Last year, Harborough District Council's emerging Local Plan review identified the site (HBI) as suitable and available. Alongside this, the district's strategic housing review set the housing requirement for Husbands Bosworth at 105 more homes for the period to 2041.

There are obviously a number of concerns with such a large development, that need to be addressed - school capacity, utility and service provision, traffic, visual impact...

The promoters consultation gives us until March 8<sup>th</sup> to raise these concerns - if you feel strongly, in either direction, take the opportunity to HAVE YOUR SAY!

# BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

## WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

### Grey Squirrel

We've looked at a number of invasive species that have integrated themselves into our local wildlife, noting that most have had a detrimental effects on the native species.

The most commonly seen 'invader' that we come across locally is the grey squirrel, which is now found pretty much anywhere in the UK where there are trees and hedgerows. Introduced from North America, they are first recorded as escapees from Hanbury Park in Cheshire in 1876.

Greys are cunning and opportunistic, and have become tame and cheeky visitors to domestic gardens and parks, where they have learned that there is often a free meal-ticket. (If push comes to shove they can even swim!) Neither species hibernates, although they do form untidy nests (dreys) in the high branches of trees where they may spend cold days keeping warm and conserving energy. It's not unknown for them to gain access to roof-spaces in buildings, where they can cause damage to electrical wiring and water pipes - the evidence being a stash of empty nut kernels.

Widely considered as pests, greys are larger than the native red squirrel, out-competing for both territory and food resources, and are also carriers of a deadly virus to which reds have little immunity. Any red squirrel populations, which have survived the invasion have retreated to the more inhospitable regions of Highland Scotland and 'safe' pockets where they have been reintroduced.

Recent estimates put the grey squirrel population in the UK at over 2.5 million, whereas only about 220,000 red squirrels were recorded, of which 180,000 were in Scotland.

Had Beatrix Potter's Squirrel Nutkin been dull grey rather than fluffy red with tufty ears, the whole conservation movement in Victorian Britain would have struggled to get established...

## BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

At Historical Society HQ we often receive inquiries relating to family history, usually from someone chasing tenuous links, which they assume their ancestors may have had with the village.

A while back we had an email that turned out to be more of a cry for help than an inquiry, from a lady who was seeking past memories of Bosworth for her step-father, who was sadly suffering from advanced dementia.

Her step-father was Michael Stanyon, and much of his remaining memories centred around glimpses from the past that he recalled of his own father, Edgar Stanyon.

Happily we were able to delve into our Archive Collection and library of past publications and come up with a number of photographs of Stanyon family members, and even several articles written by Edgar for the *Bygone Bosworth* series.

Edgar was born in 1898, one of a family of eight children (Edgar was a twin), who lived in a two-bed cottage on Church Street. In one of the *Bygone Bosworth* articles Edgar recounts his experiences of going to war, and being drafted to the Western Front. In late 1917, whilst advancing on the beleaguered town of Cambrai along a sunken roadway, his patrol was hit by a German mortar. Four men were killed outright and four, including Edgar were severely wounded. Edgar's arm was shattered by shrapnel and was only saved by strapping it to a trenching tool.

## ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

**"Nobody expects the Spanish Inquisition!!"**

An Easter Reflection from Canon Chris Oxley. Monty Python fans (myself included) will recognise the above outburst, when three of the cast crashed into a room, dressed as Cardinals, but wearing flying-helmets, and talked a load of nonsense!

In 1<sup>st</sup> Century Palestine, at the time of the 'trial' and execution of Jesus of Nazareth in Jerusalem, for being a trouble-maker from 'up north', nobody was expecting the Resurrection!
