he Millennium Wood has looked particularly green and welcoming this year, despite the lack of rainfall. A new picnic bench has been installed at the top of the site, and work is carrying on in the background to seek grants to improve the pathways and access.

The Trustees are now looking for help to keep the facility in trim. The facility is a great community asset, but its future relies on the community to step up to the mark and help keep it open... This is likely to be mainly minor maintenance tasks, clearing overgrowth, tidying up pathways and topping up the wood-chip.



If you are able to help, or are just interested, we will be holding an open-morning work party on Saturday, July 12th - meet on site, off Mill Lane, at 10.00am. Come along, even if it's only for an hour or so, or just to show your support and see what is entailed. We have some tools but the main object of the meeting is to re-establish a volunteer group for on-going projects and maintenance.

GREATER LEICESTER

recent national government directive has instructed local government to reassess their boundaries and amalgamate local authories into unitary bodies. The main aim is to take out a layer of administration and streamline democracy at local level, to cut costs and improve efficiency

In Leicestershire three proposals have been put forward:

- The City Council is proposing an enlarged city, plus a single, but reduced, county authority - the do-nut proposal...
- The County Council is looking to take over the whole of the county and city - effectively making the existing County Council the unitary authority.
- The district councils, including Harborough, argue that a single authority would be too remote and are pushing for a half-way measure, dividing the county into north and south and leaving the city as it is, as a separate authority - the North-City-South option.



The final proposals need to be submitted to central government by November 28th, when a decision on which option will go forward to pubic consultation will be made. More information can be found at: northcitysouth.co.uk Watch this space...

GREEN CREDENTIALS

arborough District Council are currently undertaking an Open Spaces Strategy Review and conducting site audits across the district. arborough District Council are currently undertaking an Open Spaces Strategy Review and assessing them for quality

The audit team will be assessing over 300 open spaces within the district, irrespective of ownership, and assessing them for quality and community value.

The auditors will have identification badges and will only access sites from publicly accessible locations.

The findings from the audit will provide information to prioritise Council and partner investment to improve the quality of open space and to provide data for consideration in the provision of new open space.

BUGLE POSTBAG

Editor's Note: The Parish Council received this response regarding traffic travelling the wrong way on our one-way streets, following concerns raised by villagers.

From Calum MacLauchlan, Traffic & Safety Management, Leicestershire County Council Thank you for contacting us regarding concerns raised around vehicles travelling in contravention of the one-way movement restriction along Bell Lane and Berridges Lane. We are sorry to hear of any incidents that have occurred, however the County Council has no power to take action against vehicles that are ignoring 'no entry' signs. Drivers ignoring a one-way restriction and no-entry signage is a moving traffic offence, which only the Police have the power to enforce.

All signs relating to one-way systems have to follow set guidance, which states how and where signs should be placed and the distance between them, as well as the placement and number of no-entry signs. The signs on both Bell Lane and Berridges Lane have been installed as per this guidance.

The only additional steps LCC could take regarding physical measures, would be to make the existing hatched lining at the bottom of Bell lane, where it meets Leicester Road, into a raised build-out. However, we would need evidence of vehicles regularly ignoring the one-way restriction to justify the cost of such works, as this can be in excess of £50,000. BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

In my garden, like, I suspect, a lot of gardens, the wood pigeon rules the roost - literally... It's rare that sitting outside on a sunny day isn't accompanied by a pigeon chorus as they wait in turn to carry out a snatch and grab raid on the scatterings from the bird feeder. Over the past few years however, a new bird on the block has started to muscle in on the garden action.. the collared dove.

Very much like a mini-woody, the collared dove is a more uniform pink-grey colour and slightly sleeker, with a distinctive white-bordered black collar on the nape of its neck. They tend to be faster and more agile and less tuneful than their stocky and staid bigger brothers, and more gregarious - often appearing in pairs or small groups. Their behaviour is passive-aggressive and they tend to out-compete competitors in confined environments such as domestic gardens.



Originating from Turkey they were first noted as breeding in the UK as late as 1956. Their population growth has been phenomenal, from the Mediterranean regions and into north Europe and east as far as China, they are now found throughout the British Isles, including the Outer Isles. Migrating into North America from birds introduced into the Bahamas in the 1970s, they can now be found in most states of the United States and Mexico.

Thankfully it has been noted that their populations tend to stabilise where they have colonised, perhaps due to disease or predation. So, hopefully the all-together more pleasing coo-coo of the wood pigeon will continue to accompany the morning coffee on the patio...

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

We are always on the lookout for Husbands Bosworth related items that come up for sale on *eBay*, and so were taken by this High Street scene when it recently came up. Although we have a number of similar views of All Saints Church from this angle, there are always little 'extras' that can be teased out of a 'new' picture...

Standing in the middle of the street cradling your little sister for a long-exposure photograph, as evidenced by the blurred image of the little girl in the flouncy dress, suggests that there was very little traffic. Note also that everyone appears to be wearing their 'Sunday best'...

Interestingly, in the original it is possible to see that the church clock is at a quarter to six, whereas the shadows clearly indicate that the sun is in the south - certainly before midday! Note also that the War Memorial has yet to be erected (in 1921) and that the church gate is still on Theddingworth Road (moved to Church Street in 1960).

