DAMAGE CONTROL

It is sad that we need to highlight a recent spate of vandalism, anti-social behaviour and criminal damage, especially as this includes incidents within the parish cemetery on Welford Road. The incidents have also spilled over into the adjacent allotments and the Firs Farm site, where trespass and air rifle damage has been noted. The activity is being monitored by the Parish Council and the County Council and the local police beat team have been informed.

WHARF WORK

Recent visitors to Welford Wharf will have noticed that work to stabilise and restore the wharf building has been carried out over the summer. The work, involving site clearance, re-pointing and structural repairs around the wharf building has been carried out by members of the local volunteer group, Friends of the Welford Arm (FoTWA) led by Canal and River Trust (CRT) conservationists. Much of the work centred around a series of conservation workshops, where volunteers have learned the traditional techniques necessary to tackle work on the Grade II listed building.

Now that the scaffolding has been removed, the extent of the works has been revealed and the group has been able to complete further work to enhance the site, including weeding the flag stones, cutting the grass, trimming the edges and removing redundant materials. Meanwhile CRT, in consultation with the Friends of the Welford Arm, are considering future uses for the wharf building itself, which are likely to include community use and a base for the volunteer group.

Further work planned for the area includes the conservation of the historic lime kilns. Originally seven lime kilns operated until the early 1950s, processing limestone for agricultural and construction use. The Old Union Canal Society carried out some clearance and interpretation of the kilns in 1999. If you would like to get involved with conservation work, email: friendsofthewelfordarm@gmail.com

GARTREE 'SUPER' JAIL

The Planning Inspectorate has confirmed a public inquiry will be held to decide the Ministry of Justice's planning appeal to build a new prison at Gartree.

In April, Harborough's planning committee unanimously refused the application for a 1,700 capacity prison adjacent to the existing prison, which the Ministry of Justice is now appealing against.

A public inquiry will now be held at the Harborough District Council offices in Adam and Eve Street, Market Harborough on Tuesday, October 4th to 7th and October 10th, which the public or other interested parties, can attend the inquiry. All previous consultations material and comments will be forwarded for consideration by the Inspectorate.

ENERGY REBATE SCAMS

Action Fraud is warning the public about a sharp rise in reports relating to fake emails purporting to be from *Ofgem*, the independent energy regulator for Great Britain. The emails claim that the recipient is due a rebate payment as part of a government scheme and provides links for the recipient to follow in order to apply. The links in the emails lead to malicious websites designed to steal personal and financial information.

Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS) reports that the emails display the email subject header '**Claim your bill rebate now**' and carry the *Ofgem* brand logo, layout and colours to make the emails look authentic. However, the emails contain grammatical and spelling errors, which has prompted many recipients to realise the emails weren't genuine.

E-SCOOTERS AND THE LAW

Leicestershire Police would like to remind e-scooter or *Segway* 'motorised vehicles' riders that it is against the law to ride on any public road or pavement and that under Section 165 of the Road Traffic Act 1988, officers have the power to seize the vehicle. Users driving dangerously or under the influence of drink or drugs and speeding can also be convicted for common motor traffic law offences leading to fines, disqualification, penalty points and imprisonment.

FIRS FARM UPDATE

The County Council now has agreed a strategy and disposal options with the Environment Agency and is working on procuring the remediation contract and clean-up operation in respect of the buried waste. The contract is expected to go out to tender by the end of September for award and commencement in early 2023.

Contractors have started work on clearing the farmhouse and farm buildings. This is preliminary work and will also entail some repair work to the farm buildings to make them safe and more secure.

We are aware that there has been an increasing amount of trespass and vandalism on the farm. Any activity on the farm can be reported to the police who are aware of the ongoing damage, etc.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Ceratopogonid larvae Midge or gnat

A couple of years ago, Santa brought me an electronic microscope. This nifty little gadget plugs into a phone or computer and works as a camera of very small things. It was while conducting a safari through a tiny patch of moss, that I encountered the mysterious creature shown in my picture.

My first thought, as I watched it move, was of those toy snakes we had as children. The ones where the segments were jointed so they wriggled and writhed as you pushed it towards your sister. A little detective work identified it as a *Ceratopogonid* larva, commonly known as a midge or gnat.

