BUS SERVICE REPRIEVE

eicestershire County Council has recently announced a successful bid for government funding that will support local bus services and give our own 58 Lutterworth to Market Harborough service a stay of execution until a review in October.

The County Council has thankfully focused on the rural services where alternative transport options are limited. Locally the 58 Lutterworth to Market Harborough service, along with the 8 Hinckley to Lutterworth and the 44 Fleckney to Market Harborough services have all been saved for the time being.

The funding is part of the Government's *Help for Households* campaign, which aims to reinvigorate public transport and help passengers save money by capping the cost of bus fares in England. The scheme has been operating since the beginning of the year, offering a fare cap of £2 for any single journey. The scheme is being extended until October 31st 2023 when the cap will rise to £2.50 per journey, which will run until November 30th 2024 when there will be a further review.

What the Parish Council is and what it does...

parish Councils are local civil authorities and the first tier of elected Government. The Parish in this context describes a rural geographical area, based on an ancient unit of land. The Parish Council is secular and should not be confused with Parochial or Church Councils.

- Husbands Bosworth Parish Council has seven councillor positions to represent the parish. A full term of office is 4 years.
- Parish Councils are not political bodies and act independently of any political affiliations or influence.
- ■Decisions within the Council's areas of responsibility can only be taken at Parish Council Meetings as agenda items.
- ■There are usually ten Ordinary Parish Council Meetings per year. In addition there are also two statutory open meetings - the Annual Parish Meeting in April and the Annual General Meeting, which is held in May. (Husbands Bosworth Parish Council has no Council meetings in January and July).
- ■Whilst Parish Council meetings are not public meetings, residents are welcome to attend and may be invited by the Chair to raise any matters relating to parish business.

All Parish Councils in England must employ a Clerk. Derek Watson is the Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer for Husbands Bosworth Parish Council. Derek is un-elected and employed directly by the Parish Council. His primary responsibility is to ensure that the Council conducts its business lawfully. Other responsibilities include managing the parish finances, day to day business and office administration and implementing the Council's decisions. Derek works from the Parish Council office on 2a Mowsley Road and can be contacted on 881109.

SPEED AWARENESS COURSE

eicestershire Road Safety Unit has recently carried out a traffic speed survey on the Welford Road approach to the village. During the period of the survey 36% of vehicles were found to be exceeding the National Police Chief Council (NPCC) recommended threshold above the national speed limit for the site of 10% +2mph (35mph). Analysis of the report assessed the results of the survey as 'poor compliance' and has requested additional enforcement visits.

BUGLE COMMENT

As this issue of the *Bugle* goes to press the recent incident regarding the young footballer who suffered a heart attack whilst playing football on the village playing field is still fresh in our minds.

We feel that the incident highlights a number of issues worthy of public comment.

Firstly, we hear that thankfully, the lad seems to be recovering well, and we pray that he will have made a full recovery by the time that you read this.

Secondly, the incident highlights the football club's forethought and initiative in the provision and installation of a defibrillator - in this instance almost certainly a life saver - on site.

The incident also highlights the relatively simple and low-cost way that a life can potentially be saved. As with many medical emergencies, timeliness and having the equipment and folk with the skill and confidence to deal with the issue are the key elements.

Luckily this time all these 'stars' were aligned and the outcome was positive, but it does highlight the main issue - that of timeliness.

Of course, there is a defibrillator in the old phone box on The Green, [Reader, please make a mental note...] but the delay in remembering that this facility is there and deploying it could have resulted in a different outcome this time.

At this point, therefore we should bear in mind that an incident at the lower end of the village may be quite a distance from either the device on The Green or the one on the Sports Pavilion.

We need to seriously consider the provision of another device, or even two devices to spread the availability - provision will never be perfect, but we can easily make it better... As the Football Club said at the time that they installed the device outside the Sports Pavilion, 'the facility is provided - but we hope that it is never needed.' In this case it was...

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Magpie Moth - Abraxas Grossulariata

These attractive individuals can be seen lurking in our hedgerows and gardens from June to August. Unusually for moths, their behaviour is diurnal rather than nocturnal. This makes sense, as their striking colouration marks them out to predators as distasteful, which isn't a good survival strategy in the dark. As adults they feed on nectar and rest on the foliage they ate as caterpillars: brambles, currant and gooseberry bushes, blackthorn, hawthorn and hazels. After mating, the females lay their eggs on the undersides of the leaves of the food plants.

The eggs start out yellow and gradually darken until the larvae emerge about seven days later. From this point on, until the following May, the caterpillars feed and grow, although some may hibernate through the winter. They share the same gaudy colouration as their parents: pale yellow/white with black splodges, an orange line along the sides and a shiny black head. As they feed, they assimilate poisons from the plants they eat to make themselves unpalatable. These toxins deter most predators and even spiders give them a miss if they get trapped in their web.

Sometime around May or June, when they are fully grown, they transform into bright

yellow and black pupae. Over the following month, the magic of metamorphosis takes place, leading to the emergence of a fully formed adult, thus completing their single generation per year life-cycle.

I have been unable to decipher the binomial name *Abraxas Grossulariata* - it has no relation to magpie or moth. *Sulariata* translates to sunny in Corsican, and *Abraxas* is the name of an ancient Greek deity, who is crowned and carries a whip. Physically he is depicted as being fat-bellied with the head of a lion or a cock, a dragon's tail, and serpents instead of legs! *Mike Chanter*

CHURCH NEWS

ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

We are all different. In terms of the life of Faith, this means that we each need to find a way of praying that fits with who we are.

Abbot John Chapman famously advised people to "Pray as you can, not as you can't".

A good illustration of that is the famous story called *'The Three Hermits'* by Leo Tolstoy. "Three Russian monks lived on a faraway island. Nobody ever went there, but one day their bishop decided to make a pastoral visit. When he arrived, he discovered that the monks didn't even know the Lord's Prayer. So, he spent all his time and energy teaching them the "Our Father" and then left, satisfied with his pastoral work.

But when his ship had left the island and was back in the open sea, he suddenly noticed the three hermits walking on the water - in fact, they were running after the ship!

When they reached it, they cried, "Dear Father, we have forgotten the prayer you taught us!" The bishop overwhelmed by what he was seeing and hearing, said, "But, dear brothers, how then do you pray?" They answered, "Well, we just say, 'Dear God, there are three of us and there are three of you, have mercy on us!" The bishop, awestruck by their sanctity and simplicity, said, "Go back to your island and be at peace."

What is the message of that story? I think it illustrates well the difference between learning prayers and prayerfulness. You might have your own favourite ways to pray, ways that work for you; but just because someone doesn't pray like you, doesn't mean they aren't close to God. Christ-likeness and spiritual growth do not depend on our ability to learn and recite prayers, or even recite theological facts.

In Tolstoy's story, the three monks are shown to live and pray from the heart - in a way that was right and natural for them, and this had drawn them close to God.

The bishop was forced to recognise their sanctity and prayerfulness, despite their theological ignorance, even of the Lord's Prayer.

Simply put, if you have the faith to walk on water, then your prayer-life is probably doing alright! At its heart, prayer is entering and relaxing into the mystery of God's love, each in our own way.

I encourage you to find YOUR way of praying. Experiment. Try different ways, perhaps praying with icons, or reciting the Jesus Prayer.
