

SLEEPING POLICEMAN

The apparent abduction of Welford Road's own 'passive policeman', whilst quietly going about his traffic calming and road safety duties, was a matter of some concern to village residents recently.

Our village speed vigilante disappeared overnight and was reported as being held to ransom by person or persons unknown, eventually turning up in such disparate places as Mowsley, Thornby and Daventry - and even spotted frolicking with Postman Pat (and his black and white cat) at Welford.

Installed recently by nearby residents as part of a series of traffic speed reduction measures, our hero had showed his true colours in reducing core speeds along Welford Road. Comparisons, which were based on long term data for the road from his mate SID (the parish Speed Indicator Device), showed a clear reduction in both average speeds and maximum speeds - proof that the initial impact at least, of a pair of fluorescent trousers and jacket, strategically placed, can have a marked effect on drivers' attitudes.

Traffic speed and road safety measures, especially on the approach roads to the village, were some of the main concerns raised when our Neighbourhood Plan was formulated. Calls were made for developers to consider traffic calming measures as part of any future developments, which resulted in the permanent speed indicator devices installed by Davidsons and the extension of the 30mph zone by Snowdon Homes on Welford Road.

Bosworth Traffic Action Group has also undertaken some initiatives and pressed the County Council and Leicestershire Police Roads Safety Partnership for the speed 'reminders' that recently appeared around the village, along with more frequent visits by the speed camera van.

In a report recently released by the RAC, the combined thinking/stopping distance increases from 23m at 20mph to 36m at 40mph...

Furthermore, it is proven that drivers do, in general, take notice of simple measures such as signage... or cheery fluorescent mannequins!
Any reduction has got to be a good reduction!

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Blackbird - *Turdus Merula*

Blackbirds are everyday visitors and people come to recognise individual birds. Females have brown plumage, highlighted with lighter spots on their breasts. Both sexes have bright orange-yellow beaks and eye-rings.

Young males claim a territory in their first spring and once paired with a female, stridently defend their domain until the end of the breeding season in July or August. Territories are re-established in the late autumn and held through the winter.

The location is selected mainly for nesting opportunities, typically amongst evergreen or thorny species such as ivy, holly or hawthorn. They raise 2 or 3, exceptionally four, broods a year of around four eggs. The female builds the nest and sits on the eggs and both parents feed the chicks. The youngsters are incubated for two weeks and fledge about two weeks later when they scutter away to seek cover nearby. It is usually the males that care for these truant offspring. So, if you find a blackbird chick in the undergrowth, just leave it, as it's probably fine. There's a high attrition rate, largely due to domestic cats and chicks can starve during hot dry periods. The good news is, the RSPB has recently upgraded blackbirds' status from 'AMBER' to 'GREEN'.

They are ground feeders, who search for insects and worms, but they will eat berries and fruit in season.

The tuneful song you hear from high places and treetops, will be a male blackbird. They are fantastic songsters who compose individualised melodies. In part by mimicking their neighbours' songs, whistling humans and even the beeps of reversing lorries.

Before the 18th century, larger birds like crows were called 'fowls' and smaller birds, 'birds'. So, blackbirds were the only 'black birds'. Lastly, there's evidence the 'Four calling birds' of Christmas were blackbirds.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

There are a few interesting observations to be made from this photograph of the parish church, taken on January 2nd 2017.

Firstly it is fairly unusual in being taken on a day when snow was on the ground... an increasingly more novel event as humanity careers blindly into global warming.

The second point is the unusual viewpoint of the shot, taken from the Church Hall, showing the back of the church; the north, and less glamorous working side.

Although during the winter (and in the summer...) the congregation may sometimes question the decidedly brisk character-building chilliness of the building, there is a boiler house to heat the church tucked away down cold, dark, steps, beneath the vestry at the back of the church. A spooky job for Boilerman Mike, no kidding...

These days the boiler is fuelled by oil, but in the past the verger would have stoked the boiler with coke or coal - in the picture you can make out the old stone chimney rising above the vestry.



LIGHTING UP BOSWORTH

At a recent meeting of the Parish Council members agreed to provide festive lighting to brighten up the village during the festive season. Two sites; the churchyard and around the Village Hall, were considered as being suitably prominent and visible.

After some discussion, and consultation with the Village Hall Committee and the church members, it was agreed to provide multi-coloured festoon lighting to span the roadside trees around the Village Hall carpark and to provide a decorated Christmas tree, to be sited on the high bank in front of the church tower in the graveyard. It was agreed that both the displays will remain the property of the Parish Council and be available for use in future years, so contractors will be on site at the end of November to install a permanent sleeve for the tree in the graveyard.

The tree is being supplied by Welford Christmas Tree Farm at Portly Ford and will be delivered, sited and decorated on Wednesday, December 1st.

Whilst having electrical work carried out recently at the Village Hall, the Committee took the opportunity to install a suitable external electricity supply for the festoon.





HISTORICAL SOCIETY

We'll meet again...

