# **UILDING LINES**

s you will no doubt be aware, Harborough District Council's housing strategy has decreed that Husbands Bosworth will be expected to accommodate over 100 new dwellings over the next 15 years.

In a 'Call for Sites' exercise earlier in the year, the Parish Council, as part of the on-going Neighbourhood Plan review, identified a number of development sites, which have recently been professionally assessed for their suitability, viability and potential.

The next stage is to consolidate the findings of the report with a public consultation exercise. To this end, we are inviting villagers to complete a simple

It will also take the opportunity to look at number of other aspects of community life - areas where the Parish Council has a more direct influence, such as service provision and local facilities.

#### LISTENING TO YOU...

Road safety issues frequently feature as 'top of the bill' in our face-to-face meetings with people in our communities. Things like speeding, general driving offences and queries about documentation, such as insurance, road fund and MOT often crop up.

In response, we have recently stepped up proactive patrols, speed checks and other road safety actions across the Beat Area.

On a recent 'visit' to the A4304 High Street, Husbands Bosworth, our colleagues in the Road Safety Team logged eight drivers exceeding the statutory speed limit during a 110 minutes stint.

A concerning increase in vehicle crime, including break-ins to vehicles, tools and equipment thefts from vehicles and criminal damage, has been reported recently across our Beat Area, especially in the more remote rural areas or away from the main thoroughfares.

Tradespeople are urged to make it clear that vans in particular, are not left with tools in overnight.

Car owners are reminded to park off-road if at all possible. If off-road parking is not an option, try to park in well-lit areas where there is likely to be passing traffic or pedestrians to deter opportunist thieves.

## **BOSWORTH IN FOCUS**

#### WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

#### Himalayan Balsam

Like much of the flora and fauna that we have looked it in this series, Himalayan Balsam is a non-native invasive species. Growing wild in the lower reaches of Himalaya regions of India, Tibet and Nepal, the plant came to the attention of the East India Company, which was looking for commercial plants to exploit, specifically fibrous plants for marine rope and sail making.

It was subsequently introduced into the UK in the early 1800s for ornamental planting. Its rapid growth and abundant foliage and brilliant hued blossom soon became a favourite in country house gardens, and was especially suited to wetland and river margins. Growing from tender shoots to over 2m high within a season, and possessing an amazing profundity, the plant soon spread beyond its original remit...



These days it is a common sight on our canal and river banks, where it tends to smother out native plants, often taking over vast 'groves' along the banks. Water-side management often sees the need for control programmes, which entail grubbing out mature plants or 'balsam bashing' parties, where the plants are destroyed before they can seed.

Seeding is Himalayan Balsam's party trick... As the plant matures in the autumn, the flowers develop into pendulous 40mm long seed pods. As these pods mature and dry, tremendous tensions build in the outer shell, which on reaching a critical point, burst open with explosive force, often just by being brushed in passing, scattering the small round seeds over vast distances... A great game for young children, but seriously detrimental to the environment!

Anyway, all is not negative... bees love the flowers; the honey produced is subtly scented, and the flowers themselves can be used to make a fragrant jelly preserve or cordial.

#### **BYGONE BOSWORTH**

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Our Parish Church members, always struggling for funding for the upkeep of the fabric of the building, are currently in the process of launching a campaign of sustained commitment from the wider community in order to help stabilise finances and establish a dedicated fund-raising arm. The efforts of the group to keep our church upright reminded me of a well-documented



incident in 1755, when the church steeple was struck by lightning. This picture and the first-hand account, which hangs in the church today describes the terrible scene.

This Church received much Damage by a most Dreadful Storm of Hail and Rain with terrible thunder and lightning as has not had its equal in the memory of Man. On Sunday 6th of July 1755, between seven and eight in the Evening Several stones were struck out of the Walls... the Bells displaced, their frames and wheels wildly splintered, the Spire in particular was very much shatter'd, a large chasm opened in it, about twelve Yards in length & one in breadth, from whence many heavy stones were forced to a very great distance; Globes of fire were seen in the air. Flashes of Lightning in a terrible manner ran along the Streets, and a great Smoke and sulphurous smell issued from the Appertures of the Spire; and what is remarkably providential several hundred weight of stones fell about and upon the grave which Minifer (and a Large Congregation attending) had just before buried a Corps, which Funeral Rites... muft inevitably have occasioned the Mournfull solemnity of many.

One can only wonder at the wringing of hands among the community at such terrible destruction - and the determination of the villagers to restore the damage.