We have a number of photographic postcards in the Historical Society Archive Collection that appear to be from the same series. They were probably taken around 1910 - 1912, by local draper and photographer, C. S. Frost, who had a shop on High Street and took many photographs locally around this time.

Athough this postcard is, in fact, postally unused, it is interesting to note that most of the used postcards that we have in the Archive were sent far and wide as a cheap

and convenient 'thank-you' for hospitality received by the sender or for services rendered, and would have been sold in the village Post Office.


It should be noted that until the introduction of the two-tier postal system on September 16th 1968, unsealed letters and postcards could be sent cheaper than sealed mail.

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 3rd June 2025 at 7.30pm in the Millennium Pavilion

Present: Four Councillors & 2 members of the public; two apologies.

Visitors Questions

■Two representatives of the Tennis Club attended the meeting to advise that the Club is winding down and requested that the Parish Council assume responsibility for the ongoing management and maintenance of the courts. Council understood that the courts were now open for free use and advised that a decision would need to be ratified at the next PC meeting.

Minutes of Previous Meeting and the Annual Parish Meeting

The Minutes were approved and signed as correct. [There were no matters arising.] Finance

■The monthly schedule of receipts and payments were presented and approved **Planning Overview**

■The May 2025 planning application overview was presented and agreed

Millennium Wood Trust

- ■Transfer to Council there was no update from the Millennium Wood trustees
- ■Future Ground Maintenance Council heard that the trustees were seeking information regarding on-going grass cutting following the 'retirement' of the volunteer who had carried out the task over the past 7 years

Section 106 Application - Clerk confirmed that a quote for submission with the grant application for a new walk-way had been received and Coun. Forman agreed to supply information for an interpretation board

Millennium Pavilion & Sports Field

- Solar Panels Council heard that previous information relating to the installation of solar panels on the pavilion had questioned the viability, however Clerk was asked to seek up-to-date information in view of the 'green energy' initiatives promoted by HDC
- ■Wi-Fi it was agreed to re-visit the options for the installation of internet provision at the pavilion
- Acoustic Treatments it was agreed to seek professional advice regarding installations to reduce the sound reverberation in the meeting room
- Community Grant (Round 3) Funding application for the overhead projector and sound system had been submitted and confirmed as valid
- Flagpole at Sports Pavilion After discussion, members agreed to purchase a flagpole for the pavilion site, so that a flag could be flown for national events

Neighbourhood Plan Review

- ■The Design Code & Technical Assessments have been completed, and the Site Assessments and Environment sections are in progress.
- Following a recent meeting with our consultants it was agreed to prepare a questionnaire for parishioners as an important element of the required community engagement process

FA Pitch Improvement Scheme

■Clerk confirmed that work to improve the pitches would be commencing in June and carry over into July. Re-seeding will be carried out in September and early spring 2026

Parish Maintenance

■Clerk was asked to notify LCC Highways regarding the dislodged grass-verge protection post on Berridges Lane

External Meetings

■Cllr. Gallagher gave an overview of the recent Village Hall meeting she attended as representative of the parish council.

Any Other Business

■Cllr. Gallagher advised the council that she had visited a Mental Health Well Being Café Meeting. Having spoken to the organisers of this drop in event, she advised they would be prepared to consider Husbands Bosworth as a venue if there was a need

ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

This will be my last contribution to the *Bosworth Bugle*. After four years serving the churches of the Hexagon Benefice as Curate, I am moving to France to be Chaplain to St Mark's Church, Versailles, with St Paul's Church, Gif-sur-Yvette. These are two Church of England churches serving the English-speaking community in this area. So, a very big change for me from the six peaceful villages of the Hexagon Benefice!

But the Hexagon Benefice is also poised for big change. The parish re-structuring process is about to make us part of a Minster Community - a larger grouping of churches, served by a team of lay and ordained people. So, it is 'All change' for everyone!

All of which has made me reflect on the experience of change and how we navigate large disruptions in our life. In *Psalm 11* King David expresses well our feelings of anxiety in the face of change. When the foundations are being destroyed, what can the righteous do?

Look at the list of recent 'disruptions' - Covid, Brexit, climate change, war in Ukraine and the Middle-East, riots and troops on the streets in Los Angeles... It is no surprise that we often feel like 'the foundations are being destroyed'?

It is interesting to note how David continues his psalm:

'The Lord is in his holy temple; the Lord is on his heavenly throne. He observes everyone on earth; his eyes examine them.'

The Lord examines the righteous, but the wicked, those who love violence, he hates with a passion. 'On the wicked he will rain fiery coals and burning sulphur; a scorching wind will be their lot'. God's rule and reign over the entire universe is solid and incontestable.

Moreover, David reminds us that God pays attention to our lives, sees the goodness of the righteous and the evil of the wicked. Righteousness will have its reward and evil will get its comeuppance – in this life or the next.

Knowing this can bring us a sense of perspective. We can make peace with things, knowing that there will be justice, and God will make all things right. Nothing good we do will ever be a waste of effort, not from the perspective of eternity. So, whatever change you face, try to take comfort in David's words. I wish you well, and pray God's blessing upon the people of Husbands Bosworth.
