OUR REMEMBRANCE

As a training and type-conversion unit, RAF Husbands Bosworth understandably suffered losses. Young men of 18 to 21 years of age were given control of heavy twin-engined aircraft, often care-worn examples

cast down from the operational units, and expected to fly in all weathers. Whilst the Wellington was renowned for its ability to take incredible amounts of punishment, it could be an unforgiving aircraft to fly in novice hands, with a marked propensity to put its nose down and fly into the ground. Many Accident Reports cite pilot inexperience as contributory to the accident.

On the afternoon of September 26th 1943, whilst returning from a routine training flight, Wellington bomber, DV697, 'Sir George Huggins O.B.E' developed an engine fault and crashed within Bosworth Park, with the loss of four of the five crew members. The



aircraft was one of three paid for by the Trinidad Bomber Fund and named for a prominent West Indies businessman.

QR, or not QR?

Although we've not been made aware of any recent QR parking scams in our area, drivers should be aware of a spate of similar incidents reported to our colleagues in the north of the county. The scammers have got more sophisticated, and where in the past small stickers have been crudely applied over existing payment options, in a number of recent incidents the whole frontage of the parking payment device has been cloned to include the bogus QR coding, making it difficult to detect until the code is scanned. If you do scan a QR code you will be able to see the originators URL and if



you are not happy with the 'address' we urge you to consider making payment by another route - perhaps considering *PaybyPhone* options if offered.

Victims of this crime should also be aware that since a successful payment has not been made to the site's legitimate parking company they may be prosecuted for non-payment.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH


In this series of articles we have looked at the introductions of nonnative species that have been largely accommodated into our natural environment. However, a number of less appreciated introductions have gone 'rogue' and caused unexpected consequences. This month we look at Japanese Knotweed. Introduced into the country in the mid 19th century as an ornamental garden plant, with its extremely vigorous growth and super resilient rhizomatous root system, it soon out-grew its welcome, quickly becoming a pest.

Whilst it's not a legal requirement to remove japanese knotweed from your property, it is a requirement to control it in a manner not to 'cause distress, damage or discomfort? ' to neighbouring properties. The plant's 'party trick' is its relentless ability to force its way up through minute cracks in solid concrete or tarmac. The plant's tenacity has become an economic problem where mortgage companies have refused to lend on properties that are affected, it

Thankfully it is readily identified by its leaf and stem configuration - dying back to the ground in the autumn, fresh shoots emerge in the spring, which by late summer can attain a height of more than 3 metres (10 feet), with a thick canopy of large shield-shaped bright green leaves supported in a zig-zag pattern by the hollow bamboo-like stems. Ringlets of small white flowers will also appear between August and September.

Chemical control is often the only way to combat the issue - digging out is usually fruitless, as particles of rhizome as small as one centimetre have been shown to be able to regenerate into full plants within one season.

All is not lost, however... japanese knotweed has been used in ancient medicine and, apparently, the stems are edible... yum!

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Recently, we have focused on the relocation and rededication of the memorial to the Wellington bomber crash that occurred in September 1943. However, there is another memorial in Bosworth Park to an air crash that happened earlier in the war.

This second air accident memorial remembers a Miles Master two-seater trainer, which crashed on August 28th 1942, before the aerodrome was fully operational.

The aircraft, N7889, was dispatched from the Anti-Aircraft Cooperation Unit based at RAF Castle Bromwich, Birmingham, to carry out anti-aircraft gun traversing practice for gun-crews stationed close to Bosworth Hall. The aircraft clipped a tree during a low pass and broke up on hitting the ground, killing the 33 year old Polish Air Force pilot, Flying Officer Jerzy Marian Ramert and his 14 year old Air Training Corps pupil passenger, Cadet Roy John Shaw.

In April 2011, representatives of Bosworth village, the Royal British Legion and the local Polish community, including a number who had been billeted on the former RAF base after the war, unveiled the memorial and rowan tree on the site of the accident.

Buried at Witton Cemetery, Birmingham, Shaw must be one of the youngest airmen killed 'on active service' to be commemorated with a Commonwealth War Graves headstone.]
