## **ROOF LIGHT**

**7** illagers will no doubt recall the sorry sight that unfolded three years ago in November 2014 when the north aisle roof of the parish church was stripped of lead the day before Remembrance Sunday - another victim in a spate of local lead thefts. Under a burden of similar incidents nationally at the time, the ecclesiastical insurers capped claims at £5,000, leaving local church members to raise the rest of the money needed for repairs.

The roof was duly restored after a momentous 18 months of fund-raising by church members and the generosity of local businesses, community groups, villagers and friends.

In some ways it was a shame the thieves stole the lead from the north aisle roof, which was generally sound, whereas the south aisle roof had been problematic for some time. Not only were we faced with replacing the lead that was stolen but also faced the task of replacing the lead on the sunny side! Recently All Saints Church Council have received permission from the Diocese for the work on the south aisle roof to commence. Additionally the Diocese have agreed, as they did eventually with the restoration of the north aisle, to replacement with stainless steel, which will not only reduce the chance of future theft, but will be much more stable and durable.

To launch fund-raising for the south aisle roof repairs, which will be in the region of £20,000, All Saints Church will be hosting a Concert of Christmas Music led by the Harmonics Community Choir, Wigston,



At a Superfast Broadband Stakeholder Meeting at County Hall earlier in October, I was informed that 90% of the Parish could now theoretically upgrade. Best to hurry up, though, before the new "bolt-on" fills up!

#### WELFORD ACTION GROUP

A problematic roadsign on the A14 has been causing WAG members concern recently. The sign incorporates a flap that, when deployed directs traffic, in the event of a closure of the A14, along the A5199 through Welford and Husbands Bosworth. The sign was permanently installed east of the A14/M6 junction as part of the Catthorpe junction improvements but has been retained and used since the works have finished, when closures have been necessary. WAG are concerned that the flap seems to have a mind of its own, perhaps due to high winds dislodging it, and drops down regularly, suggesting to oncoming traffic that the A14 is closed and potentially directing traffic unnecessarily through our villages...

## **BOSWORTH IN FOCUS**

#### A TASTE OF BOSWORTH Turkey and Chestnut Stir Fry

A quick and easy recipe using leftover turkey and trimmings. The chestnuts can be cooked quickly in the microwave - simply slit shells with a sharp knife then microwave six at a time on *HIGH* for 1 min. until tender. *Serves 4* 

#### Ingredients

 1 tablespoon sunflower oil

 1 onion, sliced

 175g Brussels sprouts, halved

 2 celery sticks, thinly sliced

 350g cooked turkey cut into strips

 100g cooked chestnuts, halved

 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

 5 tablespoons chicken stock or water

 Juice of 1 large orange

 1 tbsp chopped fresh sage or 1 tsp dried sage

 Sog boiled rice to serve)

 Method

 Heat oil in wok or large frying pan. Add

onion and sprouts and cook over a high heat for 5mins. until beginning to soften and brown. Add celery, turkey and chestnuts and stir fry for a further 3 mins. Add the Worcestershire sauce, stock or water, orange juice and sage and cook for a further 3 - 4 mins. until piping hot. Season to taste and serve with rice. Jackie Kerr

#### WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Common Ivy - Hedera helix

We've previously looked at holly. This festive season, it's the turn of ivy, another evergreen.

Two oddities of ivy are that it has evolved to flower late in the year and that it has two leaf forms; the palmate three or five-lobed leaves, which we all recognise and unlobed leaves found on the topmost flowering stems.

Ivy is so prevalent around our village, climbing walls and trees, that it often goes unnoticed. This is unfair as, in many ways, it's a good-news plant. Besides providing cover for insects, bats, birds and small mammals; various moth and butterfly larvae feed on its foliage. These include Small Dusty Waves which live exclusively on ivy and Angle Shades, which we've met before.



When mature specimens flower in autumn, they provide a welcome source of nectar and pollen for insects, wasps, bees, hoverflies, etc., looking to top up their winter reserves. Clusters of purple-black berries ripen in winter, and provide a high-fat, food resource for birds, woodpigeons, blackcaps, blackbirds, etc.

Of course, this a symbiotic relationship. Ivy benefits by being pollinated and having its seeds dispersed via the digestive tracts of the birds.

Though the berries are toxic to humans, they contain an organic compound called falcarinol which has been found to be beneficial in the treatment of some cancers.

It may come as a surprise to some, but English Heritage has learnt that ivy aids the preservation of old buildings by regulating the stonework's temperature.

Finally, Bacchus, the Roman god of wine is frequently shown wearing a wreath of ivy leaves. This led to the folklore belief that wearing such a wreath prevents one from getting drunk. If anyone cares to test this idea over the party season, can they let me know if it works? Provided they remember! *Mike Chanter*

Last month we featured The Wheatsheaf on Bell Lane, one of the village's listed buildings.

We naturally expect listed buildings to be, well... buildings, but as we noted last month, in our parish we have two mileposts that are listed. The picture here shows the listed Grand Junction Canal Company milepost that is to be found alongside the canal towpath a little way towards Theddingworth from Honeypot Bridge.

Until the canals were nationalised in 1948 canal building, administration and maintenance (and profits!) were funded from a complex toll system, which was calculated from tonnages carried and miles travelled. So, mileposts were erected at regular intervals along the canal to enable a reasonable calculation of distance and to reassure the boatmen that they weren't being diddled!

On many canals the mileposts, like roadsigns, were removed in 1940 when Britain was under threat of a German invasion - in the, perhaps, forelorn hope that enemy invaders would get lost without signs! All very '*Dad's Army'* to us today, but deadly serious at the time. Many mileposts were lost at this time - probably melted down to make tanks...

#### Report of the Parish Council Precept Meeting held on Tuesday, November 21st.

Present 4 Councillors, the Clerk and Assistant Clerk. Apologies received from Mrs Hobson. Business

## Report of the Parish Council Ordinary Meeting held on Tuesday, November 21<sup>st</sup> following the Precept Meeting.

#### Neighbourhood Plan

■Mr. Forman gave an update on the progress of the Neighbourhood Plan and informed Council that an Awards for All Grant had been received. The next step in the Plan process was the setting up of Theme Groups to formulate Plan policies in the main focus areas of development, community facilities and the environment.

#### Cemetery

Council agreed to review Burial Charges at the next meeting in February.

#### **Playing Field**

The Cricket Club was arranging to clear out the pavilion garage and dispose of the tractor and gang-mower.

Work to re-grade the Play Area car park as a temporary measure had been carried out. A more permanent solution would be sought once the new surgery had opened.

#### **Traffic Issues**

At the recent Quarry Liaison meeting the quarry manager agreed to clean the lay-by on Welford Road, where quarry lorries park up, as part of their regular road-sweeping programme. The quarry wheel-washer had been moved, so that all traffic leaving the site must now pass over the facility, in an effort to reduce road contamination.

#### Parish Council Website

The anticipated date for the Parish Council website to go 'live' was mid-December.

#### Any Other Business

The provision of a parish office was discussed. A lease was in the process of being drawn up and agreed with the owners of the former hairdresser's shop in Mowsley Road. Council is seeking legal clarification.

A contribution towards the cost of the forthcoming concert in aid of the parish church roof repair fund was agreed.

#### FROM THE RECTORY

'Christmas : Past, Present and Future' is the title for this year's Christmas Tree Festival at All Saints Church – December 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>. By the time you read this you may already have been to have a look round and see how imaginative people have been this time in interpreting our theme. There is a sense that Christmas is Christmas in every age. 
