FRIENDS OF THE WELFORD ARM MAKE A POINT...

uring the summer the Friends of the Welford Arm conservation and maintenance group have been giving the old warehouse building at Welford Wharf a bit of a make-over. The interior of the building, which is Grade II listed, has been cleared and the loft area has been opened up for potential community use.

Earlier in the year the area around the old limekilns was cleared of overgrowth in order



to open up the site for better interpretation. Assessments for stabilising the remaining structures were undertaken by the Canal and River Trust conservation team, with a view to carrying out work to preserve the remains. In previous years outdoor maintenance works around the site and along the arm of the canal during the winter have been disrupted by the weather, so the focus this year will be continuing the hedge laying at the lock, as the weather dictates, and any interior work at the warehouse.

From Trading Standards Leicester

Trading Standards are warning telecare customers to be aware of fraudsters taking advantage of the digital switchover to trick vulnerable residents into giving out personal information. Telephone providers are moving their customers from old analogue landlines to new digital technology, which means home phones, personal alarms and healthcare devices using the old analogue system will need to be switched over.

Lifeline companies across the country are currently informing customers and updating their equipment to the digital system. However, this service is completely *free of charge*, so they will never need to ask for bank details.

If you receive a call of this nature, do not disclose any bank details or personal information. If you need to report a scam, or you have been a victim fraud, you can get in touch with the following organisations:

OR CODE SCAMS

A spate of incidences have been reported recently across the county where QR codes on parking meters have been used by thieves to direct payments to fraudulent bank accounts. Typically a false QR code sticker is attached to ticket machines, which when scanned directs the innocent user to a website where the scam is concluded. Parking companies advise users that they never use stick-on QR codes and are urging users to use coinage to pay or use secure PayByPhone apps. If you notice stick-on QR codes on any machine please notify the parking authority as soon as possible.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WEATHER WATCH

November is usually thought of as a damp, gloomy month with mists, fog and the smell of bonfires in the air. A 19th century French proverb says: 'In October the Englishman shoot the pheasant: in November he shoot himself'!

There are others of which probably the most well known is: 'No sun, no moon, no morn, no noon; no dawn, no dusk, no proper time of day. No sky, no earthly view, no distance looking blue. No warmth, no cheerfulness, no healthful ease, no comfortable feel in any member. No shade, no shine, no butterflies, no bees, no fruits, no flowers, no leaves, no birds - November... (Thomas Hood, 1844) [This is a shortened version!]. This pretty accurately sums up this month, which leads us into winter with the changing of the clocks and dark mornings and evenings.

There were more storms passing by and through in November 2023 including Storm Ciaran, which was mainly in the far south and Storm Debi and some colder, frostier air later in that month.

Over the years, there has been a good mix of weather in November including snow in early November in 1980. In 1985, it was the coldest November since 1919, with more snow mid month. There has also been snow in November in 1993, 1996, 2001, 2005 and 2010.

However, in recent years sunshine in November has increased and even in 1991, roses, delphiniums and other flowers were still out at the end of the month. Nowadays, they last even longer with the climate warming. A lot of sayings indicate that if November is cold, then a mild winter will follow and that has happened on many occasions. "If there's ice in November that will bear the weight of a duck, there'll be nothing after but sludge and muck". For many people though November needs to be endured before the Christmas festivities begin and winter starts in earnest and is not a month of note.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

This curious arch in the brickwork of the 'Leaning Wall of Bosworth' in Dag Lane is intriguing... On the basis that such a structure, presumably built in Victorian times, as part of Bosworth House garden, would have served a definite purpose, it is interesting to speculate on its function.

One theory is that it was the entrance to an underground ice store. Ice for preserving meats and preparing drinks and desserts would

have been an important commodity in the Victorian kitchen and most 'big' houses would have had some facility for storing copious amounts of ice during the winter for use throughout the summer.

Blocks of ice would be hauled from lakes and ponds and packed tightly and sealed in sawdust and straw lined chambers underground, would keep for the whole year.

The location of this particular feature, off Dag Lane might suggest that ice would have been brought up from the canal or the old brick claypit off the Mowsley bridle track.

This theory might also answer why there is a similar brick arch in the wall on Berridges Lane, (now obsured by ivy) opposite the top entrance to Dag Lane, which is linked to an underground store under the garden of Red Roofs.


HISTORICAL SOCIETY