Specific identification is difficult as there are 500 non-biting and 150 biting midge species in the UK. Larvae of different varieties inhabit different ecological niches. There's one that favours farmyard puddles where they feed on animal faeces. Around 50 of the biting midges attack humans, and these belong to the genus *Culicoides*. It's only the females that bite, driven by the imperative to secure a blood meal to support the development of her eggs. They are attracted to carbon dioxide and the smell of sweat and can home in on targets over 200m away.

The good news is UK midges do not transmit diseases to humans - a likely consequence of them spending most of their lives as larvae and dying shortly after emerging to breed, unlike mosquitoes which can live for months and bite multiple victims. However, some species of gnats that avoid humans do attack other mammals, birds, and insects, such as butterflies, and some of these do transmit diseases to flora and fauna they encounter.

So, in that patch of moss, the size of a chicken egg, there are snakes, bears (of which more later), carnivores, vegetarians, and detritivores that operate as recycling machines. It is a veritable jungle down there!

Jupiter at Opposition

The planet Jupiter is at opposition in late September and early October. Opposition is when the Earth passes between the Sun and a planet in its orbit. For Jupiter this happens roughly every 13 months.

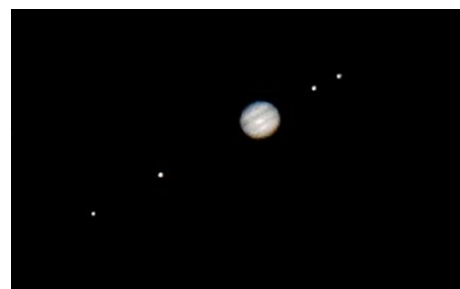
Whilst opposition is simply a line of sight event for us on Earth, it is important for observing the planet, as it is then at its closest and appears biggest and brightest.

To the unaided eye Jupiter will seem like a bright star fairly low in the south-eastern sky (towards Sibbertoft). With a small telescope or decent binoculars you will see the planet and up to four of its largest moons in a view similar to that shown in the diagram.

Imagine the thrill Galileo had back in 1610 when he first looked at Jupiter through his homemade telescope and saw the planet as a small disc with little points of light in a line either side. At first he believed the points of light to be just distant stars beyond the planet, but night after night they moved around in a line and it wasn't long before he deduced they must be moons orbiting Jupiter and realised he was looking at this planetary system edge-on! Together with his discovery that Venus had phases, Galileo confirmed Copernicus's 1543 Heliocentric theory that the Earth and other planets orbit around the Sun, and that Earth is not the centre of everything! This got Galileo into a great deal of trouble with the religious community, who sentenced him to house arrest where he remained until his death nine years later.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Last month we featured Sulby Hall, the monumental country pile that stood just over the Northamptonshire county border beyond the aerodrome... and noted its demise.



This picture, one of a series from the Barry Crowther Collection, by kind permission of Welford and Sulby Historical Society, graphically portrays the scale of the grand house and destruction during its demolition in 1952.

Many great country houses were lost in the post-war years, often as a consequence of their roles during the war. Sulby, however, fared relatively well. Despite being used as a military

hospital and convalescent home during the Great War the house was not requisitioned in WWII, but was taken over in 1944 by Bishopswood School, which had relocated from Buckinghamshire.

The general decline of the country estates, however, during the Depression Years between the wars, and lack of interest by successive tenants had taken their toll; the house and estate in general suffering for lack of investment and maintenance.

Guy Paget, who had owned Sulby since 1911, died tragically in a riding accident in 1952 and the estate was broken up to satisfy death duties. With no clear use for the mansion itself, and lacking any formal preservation order the house was sold to a demolition dealer from Northampton for £20,000 and quickly dismantled.

Any saleable items, such as windows, floor-boarding, timber roof trusses, doors, fireplaces, decorative features, sanitary ware and stonework were auctioned off, with much of the oak panelling finding its way to nearby Cottesbrooke Hall.

Today, although many of the ancillary estate buildings remain, there is little evidence of the Hall itself apart from a few obscure undulations and some exposed stonework in the pastureland.

Mike and his group have been carrying out archaeological fieldwork in and around Lutterworth for over ten years, including fields around Bosworth, with members of our own Society.

Primarily, their work has centred around field walking for surface-scatter flint and pottery but the group has also been involved in the long-term excavation and interpretation of a previously unrecorded Roman and Iron Age site near Shawell.

The group has also carried out a number of *Time Team* test pit excavations around Lutterworth, which have uncovered some of the town's hidden past, and have built up an extensive knowledge of artefact identification.

The meeting will be in the Village Hall on Wednesday, October 5th at 7.45pm and is open to all.

