BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH

Honey and Soy Salmon

A very simple supper dish, ideal for a week night - the salmon needs to be marinated for a minimum of 30 minutes. Perfect with boiled rice and baby sweet corn or mangetout.

Serves 4

Ingredients

4 x 170g salmon fillets - skinned 3 tablespoons sesame seeds

Marinade:

3 tablespoons sesame oil 5 tablespoons runny honey 3 tablespoons soy sauce

Preheat oven to 190°C, Gas Mark 5

Mix ingredients for the marinade together and place salmon in a shallow dish. Pour the marinade over the salmon and leave for a minimum of 30 mins, turning occasionally. Remove the salmon from the marinade and place on lightly oiled piece of foil in a roasting tin - bake in oven for 5 minutes. Meanwhile tip the marinade into a small saucepan and bring to the boil- simmer for 4-5 minutes. Add the sesame seeds.

Spoon the marinade over the salmon and return to the oven for 10 minutes.

Serve with boiled rice and vegetables.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Common Yew - Taxus Baccata

'Taxus Baccata' is Latin for 'yew bearing red berries', though the word 'taxus' may be connected to an ancient Greek word for a bow.

There are many specimens growing around the village, including those in the churchyards and the cemetery. It's often said that yews were planted in churchyards as they are poisonous to browsing animals and their wood was needed for bow staves. However, yews



held a spiritual significance for pre-Christians, who told dark stories of their roots becoming entangled with corpses. Subsequently, early Christians chose to build churches on these pagan sites. The other issue is that English yew is generally too twisted and knotted to be of use in weaponry. In fact, in the Middle Ages, most bow staves came from the continent. The ill-fated Richard III directed that every 'tun' of imported cargo had to be accompanied by ten bow staves.

Except for the Satin Beauty moth caterpillar, wildlife avoids the yews' poisonous foliage. But on the plus side, the dense mesh of needles and branches provides ideal nesting sites for small birds. As its seeds are poisonous, seed dispersal is problematic. The trees' solution is to cover the kernel with a bright red, non-toxic 'aril'. These tasty arils are eaten by small mammals and birds, who disperse the undamaged seeds in their waste.

All known plants play host to symbiotic bacteria and micro fungi. One of the yews' fungi contains paclitaxel, which is a source of the drug Taxol. Since the 1970s Taxol has been used in chemotherapy treatments to combat a variety of carcinomas. Although paclitaxel can now be synthesised, for many years it was extracted from plant material.

So, the Yew's historic journey has been from gruesome mythology to lifesaving medicine.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Family history researcher Sue Church from Nottingham originally came to Husbands Bosworth some years ago in search of links to her Teear family ancestors. Since then her exploration has taken her into other aspects of Bosworth history.

Sue has recently embarked on a project to transcribe the parish Burial Registers and in doing so has turned up a whole host of fascinating threads of social history in the pages of the registers.

There were some rather odd goings on with the death of seven of the children of one William Townsend, who all died under the age of 15 months. Certainly the record was suspicious enough for the scribe who made the entry in the register to note this fact in the margin.

Controversy also reared its head when Ann Darnell was buried in the churchyard in opposition to the Burial Board, by authority of Mr Joseph Whiteman, churchwarden. One can only wonder at the reason for her lack of favour, and Mr Whiteman's overruling of the Burial Board's wishes.

However, on April 23rd 1875 Job Wells, the village gravedigger, was buried - the registers noting that he died at work, oops...

As family history researchers will know, a simple reference in the registers can sometimes send you off in a

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, February 6th 2018.

Present: Four Parish Councillors and one member of the public Apologies were received from Bill Fletcher. Mr. Forman took the Chair

Visitors' Questions

- A member of the public sought an update of the action to seek to convene a meeting with the relevant bodies regarding the retention of the new access to the Marsh Drive development and the extended speed limits. Clerk agreed to follow this up.
- ■The overgrown and narrowed footway along the Leicester Road was brought to the attention of Council as a safety hazard to pedestrians. Clerk agreed to contact Highways.

Minutes

■Minutes of the meeting held on Tuesday, December 5th were approved and signed as correct. There were no matters arising.

Neighbourhood Plan

- ■Council agreed amendments to NP documentation and titling.
- ■Clerk advised Council of the Terms of Engagement under which the consultants, YourLocale, were employed.

Cemetery

■Council, as the Burial Board for the Welford Road cemetery, carried out a review of charges.

Playing Field and Pavilion

■Clerk informed Council that the pavilion window repair was now in hand. Quotes had been received for the replacement of the Half-Pipe in the Skatepark. After discussion it was agreed that the quote was beyond Council's budget at present and to repair rather than replace for the time being.

Allotments

- ■Council agreed to carry out a review of charges and conditions at the March meeting. **Traffic Issues**
- ■Concerns were raised about damage to grass verges on the approaches to the village, where bulbs were planted. Clerk agreed to arrange for signs to be made.
- ■It was agreed to wait until the new surgery was open before re-laying the Play Area carpark. Section 106 Developer Funding
- ■Clerk informed Council that no progress had been made but this would now be followed up.
- A BMX track was suggested as a suitable project. Other projects were sought.

Parish Website (www.husbandsbosworthpc.org.uk)

■Mrs Hobson outlined the progress of the parish council website, which was now 'live'. Work would be carried out when possible to add to the content of the site. Content was discussed. The site would not replace the existing husbandsbosworth.info site, which will continue as a community information site.

Any Other Business

- ■Clerk informed Council that the Scout HQ lease was now in the hands of the solicitors for conclusion.
- ■Concerns were raised about the residual grit outside the takeaway and Springfields.
- ■Mr Forman discussed an application that he has made to Canal & River Trust regarding an adoption scheme for a section of the canal towpath close to the village.


