in memory of villager, Stan McGinnes, had been installed adjacent to the Chapel of Rest.
- ■The replacement Martin family memorial bench would be re-sited in a more prominent position at the head of the gravel pathway.

Playing Field

- ■A quotation for replacement of the 'Rollin' Ramp' in the skatepark had been approved.
- ■A local group had expressed interest in forming a cricket club.

Allotments

(Council had met at the allotments prior to the meeting.)

- ■Mr Forman had reinstated the noticeboard.
- ■Council noted several overgrown plots and Clerk was asked to contact the tenants and remind them of their obligations to keep their plots tidy and weed-free.
- ■Clerk was asked to arrange for the pathways and an unlet plot to be strimmed.

Traffic Issues

■It was noted that Green Lane was designated as a continuation of Dag Lane footpath on recent correspondence. Clerk was asked to contact Highways to ascertain the true status of the road.

- ■Concerns were raised about the damaged road surface at the Walton Lane turn. Clerk to contact Highways.
- ■Members agreed to fund the setting up of a parish website.

HUSBANDS BOSWORTH NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Acceptance of our Neighbourhood Plan as a legal document, and an integral part of HDC's Planning Strategy, requires us to demonstrate a commitment to community consultation and engagement. The Open Event in July was an opportunity for villagers to get directly involved, and highlighted a number of areas for the Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Committee to consider.

These included the need cater adequately for the future expansion and sustainability of the village with a better bus service, improved recreational and social facilities and better broadband provision. Traffic-related issues attracted the most responses, with issues raised including the need for more traffic-calming measures, better parking provision and the need for road-sign cleaning and highway maintenance

Comments relating to the environment noted the importance of maintaining important views, ensuring continued access to the countryside and restricting development. Areas where residents favoured or opposed development were highlighted in a simple map-based exercise.

In terms of design, people highlighted the need for mixed housing; for smaller homes to enable younger people to get established and bungalows to allow older people to down-size. The need fordevelopment to be of character and in keeping with the village was also noted.

The Advisory Committee will shortly be compiling a questionnaire, to be delivered to every household in the parish, which will allow everyone to have their say on how they would like the community to develop over the next 20 years. There will be more information in the October issue of the Bugle.

The next meeting of the Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Committee will be on Monday, September 4th at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.
