

onstruction work on the new GP surgery, off Welford Road, has dramatically changed the landscape and given local residents an insight into the modern medical facilities that they will be able to access

very shortly.

The spacious 400sqm building will have five GP consulting rooms, three treatment rooms, a dispensary and space for non-clinical staff. There will be 24 car parking spaces and a cycle rack. The exact date for the completion of the works and the opening of the new surgery has yet to be confirmed, but it is hoped that will be by mid January at the latest. All patients of the Kilworth Road surgery will automatically be registered at the new location. The Practice is in the process of placing orders for medical equipment and furniture for patients. If you do spot anything suspicious of this nature, police advice is not to put yourself in danger, but report the activity as soon as it is safe to do so.



BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH Peach and Raisin Pudding

A tasty alternative to the traditional bread and butter pudding. Very easy to make and delicious served with Greek yoghurt. Serves 4 - 6.

Ingredients

1 x shop-bought raisin loaf 2 eggs, beaten ¹/4 pint milk 400g sliced peaches in natural juice, drained 3 tablespoons light brown sugar

- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- A little icing sugar

Oval pie dish greased with butter

Method

Preheat oven 200°C, Gas Mark 6. Slice loaf into 8 slices (if not already sliced). Mix together the beaten egg and milk and dip the slices into the mixture.

Arrange the slices in an oval pie dish, so they overlap. Arrange the peach slices on top tucking in between the bread crusts. Pour the remaining egg mixture over the peaches and bread and sprinkle over the brown sugar and cinnamon. Bake for 15 minutes or until the egg has set and the top is browned. Dust with icing sugar and serve.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Great spotted woodpecker - *Dendrocopos major*

There are three species of woodpecker resident in the UK: green, great and lesser spotted. Green woodpeckers, unsurprisingly, are predominantly green, with a red skullcap. Great and lesser spotted woodpeckers have bold black and white plumage with red highlights.

When identifying the Great and lesser varieties, size matters. The Great spotted woodpecker is about the size of a blackbird, whereas the Lesser is much smaller, roughly the size of a sparrow. Also, the



lesser is a far rarer bird, with around one thousand breeding pairs, compared to 140,000 pairs of greats.

Great spotted woodpeckers are attractive birds; adult males have a splash of red on the nape of their necks, juveniles sport a jaunty red beret and all have red under-tail feathers. In terms of diet, everything is on the menu, including invertebrates, crustaceans, molluscs, carrion, fat-rich items such as nuts and suet, vegetable foods including conifer seeds, berries and tree sap. And, (here's their dark side!) the eggs and chicks of small birds.

A nesting pair excavate a hole and hollow out a bowl-shaped depression into which the female lays their clutch of eggs. Both parents share parenting duties, though I'm not sure if the males are being selfish or selfless, when they insist on spending the nights sitting on the eggs.

They are difficult birds to spot. In woodland they will hide behind a tree to avoid being seen. I once heard that when you hear woodpecker drumming you can draw it to your vicinity by rapidly banging a pebble against a tree trunk. However, for some reason, it never works for me. Which means either I'm not doing it right, or there's another naturalist around the corner, who is similarly wondering what's wrong with their tree tapping technique!

This will ensure that the majority of residents are in agreement with the Plan.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

The Town & Country Planning Act 1947 was quickly cobbled together, soon after the end of the Second World War. It added a degree of protection to any heritage assets that had been fortunate to survive and introduced an element of control in the rebuilding programme. Within the Act, the National Heritage List was set up, to specifically reinforce the protection of buildings of special character or worthy heritage.

The wheels of officialdom, where listing was concerned at any rate seem to have turned slowly for Husbands Bosworth, however but notable buildings in our parish were finally assessed and listed, 30 years ago, in March 1987.

We have 28 listed buildings or structures in Husbands Bosworth parish. Unsurprisingly All Saints Church and St. Mary's Church are listed with the enhanced status of Grade II*, as is Bosworth Hall. Perhaps a little more surprising is the cast iron mile post on Leicester Road (Welford 3 miles Leicester 13 miles) and the Grand Junction Canal Company marker (Leicester 23 miles) beside the canal towpath a couple of hundred

yards north-east of Honeypot Bridge (Br. 46), which are awarded Grade II status.

