s a community, we've done a lot of remembering recently... In the September Bugle, we remembered the Polish pilot and his air-cadet passenger; the victims of an air accident over Bosworth Park in the months before RAF Husbands Bosworth was opened to operations. Also, in September, in our rededicatoin ceremony at the memorial in Butt Lane, we remembered those crew members who were the lost in the Wellington bomber crash in 1943.

Now, in November, as we come to the period of national remembrance we will be remembering those who gave their lives in the two world wars, and in conflicts since, so that we can enjoy the freedom that we sometimes take for granted.

This year, following the stand-down of our local branch of the Royal British Legion, there will be no formal door-to-door collection around the village. The Legion, as a group, however, still soldiers on, as it has for more than 100 years, supporting ex-servicemen, their families and their dependents. So, look out for collection boxes, in the village shop, in the Bell and around town, donate generously and wear your poppy with pride!

Join us, at 10.45am on Sunday, November 9th, as we remember, at the village War Memorial, those of our parish who gave their lives.


STAIRWAY TO HEAVEN

MEDICINE CABINET

osworth Surgery's automated collection Dkiosk is up and running. The facility aims to simplify and speed up the collection of prescriptions, and offer the convenience of 24 hour collection. The service will be especially convenient for out-of-hours collections, the pickup of repeat prescriptions and for those collecting an acute prescription.

Anyone collecting their prescriptions normally at the dispensary window will be able to choose to have future items dispensed through the

kiosk, although face-toface collections will still be available. Scan the QR code on the device to register your consent, or speak to a dispenser.



There are obvious limitations on the type of medications that can be delivered through the kiosk - controlled drugs and refrigerated items can't generally be delivered by the device. Also please note that, as the kiosk can only hold a maximum of 80 items, there may be times when the facility is unavailable and dispensing will revert to over -the - counter. In practice, prescriptions are ordered as normal - either at the counter

or by popping the request form in the letter

box. When the order is ready for collection, the patient will be sent a six-digit PIN code

via an SMS text message, which will be valid for 5 days.



Operating the system couldn't be simpler.... Just tap the touch screen to wake it up and type in your PIN code.

If you need to pay, (card only) a message and instructions will appear on the screen. Once the transaction is complete the corresponding locker will illuminate, and you will be able to open it.

From Canon Chris Oxley, Lammas Close

First of all, an opportunity to say 'thank you' to everyone in the village who has made Paula and myself so welcome here. Paula, as daughter of Pat and Ken Halden, is now back in the house where she grew up!

Remembrance...Sunday, November 9th we are all invited to come to All Saints church at 10.30am, for the parishes Annual Service of Remembrance, to be joined by our friends from St Mary's Catholic church.

From my three years at the Anglican cathedral in Brussels, I have very clear memories of standing under the arch of the Menin Gate in Ieper (Ypres), on which are inscribed the names of over 54,000 British and Commonwealth soldiers who fell in that area, and whose graves are unknown. How many families were deeply affected by those losses? Paula's grandfather, William Halden, who farmed at Firs Farm on Welford Road, was a stretcher-bearer throughout that conflict at nearby Poperinge.

Described optimistically at the time as "The War to End All Wars", the 1914-18 Conflict didn't fulfil that hope. During our three years in Brussels, I was working with people in NATO and what is now called the EU - institutions both established after the horrors of 1939-45, following all the massive loss of life and literally millions of refugees on the road. Currently there is a war in Europe, with increasing tensions along NATO's borders. Wars across whole areas of Africa and Asia, death and destruction in Gaza and the West Bank and the continuing displacement of millions... the list goes on.

World leaders, by their words and whims and actions, touch the lives of millions, and are impacting incalculably on the future of the planet. As we gather to remember, you may also want to join in prayer for world leaders and those who hold economic power, for wisdom and for a peace which is based not on military and economic threat, but on justice. Without justice, there will be no peace.

POLICE FILE



To contact your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) online, use the quick and simple online contact tool - Search *Lutterworth Police*. You will be asked a few questions to make sure your query gets to the right place.

