fter a period when the problem seemed to have receded, the problem of dog fouling around the village has recently reared its ugly head again. Now the problem has got to the stage where the Parish Council has called in Harborough District Council's dog warden.



The law says that you MUST clean up after your dog - it's as simple as that... The dog warden has the powers, under the Public Space Protection Order to impose on-thespot fines of £100 for not picking up dog mess after your dog on any land to which the public have access. If you refuse to pay you may be prosecuted and taken to court, where magistrates can impose fines up to £1,000. It is also an offence if you're not carrying spare dog poop bags or a means of picking up after your dog.

Recently the dog warden has been around the village and has put up a host of warning posters. She has also arranged to increase random patrols around the village, focusing on areas such as Bell Lane, Berridges Lane and Broad Lane, where the problem has been more prevalent.

Did you know you can report someone for not clearing up after their dog? Go to: www. harborough.gov.uk and search for 'Dog Warden'. Clearing up, again...

A big shout-out to those dedicated villagers of Bosworth who have girded their loins and set-to wombling the grass verges - clearing that other scourge of humanity... roadside litter.



Next, and more recently, we have had the attempted break-in, overnight, at Springfields Supermarket. Entry wasn't gained and enquiries are ongoing.

For those who have access to the internet we are promoting Neighbourhood Link, an email messaging service that allows the user to tailor news stories to their own interests such as area, type of news. #### WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

**Long-tailed Tits** - Aegithalos caudatus

It's impossible to write about these birds without using the word 'cute'. Their bodies are roughly spherical; a little larger than a golf ball, with black and white upper plumage. On their underside, their feathers are grey with a hint of pink. Add a tiny beak, small dark eyes and a slender tail that's longer than its body, and you have 'cute'. They've been likened to flying lollypops. You're more likely to see small flocks of them during the winter months, as they look to our feeders for sustenance. The rest of the year they live out in the countryside and are predominately insectivorous.

A problem associated with small size is rapid heat loss. In winter, when the night-time temperature drops, these diminutive birds select a roost where they can snuggle close to each other to keep warm.



Come the spring, they disperse and form breeding pairs. For nesting material, they use feathers, lichen and moss; woven into a bottle shape with threads of spiders' silk. Typically, around 6,000 components go to make up every nest!

This behaviour accounts for some of the birds' archaic names; Bumbarrel, Jack-in-a-Bottle, Bottle Tom, Bottle Bird, Nimble Tailor, Bottle-tit and Bottle Builder. They were also known as Mumruffins, Juffits, Fuffits and inexplicably... Bum Towels.

Many nests are lost to predation; corvids, woodpeckers, weasels etc. If there isn't time to start over, the dispossessed pair frequently help with feeding and protecting duties of another breeding couple. It's suggested this strategy helps inexperienced birds to learn parenting skills. And, of course, it helps the species to flourish.

In terms of numbers, they are currently doing well, but a period of harsh weather could devastate the population! So, please, keep putting out those suet balls.


### Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Some time ago we featured villager Aneurin Owen's brief encounter with the Civil Defence Corps and his 'call up' to serve in the event of war in the 1950s. We followed this up, after a bit of internet digging, with evidence of a Civil Defence Corps rescue detachment that was active in Leicester in the early 1960s, when the threat of nuclear war was very real.


Recently in a round-up of old parish council papers and other material destined for safekeeping in the County Records archive we came across an all together more chilling 'find'...

The Home Defence Measures and Survival Plan sets out in detail the parishes prescribed response to a nuclear attack. The folder, which was to be whisked smartly out at the first sign of an impending nuclear attack, was effectively the parishes instruction book into what to do and who to call on in the case of an attack and sets out specific roles for named individuals. The location of water stop valves and hydrants was noted and emergency feeding and rest stations at the school, the Fernie Lodge and the Lavender Blue Café would be administered

A number of people, including our stalwart Aneurin Owen, were identified as having technical, engineering and scientific training, which would be useful for communications and the



The folder sets out the likely phases of political tension that may lead to attack, and advises, reassuringly, that a nuclear strike would be likely to be an escalation of a conventional attack. However, it admits that the warning could be as long as two weeks or as short as 48 hours but acknowledges that there may be no warning at all and that if you see the flash, you should look away and lie down on the ground! Every page of the dossier makes chilling reading but the most chilling aspect is that this was circulated in 1982...

### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, February 4th 2020.

Present: 5 Councillors and no members of the public

#### Matters Arising from the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

- ■Nothing had been heard concerning the planning enforcement issues raised relating to the new marina at North Kilworth
- ■Funding for a new planter for lower Bell Lane has now been received from our insurers
- Queries relating to quarry liaison meetings were resolved
- ■Clerk to chase up quotes for repairing barge boarding on the pavilion gable

#### Correspondence

■ Council discussed local granting opportunities and S106 funding

#### Neighbourhood Plan

■Members heard that queries relating to the Plan had been resolved and it had been resubmitted to HDC

#### Dog Fouling

- It was agreed to replace the dog bin at the top of Dag Lane with a larger all-purpose bin to try to resolve the overfilling problems
- Council agreed to defer the installation of a second bin on Dag Lane for the time being
- Following a number of complaints about dog fouling Clerk was asked to contact the district dog warden for advice

#### **Allotments**

- Following an inspection of plots it was noted that one plot had not been cultivated and wouldn't be relet to the existing plot-holder
- Due to an oversight a second plot appears not to have been let during 2019
- ■Clerk informed Council that there was a waiting list and, in line with Council policy, villagers from the list would be given priority. The new letting year starts on March 25th 2020

#### **Gliding Centre Event**

■Mrs Hobson outlined the Women's World Gliding Championships, which will be held at Husbands Bosworth during August 2021 and hoped that the local community would support the event

#### **Playing Field and Pavilion**

- ■Clerk was asked to contact the Cricket Club and arrange for their equipment to be removed Play Area
- ■Clerk was asked to obtain quotes for repairing the grass steps to the slide

#### **VE75 Celebrations**

■ Council agreed to support events in the pavilion and on the playing field. Help from the wider community would be sought

#### Any other business

- Complaints regarding fouling of the roads from quarry traffic had been received. Mrs Hobson has arranged an informal meeting with the new manager
- A meeting had been held with Western Power about the roadside electricity cabling over the cemetery entrance. WP are to reroute this underground as part of the adjacent housing development. Concerns were discussed over possible disruption to funerals and access to the cemetery and asked that the work be carried out in stages and with as little disruption as possible
- ■Council discussed insurance cover options for BosFest and Conkers events