Our picture shows one of our Listed Buildings - Wheatsheaf House - Grade II listed, on Bell Lane. Formerly an inn, the Wheatsheaf is now a domestic dwelling, and likely to be the oldest house in the village, dating in part to medieval times. At that time the core of the village would have been tightly clustered around the church, and the Wheatsheaf would probably have been an isolated farmhouse.

As the first war-time Christmas loomed it was evident that neither 'Tommy', nor 'Fritz' were likely to celebrate the festivities back in their homelands. The Great War was stagnating, and in many areas the front lines of the opposing armies were only a few yards apart. In this close atmosphere soldiers of both sides were able to converse with each other. In a number of pockets along the Front they actually left their trenches and fraternised with the 'enemy', exchanging pleasantries and gifts, and even playing football matches!

Dr. Sutton's talk looks at the background to these impromptu truces, and the reaction of the higher commands.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday, October 3rd 2017.

Four Council members and 2 members of the public present. Apologies received from James Shelley. Visitors' Questions

■Queries were raised about the S106 contribution, which provided funding for the new doctors' surgery. Concerns were voiced about the loss of the community benefit if any future reversion of the site should occur. Chairman agreed to take the matter up with Davidsons.

In light of the planning approval granted for the development opposite the Davidsons' site, it was agreed to consult with Highways with a view to retaining the temporary access that has been created. Minutes of last meeting were read and approved

Matters Arising

Council noted that the white line renewal had recently been carried out throughout the village and on Welford Road.

No response had been received regarding Clerk's query to Highways and the Rights of Way Officer relating to the status of Green Lane.

Clerk reported no response from Highways regarding the overgrown condition of the footway towards Welford or the loss of half the village entrance sign on Kilworth Road.

Neighbourhood Plan

Clerk to the Neighbourhood Plan Committee gave a report outlining progress so far on the project. The Advisory Committee were keen to promote participation, and a flyer would be produced and circulated to encourage villagers to get more involved. Stakeholder responses were still being received. Cemeterv

■One more memorial bench, the Martin family bench, was awaiting installation.

Clerk was asked to arrange a meeting with a local handyman to assess the work needed to restore the Chapel of Rest north door and open up the Verger's refuge at the rear.

Playing Field & Play Area

Three broken windows were noted at the Sports Pavilion. Chairman agreed to arrange replacement.

Discussions took place regarding the possible conversion of the pavilion garage into a Parish Office. Allotments

Council noted a spate of break-ins at the allotments site. Clerk was asked to notify all allotment holders and urge them to take steps to improve security.

Clerk informed Council that the roadside gate post was broken. LCC was notified and would replace it in due course.

Traffic Issues

Clerk agreed to look into sourcing some speed awareness bin-stickers.

Correspondence

Chairman reported that Council had been approached by the owners of the former hairdressers shop with an offer to rent the vacant premises for community use. Chairman agreed to meet with the owners and assess the prospects for establishing a Parish Office.

Members briefly discussed the Draft Local Plan, which had recently been published.

Staffing Matters

■Mrs Sheriff had successfully completed her probationary period as Assistant Clerk.

Any Other Business

Clerk was asked to contact CRT again regarding the dumped tyres on the boat-horse path off Leicester Road.. Council agreed to arrange for the overhanging vegetation on the Kilworth Road footway to be cut back. Following a number of incidents where dogs have been seen on the Playing Field it was agreed to improve the signage at the village entrance to the field.

■Mr. Forman reported that a street light (10) on the High Street was not working.

Concerns were raised over who would be responsible for maintaining the amenity land on the Davidsons' site. Members assumed that a management agreement would be put in place, but would hope to see this issue clarified.

The next meeting will follow the Annual Precept meeting on Tuesday, November 21st, 2017, at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall. The Precept meeting starts at 7.00pm
