# **GREEN WAYS**

ith the grass-verge cutting season now in full swing after a shaky start due to the exceptionally wet spring, here is the schematic map of the verges around the village that are nominally under the control of the Parish Council.

Previously the roadside verges were cut by the County Council. But, under an agreement with LCC the Parish Council took over the responsibility for cutting of the areas marked in green, in order to be better in control of the growth.

These areas are now incorporated into the Parish Council's wider grass cutting contract, which includes the Playing Field, the Play Area, the Allotment pathways and the Welford Road Cemetery.

It should be noted that some of the shaded areas are cut by the adjacent householders under historic agreements and some, relating to 'new' developments, are under private maintenance contract agreements.

# WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

# Cow parsley Anthriscus sylvestris

The two indispensable colours landscape artists need at this time of year are green and white. White for hawthorn blossom, horse chestnut flowers, garlic mustard and of course, cow parsley. The cow parsley flowers that embellish our local verges are typically described using the cliché 'frothy'. The florets are arranged in umbrella-shaped clusters, called umbrels. If you look closely at the plant, you will see slender stalks branching off the main stem. These terminate in a spread of even thinner stems, which themselves terminate in an array of even thinner stems, called pedicles. Finally, these end in the smallest of creamy-white five-petalled flowers.

Cow parsley is a member of the carrot family, so unsurprisingly rabbits are not averse to a cow parsley salad. Every part of the plant is edible. Flowers, leaves and stems can be added to salads, or used as a herb in soups, pesto and stews. Even the roots can be prepared like carrots, and the seeds can be ground and added to curries or rice - the flavour being described as grassy, parsley with a tang of liquorice or aniseed...

Foraging of this plant, though is STRONGLY discouraged, due to its similarity to the poisonous Hemlock (Conium maculatum). In the past, the vernacular names, 'Mother die' or 'Mummy die', were used to deter children from mistakenly playing with the deadly vegetation - something my friends and I didn't know when we picked 'keck', as we called it, to make peashooters out of its hollow stems...

Meanwhile, cow parsley pollen and nectar provide substance to a vast number of insects, from orange-tip butterflies to hover flies, bees, and various moths. Traditionally it was used to treat ailments such as stomach and kidney problems, breathing difficulties and colds, and has always been used as a mosquito repellent.

[As an aside: my spellchecker wants me to change 'a herb' to 'an herb' ... but I can't bring myself to make the change.]

### BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Rachel Root (née Aland) of North Kilworth, sent us the photograph below to illustrate the story of her being crowned Miss Husbands Bosworth 1959.

The competition was organised by the Rugby Apprentice Rag committee, and teams of judges went out to the villages to judge the contestants on their home territory; the local contest being in the Turville Memorial Hall.

Each contestant danced with the judges in turn and were asked a string of questions about their lives, hobbies and occupations. Rachel recalls that she listed bell-ringing, cycling and sewing as her hobbies, and that she made the gingham skirt and top in the photograph herself, specially for the contest. She continued on to the final at the Co-op Halls, Rugby where, at a grand ball, for which she bought an expensive dress, Miss Rugby was crowned.



Rachel worked at Welford & Kilworth Station as passenger and goods clerk, where her father, Harry Aland, was signalman. Her boyfiend at the time was John Halden, whose family farmed

Firs Farm on Welford Road and, the next day, to celebrate her success, they went for a day out to Bradgate Park on his motorbike!

Happily, a brief search of the Historical Society Archive collection unearthed the Miss Husbands Bosworth sash that Rachel had presented to the Society after her year in office.



# **ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS**

Over the years, our family has had about ten holidays in a gite on a family-run vineyard in the Champagne region. We always go to church on Sunday, and in this part of France, that means attending the Roman Catholic church. To be honest it has often been a bit of a moribund experience, with aged priests and congregations, not much in the way of life or passion and very little sign of spiritual vitality or mission.

But this time things were very different. There was a congregation of around 75 - double what we have seen in the past. All ages were represented and it was also much more culturally diverse. An Asian family played the music and African nuns welcomed everyone and helped in the service.

The priest told the story of how one day an Asian man knocked on his door and asked to be baptised. The man recounted that he came to France at age two, following a military uprising in his home country. He studied and worked hard and had risen to a senior position in a major company.

But one day he asked himself why was he doing this? He worked long hours, always chasing the next bonus or promotion, and wasn't even around to see his children growing up. So, he resigned his job and, on a whim, decided to walk the pilgrimage route to Santiago in Spain. He was a Buddhist, but during the walk he encountered God in an amazing way. Several times he sensed God's love, and just knew that Jesus was real, and on his return he decided to ask to be baptised. He was duly baptised and confirmed and took his place as an active and engaged member of his local church.

This was a wonderful story and reminded me that God is not limited to the four walls of churches. The Christian God is a missionary God, constantly reaching out to his estranged children, longing to draw them back into His family. Our honour and joy is that we get to work with God in this.