Today, whilst we don't expect such dramatic incidents, the parish church still needs the community to support it, to improve the facilities, to enable the building to support wider events... but most importantly, to help to keep it upright!

#### Report of the Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council held on Tuesday 2nd September 2025

Present: Full Council and one visitor

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and signed as correct

#### Matter Arising (for report only).

- Clerk confirmed he had notified NKFC regarding Council's decision on the external kitchen siting
- ■All Saints Church confirmed the 2025 Christmas Tree can be sited in the Church grounds
- ■Clerk confirmed he had advised Welford Farm that their quote for the 2025 Christmas Tree and associated works had been accepted
- ■Clerk had contacted Mick George relating to speeding lorries, particularly sub-contractor vehicles, and the quarry management had agreed to speak with all contractors using the quarry and arrange for speed monitoring to take place

#### **Finance**

■The monthly schedule of receipts and payments for August were received and confirmed.

#### **AGAR External Audit**

■Clerk reviewed the successful audit, and noted a couple of minor administrative errors that were rectified and did not affect the audit

#### **Planning Overview**

August 2025 planning applications overview was presented and agreed as correct

#### **Staffing Matters**

[Clerk left the meeting for this agenda item]

- Chair confirmed that the 2025 annual appraisal meetings for the Clerk and Caretaker had been completed
- Council agreed a salary increase for the Clerk to reflect his performance and commitment to the role over the past 5 years

#### Millennium Pavilion & Playing Field

- ■Frieze project Council heard that the artwork is progressing and presented a number of images for comment
- ■Projector Clerk confirmed dates for the installation of the projector and sound system

Garage/Store - Community Grant application had been submitted, for determination by HDC on 24th September

#### **Millennium Wood Trust**

■Clerk confirmed to the Trustees that Council will assume ownership of the Millennium Wood [August meeting agenda item 25/100] which should allow an application for S106 Greenways Grant to progress

#### **Tennis Courts**

■The Tennis Club accepted Council's position that the guarantee period will end in May 2027 when a new parish council will be elected and that any monies from the Club will be ring-fenced for the upkeep of the courts

#### Neighbourhood Plan Review (NPR)

- ■The meeting heard that HDC had confirmed that only one development site [HB1] would be included in the Local Plan. However, at a recent meeting with Council's NP consultants, it emerged that similar issues had been raised by other councils in the same situation, and that it had been agreed that our identified sites could be submitted for consideration at the examination stage
- It was agreed that the Questionnaire would be loaded onto an online survey platform, with paper copies available on request

#### **Annual Donations Approval**

■Donations on behalf of the Parish Council to the Millennium Woodland Trust, Bosworth Bugle, Causeway Charity, Citizens Advice Bureau were agreed Parish Maintenance

Council approved work to strim and clear two overgrown allotment plots and the surrounds to the skate park

#### Coronation Oak Old Green

Council accepted a quotation for minor works to the tree, as advised by the recent routine survey

### Any Other Business

- ■Correspondence Council discussed concerns raised by a parishioner regarding the conduct of users of the Playing Field and Clerk was asked to respond
- Chair outlined a response received in relation to the use of the pavilion by an outside party. It was agreed that any such future communication should be through the Clerk

#### ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

We had a useful meeting of the benefice churchwardens with Archdeacon Claire Wood and Area Dean ,Nigel Byard in September to learn more about the forthcoming changes and the help available for the parishes now, that we no longer have our own priest. For the moment it is "carry on as you are", perhaps for some time to come.

By the time you read this, we will know whether sufficient support for the Friends of All Saints Church will allow this idea to come to fruition. It will require input from outside the Parochial Church Council, the members of which, with the churchwardens, have too much to do to take on any more tasks.

In August, we had a version of Songs of Praise, lead by a churchwarden, which was well received and indicates the sort of service we will have to arrange ourselves from time to time. Recent work about the fabric of the building itself has included arranging fire extinguisher tests in the church, obtaining an asbestos report and a fire risk assessment and fixing a date for the Rosebay Willow-herb to be removed from the steeple. This is in addition to our usual services for which we hope to get the help of a retired priest, although this may not always be possible.

At St. Mary's we have a side chapel which is the Fortesque Chapel. This is a Chantry for the Fortesque family, who built the Church.

One of the Fortesques was Blessed Adrian Fortesque, one of the English Martyrs. There is a devotion to Blessed Adrian at Husbands Bosworth, and occasionally we welcome pilgrims to pray in the