Forces's sweetheart, Vera Lynn, was perhaps overly optimistic in her wartime ballad, but pointedly didn't specify precise timings for reunion.

At Historical Society HQ, much as we would like to reopen our winter programme and reinstate our regular monthly meetings, we are wary of gathering in the close confines of a meeting room. The Sports Pavilion meeting room, whilst cosy does limit the ability for social distancing and ventilation when a large group is being considered, especially if the large group is generally historical itself!

So, in view of the stubbornness of the statistics, we have decided to err on the side of caution, and see how the pandemic progresses over the crucial Christmas/New Year period. If the picture does then show a sustained improvement we can look at perhaps meeting in the Village Hall or, later in the spring, consider a programme of outdoor visits.

PAYMENT DIVERSION FRAUD

Be aware of this scam, which could see you defrauded out of a lot of money, and maybe even make you homeless...

The problem is known as payment diversion fraud, where fraudsters insert themselves into a property purchase, tricking people into transferring over their deposit and/or the balance of purchase monies to them. The frauds almost always involve the criminals pretending to be the victim's solicitor in order to con them into changing their payment details to those of an account that the fraudsters control. One buyer was scammed into handing over £640,000. Emails between the buyer and their solicitor had been intercepted and detailed information relating to the purchase had been collected. Using a fake email account (made to look like that of the solicitor) payment was requested, the amount being exactly what the buyer had expected.

How to protect yourself

Get bank details from your law firm either in person or over the phone at the start of the conveyancing process and agree a robust mechanism by which any legitimate changes in bank details would occur, such as confirming them in person. Law firms almost never change their bank details, so question any changes. Do not feel pressured - use a trusted phone number to check the information, not the one given in the email demanding payment.

Set strong and separate passwords for your accounts, and make sure that you have anti-virus software installed on your devices; these frauds usually rely on email accounts being compromised. To create a strong password, simply choose three random words. Numbers and symbols can still be added if required. Avoid posting on social media about buying/selling your house or getting a mortgage. Fraudsters may get hold of this information and, knowing the next step is a large financial transaction, seek to target you.

If you are making a payment to an account for the first time, transfer a small sum first and then check with the law firm using known contact details that the payment has been received.

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, November 2nd 2021.

Present: Full Council and one visitor

Visitors Questions

■ The visitor requested an update concerning an untended allotment plot. Council noted that the plot had now been relinquished and will be re-let.

Minutes

The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday, October 5th 2021 were approved and signed as correct.

Matters Arising

■ Clerk updated Council on a recent application for LCC funding to clear the footpath towards Theddingworth. Council felt that the refusal was based on incorrect information and Clerk was asked to revert to LCC.

■ Cllr Meredith confirmed that the grant application for funding to upgrade the Skate Park had been successful.

■ Cllr. Hobson confirmed that she had attended a meeting with representatives of HDC, relating to Section 106 funding. Following on from this meeting a consultant had contacted Council with a view to undertaking an energy audit of the Sports Pavilion.

■ The Clerk confirmed the order for the Christmas Tree to be sited outside the parish church and associated services.

Site meeting regarding the Pavilion hedge with second contractor has been confirmed.

Finance

■ October 2021 Bank Statements and Cashbook reconciliation were presented for review. The statements were accepted as an accurate representation of the financial situation.

Planning Overview

■ The Clerk presented the October planning application summary. It was agreed that this was an accurate representation of the Parish Council's response during this period.

Traffic Matters

■ Cllr. Bolter presented an overview of opportunities for speed reduction measures. After discussion it was agreed that Cllr. Bolter could engage with LCC Highways Department on behalf of Council.

Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

■ It was confirmed that the 2022 Bosworth Festival will not be switched to the weekend of the Platinum Jubilee. It was therefore proposed that potential options for Parish Jubilee celebrations be reviewed at a special meeting with interested village groups. It was confirmed that the Beacon on the Sports Field would be lit, as part of a chain of beacons across the country.

Cemetery Wall

■ Clerk confirmed that he had approached a local company with a view to quoting for this work. The contractor had looked at the damaged wall and advised he would like to quote. Despite this, no quote had yet been received.

Defibrillator at Pavilion

■ It was confirmed that NK Football Club would purchase a defibrillator to be sited externally on the Sports Pavilion wall.

Any Other Business

■ The draft lease relating to the Scout Hut had been received. However, concerns were still raised on some elements of the draft. It was agreed to revert to our Solicitor to deal directly with the Scout Association to bring this matter to a speedy conclusion. It was also noted that the Scout Hut was going to be used in breach of the lease. Clerk to write to the Scout Group advising them of this breach of the lease agreement.

Next Meeting

The next meeting will be the 2022/23 Precept Meeting, which will be held on Tuesday, November 23rd 2021 at 7.30pm at the Sports Pavilion.

Christmas Contrasts

On Sunday, November 21st the liturgical year finishes with the celebration of 'Christ the King of the Universe'. The culmination of the Christian hope - our eternal King Christ ruling and reigning over the whole cosmos.
