VICTORY DAY

Throughout the district, plans are underway to celebrate 75 years since the end of World War II with exciting events and activities..

The national celebration for Victory in Europe Day (VE Day) 75, will cover the weekend of May 8th to 10th, with the early May Bank Holiday in 2020 moving to Friday, May 8th to enable an international celebration of peace, remembrance and reflection.

Proposals are underway for a celebratory event in Market Harborough town centre on May 8th with the possibility of other commemorative events being held across the district. This may include participation in special national events such as The Nation's Toast, where over 20,000 pubs will encourage patrons to raise a glass to the Heroes of World War II, and the ringing of church bells for peace.

LOCAL CRIME

- ■Reports have recently been received of burglaries and attempted burglaries at livery stables in the north Northamptonshire area. In a number of incidents horse tack and yard equipment have been stolen.
- ■We are getting more reports of catalytic converter thefts, usually relating to high-sprung vehicles, such as 4x4s and Transit-type vans. A worrying trend is that some of these incidents have taken place in the day time, from vehicles parked in store car parks whilst the owners are shopping the thieves dressed in overalls pretending to be repairing the vehicle!

SHEEP RUSTLING UPDATE

Following a tip-off from a member of the public regarding suspicious activity near Welford at the beginning of October Northampton Police were able to arrest two men from Birmingham on suspicion of carrying out illegal sheep butchery.

Since the spring over 200 sheep have been slaughtered in their fields over a wide area of south and east Leicestershire, north Northamptonshire and north Warwickshire.

In the spate of attacks the animals have been butchered in the field and their remains and stripped carcasses left. In most cases significant numbers of animals have been involved and the nature of the crimes would have meant that some knowledge of stock handling and butchery would be required.

Operation Stock, a cross-county police operation, is still active and police have issued warnings to farmers and stock-keepers, and the general public, to contact them if any suspicious activity is witnessed, especially in remote rural areas.

Where a crime is suspected to be in progress call 999 immediately.



WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Common Field Poppy - Papaver Rhoeas If any plant has a chequered history, it's the poppy: A Jekyll and Hyde story of analgesic and sedative versus addictive narcotic. Evidence of its consumption has been found at a Neolithic site near Barcelona, and its use has been advocated by healers from European and Asiatic cultures for millennia. Poppies are listed on a clay tablet prescription slip, from Sumeria, dated around 2100BC.

We're all familiar with the common poppy. Earlier this year, they added a splash of crimson to the verge alongside the new marina. It's a herbaceous plant that flowers from May to October. Each plant can produce up to 400 flower heads and every head holds generous quantities



of pollen. Although they are popular with insects such as bees, they frequently self-pollinate. As the plant matures, it grows a capsule which holds over a thousand ripening seeds. So, just three poppies with 400 flowers are capable of producing over a million new plants! In addition to their medicinal use, poppies are used in flower arrangements and their leaves and seeds are edible, although, if drug testing is introduced into our Welly Wanging event, caution is needed as consuming poppy seeds can result in a false opiate use indication! Poppy seeds can lay dormant for eighty years or more and germinate when exposed to light. This explains their proliferation on the battle scarred landscapes of WW1, and why they have become such a poignant symbol of remembrance as voiced in Major John McCrae's battlefield poem (below), which is particularly pertinent at this time of remembrance.


We are the Dead. Short days ago We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow, Loved and were loved, and now we lie In Flanders fields.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

A few months ago villager, Aneurin (Taffy) Owen sent us a picture of a medal that he had unearthed relating to the Civil Defence Corps, to which he had been 'seconded' as a coordinator in a visit by two mysterious suited men back in the early 1950s.

Unfortunately there's very little information to be found about the corps itself, but this



photo, teased from the internet, of the Leicester Division Rescue Section shows that they did actually 'muster' and some infrastructure, including a uniform and rather smart van, was set up locally.

The Civil Defence Corps was set up in response to the post-war threat from Soviet Russia. A spidery network of secret installations, communications and administration was established to run the country in the event of a nuclear strike, the extent of which is only just coming to light.

Looking at the Dad's Army-esque bunch in our picture, who presumably would have been the local first-line mopping up crew had the unspeakable holocaust ever come to pass, one wonders how effective our saviours would actually have been against the Soviet threat.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, October 1st 2019.

Present: Four Councillors and 1 member of the public

The Minutes of the previous meeting were approved and signed.

Matters Arising

- ■Correspondence had been received from LCC Transport indicating that they were seeking an holistic approach to the future of the 58, 33 and 44 bus services in Market Harborough, The present 58 service will continue into the new year whilst the possibility of a satisfactory scheme is investigated.
- ■Council is awaiting quotes for fence and gate repairs at the Sports Pavilion.
- ■Clerk is seeking quotations for play carpet replacement for the wet-pour surfacing under the play equipment in the Play Area. Clerk was also asked to arrange for corrosion issues on the swings to be investigated.
- ■Clerk informed Council that notification of the 6 week Consultation Period relating to the Neighbourhood Plan would commence on October 2nd. Copies of the Plan would be available to the public at the doctors' surgery, the school, the Parish Office and at HDC Symington Building.
- ■No further information relating to the Scout Hut lease had been received except that Council's solicitors had advised that the new lease would be back-dated to the end of the previous lease, which expired in April 2017.
- ■Council perused accounts relating to the allotment income and expenditure. It was agreed to review rents and conditions in February.

Visitors' Questions

- ■Concerns were raised about the speed of traffic on Kilworth Road and the possibility of extending the restricted speed zone out of the built-up area. Council noted that this issue had been raised previously and dismissed by Highways as average speeds were noted as low.
- ■The scuffed surface at the entrance to the Sports Pavilion, caused recently by road resurfacing equipment was brought to the attention of Council. Clerk was asked to refer this to Highways.

Planning Matters

- ■Council agreed to make a formal objection to proposals to increase the vehicle movements relating to the vehicle storage facility at Bruntingthorpe.
- ■Concerns were raised that the highway and traffic mitigation works that were conditions of the operation of the new marina at North Kilworth had not been implemented although the site was now operational. Clerk to inform HDC planning office.

Conkers Championships

■Council agreed to accept liability cover for the event under Council's insurance.

Village Grass Verge Cutting

■Council agreed to continue maintaining roadside verges within the village under LCCs Service Level Agreement.

Any Other Business

■Council agreed to look into precepting funds for the provision of a second village defibrillator. **Next Meeting**

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Tuesday, November 5th at 7.30pm in the Committee Room of the Village Hall.

FROM THE RECTORY

For the school service at Harvest time I was asked by the school to say something about saying thank you and it made me stop and think why it is important to say thank you.

It's something we are taught to do as children, to be polite and it perhaps becomes a habit. But do we do it with sincerity - when we say thank you are we really saying it from a grateful heart? And if we are not truly grateful for what we say thanks for is it still a good thing to say thank you for it? I guess we all might have different thoughts on that, but thanking people is an important part of life in a community. It helps us to recognise the part other people play in our lives in giving to us, whether that is in gifts, in time, in love, or in support or help. It recognises, maybe, our dependence upon one another and how working together and giving to one another improves all our lives. The difference is in our ability to see, and our experience rather than a change in the world itself.

Perhaps in those times we have to lower our sights and not expect the big things, but remember to be thankful for each little thing that comes our way. Saying thank you turns our thoughts outwards towards other people, or maybe upwards, towards God and as we do that somehow our difficulties gradually take on a different perspective. If we can give thanks for the good even in the middle of the bad, somehow the bad is pushed back and a chink of light is let in to our lives...
