BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH **Spicy Paneer Parcels**

These tasty snacks provide an interesting vegetarian starter to an Indian meal or a simple snack. Serve with Mango Chutney. Serves 2

Ingredients

1 tablespoon vegetable oil 1 teaspoon black mustard seeds 1 small onion, chopped 1 small red pepper, diced 1 red chilli, finely sliced (seeds removed if you don't like hot)

1 garlic clove, crushed 2 cm piece of root ginger, grated 1/4 teaspoon turmeric 85g frozen peas

100g cooked or tinned potatoes, diced 100g paneer, diced

1 teaspoon chopped coriander 3 fresh filo pastry sheets

25g melted butter

Method

Preheat oven to 200°C/Fan 180°C. Heat oil in a pan and cook mustard seeds over a medium heat for 1-2 mins until they start to pop. Stir in the onion, pepper, chilli, garlic and ginger, and fry for a further 3-4 mins until softened. Stir in turmeric and fry for further 1-2 mins. Add the peas, diced potatoes, paneer and chopped coriander and stir thoroughly to coat in the spice mixture. Remove the pan from the heat and season with salt and pepper.

Cut the filo pastry in half lengthways and brush the edges with some of the melted butter. Spoon a tablespoon of the spicy paneer mixture onto the bottom corner of each length of filo and fold the opposite corner over to meet the edge to make a triangle. Continue in this way until the length has been used up and is now a filled triangle parcel. Repeat for each ½ sheet to produce 6 parcels. Brush the parcels all over with melted butter and place on a baking sheet. Cook for 10-15 mins until golden and crisp. Serve straight away.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH Daddy Longlegs spiders-Pholcus phalangioides

Oh, what a tangled web we weave...

Arachne, a Greek shepherdess, was an extremely talented weaver. So, when the goddess Athena challenged her to a weaving contest, Arachne accepted. A big mistake, not because she lost, but because the Greek Gods were sore losers. When Arachne won, Athena condemned her and her offspring to forever live as spiders. Meanwhile, science tells a more prosaic



tale; notably, of a web trapped in amber 110 million years ago, and evidence that spiders have existed for 350 million years.

Over the aeons, spiders have developed numerous ways of using their silk to capture prey. The daddy longlegs' tactic is to weave a haphazard web of threads to entangle its victims; typically, high up in a corner. As its quarry struggles through the maze, the web owner casts additional restraining cords, then pounces and envelopes its meal in a silken cocoon. It's now that the hunters long legs prove their worth, by keeping its head and body out of range of its quarry's weapons. After it is immobilised, a venomous bite tenderises the unfortunate victim, prior to consumption.

Understandably, as they feed on midges, mosquitoes and nasties, such as the Australian black widow, in many locations, daddy longlegs are welcome house guests! It's said their venom is extremely powerful, but their fangs are too short to penetrate human skin. However, both these 'facts' are myths. Experimentation has shown that a daddy longlegs bite produces a mild burning sensation, which lasts for just a few seconds.

Lastly, crane flies are sometimes confused with daddy longlegs. The differences are that crane flies have wings and six legs, not eight. Of the world's 40,000 species of spiders, doubtless to the relief of arachnophobes, none have evolved wings... Yet!


THE KID'S CAFE

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, September 3rd 2019.

Present: Full Council and 1 member of the public.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Matters arising from the Minutes

- ■District Councillor Amanda Nunn had opened dialogue with LCC Transport concerning the future of the 58 bus service and had been assured that the service would continue until the end of 2019. A review would be undertaken at that point. Clerk was asked to contact LCC direct and press for a more firm commitment in order that Council could forwardbudget for any necessary community contribution.
- ■No further progress had been made regarding signs for the pavilion. Clerk was asked to chase this up and request mock-up photos for consideration.
- ■A number of traffic and highways issues had been raised with LCC Highways but no response had been received.

RoSPA Safety and Condition Report

■Council discussed a number of minor issues that had been highlighted in the Safety Report and during a site visit to the Play Area and Skatepark prior to the meeting. Clerk was asked to contact the contractor and arrange for the necessary work to be carried out.

Neighbourhood Plan Community Actions

■Council discussed the Appendix M Community Actions section of the submitted Neighbourhood Plan. This section had evolved whilst compiling the Plan and from community consultation early in the process. Council agreed a programme of priority for the proposals.

Scout Hut Lease

■Confirmation had been received from 1st Kilworth Scouts agreeing to the terms of the revised lease and Clerk was asked to arrange for the new lease to be drawn up and signed.

Playing Field Committee

■Council agreed to wind-up the Playing Field Committee and devolve remaining management responsibilities to Council. It was agreed to contact the members and advise them of the decision to wind-up the committee and thank them for their work and contact the Cricket Club to arrange for redundant equipment stored at the pavilion to be removed.

Hedge and Tree Encroachment

■A number of issues relating to overhanging vegetation had been raised by villagers over recent weeks and it was agreed to make a survey of problem areas with a view to contacting the householders or landholders.

Allotments

■Council discussed minor revisions to the Allotment Tenancy Agreement, which will come into force with future lettings from March 2020, when a review of charges will be made.

Wilding of the cemetery

■Proposals to set-aside unused parts of the cemetery for wildlife conservation were discussed. It was agreed to follow Leicestershire Wildlife Trust advice and carry out a condition survey in the spring before taking any further action.

Any other business

■A meeting had taken place with Canal and River Trust (CRT) property managers with regard to finding a sustainable use for the redundant warehouse building at Welford Wharf. Mr. Forman informed Council that at the present stage CRT are seeking expressions of interest.

■Clerk was asked to contact Highways with regard to the faulty speed indicator device on Welford Road.

The next Meeting of Husbands Bosworth Parish Council will be on Tuesday, October 1st 2019.

All Saints Parish Church, Methodist Chapel & St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church

FROM THE RECTORY

Here is a poem to ponder on. It is used on a number of websites about mindfulness, though it first came to my attention when done as a solo on Songs of Praise some years back. I have seen the sun break through to illuminate a small field for a while, and gone my way and forgotten it. But that was the pearl of great price, the one field that had treasure in it. I realise now that I must give all that I have to possess it. Life is not hurrying on to a receding future, nor hankering after an imagined past. It Is the turning aside like Moses to the miracle of the lit bush, to a brightness that seemed as transitory as your youth once, but is the eternity that awaits you. R S Thomas