Matters arising

- Theddingworth Road footway - awaiting LCC's response on safety measures required to undertake the clearance work
- The Gliding Club open day was judged to be a success, which may become an annual event

Parish Waste Bin Review

HDC to be asked to replace the concrete bin on the Upper Green with a closed top bin.

Canal and Rivers Trust Adoption Scheme

- Following a meeting in relation to the adoption of the towpath from Honeypot bridge to Leicester Road, Council awaits paperwork to progress the application

Welford Wharf

- Council discussed a project proposed by the Friends of the Welford Arm group and Canal and River Trust conservation team for the restoration of the lime kilns at Welford Wharf. As the wharf area is in Husbands Bosworth parish, the group were hoping that the Parish Council might take some 'ownership' of the site. After discussion it was thought that Council could help with the installation of a bench or maintenance around the site

Potential projects to consider within the 2023/2024 Precept

- Whilst it is expected that much of the cost of the Pavilion development would come from granting opportunities it was noted that the cost would probably need a 'top up' from the PC funds
- Council agreed that funding should be precepted for possible work in relation to trees belonging to the Council that appear to be suffering from ash die-back

- Clerk was requested to seek further quotes for a new single-post noticeboard

Christmas Tree 2022

- Council agreed to accept the quotation for providing the 2022 Parish Christmas Tree

- Section 106 application for funding of the Pavilion extension had been completed.

- Following a request to use the Scout Hut for a proposed Christmas Fair Clerk was asked to refer the organisers to the Scouts Group, who need to make the decision in relation to their Lease Agreement in this matter

ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

I came across a great saying the other day: *The tree grows as the twig was bent.*

It was used in the context of raising children and highlighted the importance of the early years in the formation of character. I read somewhere that psychological research shows that by the age of 4 a child's major character traits are already formed. So, whether a child is sociable, plays nicely with others, is kind, considerate and caring or whether they are a screaming ego-maniac, is already pretty well established by the age of 4.

Now, this is not unchangeable, but a baseline and a trajectory have been set and it will take long and consistent effort to alter that. Certainly, there are genetic predispositions that are at play, but in general, if we are well-adjusted, sociable children by the age of 4, this is something we receive as a gift from our parents, and their hard-work training us - or not... This made me think about whether this saying applies to spiritual formation too?

I think it does. I think we see enough material in the Bible telling us of things we need to practice in order to become the people God wants us to be - and the best version of ourselves will always be a Jesus-shaped version.

We have traditionally called these the spiritual disciplines. They come under two headings, disciplines of abstinence and disciplines of engagement.

Disciplines of Abstinence are ways we abstain to some degree and for some time from the satisfaction of normal and legitimate desires - solitude, silence, fasting, frugality, chastity, secrecy and sacrifice.

Disciplines of Engagement are designed to re-connect us with God - study, worship, celebration, service, prayer, fellowship, confession and submission.

As we undertake these disciplines over extended lengths of time, with the Holy Spirit's action at work at the deepest level of our being, transformation takes place that brings us to a new place in terms of our character and our spirituality.

So, whilst our general nature is a gift we receive from our parents, it is only a starting point for our own work of self-transformation. Certainly, we do not undertake this work alone. The Holy Spirit is at work in us to do precisely this, and also, we should be part of a Christian community that supports us and encourages us, and challenges us in this process.

We only take two things into the next life;

- The things we have done for God - our acts of love and obedience.
- The character that we have worked to form in ourselves, or more precisely, that the Holy Spirit has formed in us with our active cooperation.

I wonder how your spiritual character is being formed?

If you need help, support, challenge, and encouragement in this then All Saints Church congregation (and I'm sure, St Mary's Roman Catholic congregation) extend their welcome to you. *The tree grows as the twig was bent.*

St. Mary's Church Harvest Festival will be on Sunday October 2nd at 11.00am. All are welcome.

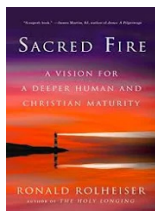
We now have an Autumn Reading group at St. Mary's and are currently reading 'Sacred

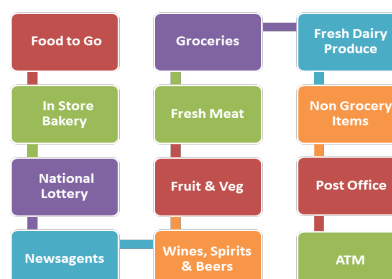