The Information Commissioner's Office has recently outlined a general code of practice that will help in matters of personal privacy, especially aimed at CCTV and door-bell cameras. Where possible, owners should position their cameras to only capture their own property - you shouldn't capture more than you need to... However, in practice, especially in the street scene, this may not be possible.

Where CCTV captures someone else's property, a public area or communal space, and images, voices or personal information of other people may be captured, then data protection law applies. For more information and guidance please go to: ico.org.uk

The subject of home surveillance equipment is not usually a policing matter, and generally, disputes and queries will be referred to the ICO. However, where genuine distress, proven harassment or inappropriate use of the device, or data collected is noted, the police will be able to ascertain if an offence has been committed.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Ash Die-back

In this series we've looked at a number of non-native invaders into the natural environment of the UK. In general, introduced species tend to be intentionally imported species of fauna and flora that, at the time, were deemed to be ornamental or helpful to us or the environment in some way, but which have subsequently developed less favourable traits.

The really pesky ones though, are those that make their own way to our shores, often as seed or spores, on the wind or on imported materials. Ash die-back comes into this category. Ash die-back is not actually the disease, it's the symptom. The disease is caused by a fungus that grows within the ash tree, disrupting the flow of water and nutrients through the plant and manifesting itself as the distinctive dying back of the crown and tender growing shoots of the tree. Younger, more vigorous trees are affected most, as they are more actively growing



than older trees. In the youngsters the outcome is generally the complete death of the tree, whereas in more mature and less active trees there is a greater resistance, where the tree may survive but is greatly challenged. A couple of typical victims are found along the road to Theddingworth; one completely dead and, on the other side of the road, another gamefully fighting back.

First reported in the south-east of the UK in 2012, it was initially thought that disease spores blowing over from the Continent were the source. However, subsequent tracking of the progress of the disease indicated that infected imported stock was also largely to blame. Thankfully, there is evidence that the UK ash population has a better resistance to the disease than those on the Continent, where up to 95% of affected trees have been lost... touch wood!

SCHOOL REPORT

HUSBANDS BOSWORTH C. of E. PRIMARY SCHOOL Head of School Alison Vickers

Creativity Week brought a vibrant energy to every classroom, with children exploring the lives and work of a range of artists across the school.

Class 2 learned all about Kandinsky and why his abstract art was so famous. They particularly enjoyed experimenting with colour mixing! Class 3 explored the artwork by Claude Monet and recreated Monet's Bridge over a pond of water lilies, looking carefully at how Monet used the colour to reflect light and tone.



Class 4 looked at the industrial artwork by L S Lowry and focussed on using his famous five-colour palette to create their own industrial landscape and street scenes of Market Harborough. They had a lot of fun incorporating the cats, dogs and people that make Lowry's work so intriguing.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

In November 1932 The Market Harborough Advertiser & Midland Mail reported that Market Harborough Urban District Council was considering tenders for the erection of six council houses in Welford Road. The tenders received were higher than expected, in the region of £2100 for building all six, and councillors quibbled the specification, pointing out that the Ministry of Housing had



reduced the height of rooms in a previous application from eight feet to seven feet, and that it was likely that the bay windows would be deleted. However, the councillors felt that they should argue that the bay windows be retained, to match those of the previously built homes.

The borough surveyer pointed out that the tenders were also higher than expected due in part to the need to extend the land drainage by 100 yards, and also noted that the lie of the land meant that the last house would need a seven-step rise to the front door! The contract was eventually accepted, and in early 1933 an application was lodged with the Ministry of Housing for a grant of some £1900 towards the cost.

HDC Community Grant Fund

For a second year, Harborough District Council (HDC) is administering a Community Grant Fund for Town and Parish Councils. This fund is worth £1m and will only support capital projects and initiatives across the district. Husbands Bosworth has been allocated £20k. Projects submitted for consideration must adhere to strict criteria and also create a lasting asset and improvement.

Any organisation applying to the Community Grant Fund must have a letter of support from the Parish Council prior to a submission. Organisations making an application must be properly constituted and have bank accounts in the name of the organisation for at least three years.

All applications to the fund will also need the written support of our District Councillor, Amanda Nunn. The final decision of all grant applications will be taken by the HDC Cabinet Sub-Committee for Grants.
