

## WIDER BOSWORTH

**I**t seems like building developments relating to the village are like buses... you wait around for ages, then two turn up at once! In fairness the newest development to poke its head above the parapet, the development off the A4304 Theddingworth Road, has been in the pipeline for quite a while.

The site went before the planners in 2018, and approval was granted for nine dwellings, (*Ref. 18/00056/OUT and 20/02061/VAC*). An earlier proposal for 12 homes, and subsequent amendments to the entrance to the site, was withdrawn, in part, due to Section 106, Community Contribution requirements, which the reduced proposal would have side-stepped. However, a new proposal now being considered, would see the original applications being re-visited, and the number of homes on the site being increased again.

The site was identified in the review of the village's Neighbourhood Plan as a preferred option within a revised Settlement Boundary. Professional assessment rated the site as available, deliverable and potentially suitable, with a maximum capacity for 47 dwellings. As always... watch this space!

## RUBBISH IDEA...

**I**n response to the government's directive, all local councils are obliged to provide a waste food doorstep collection service. The service was due to come into force on March 31<sup>st</sup> 2026. However, the lead-time has proved too short for some councils, including Harborough, due, unsurprisingly, to problems with the supply of the required bins and specialist collection vehicles.

Villagers with long memories will recall a similar programme of waste collection back in 2010, when Harborough was one of the top recycling authorities in England. In its first year of operation the service was said to have removed almost 1,500 tonnes of food waste from landfill, much of which came to the Pebble Hall Waste Centre, at Theddingworth.

Problems with changes of contractor, staffing, low renewable energy returns from processing the material and the lower than expected tonnages, saw the service withdrawn after little more than two years.



The government's directive is banking on changes in peoples' attitudes to recycling and 'green' credentials to make the service more sustainable this time around.

The service is now pencilled in by Harborough to commence in November 2026, and will operate similar to before, with a small (7L) kitchen 'caddy' and a larger (23L) lockable bin for the kerbside collection. Collection will be weekly, alongside the fortnightly black and blue/green bin collections.



## BUGLE POSTBAG

*From Action Fraud UK*

Romance fraud is booming, as criminals continue to exploit online relationships and manipulate people into transferring money. Particularly distressing to victims, romance fraud is closely linked to social media and dating sites, where offenders can create convincing false identities, often using AI-generated messages, profiles and images. In many cases, it is also linked to fake investment opportunities.

As part of this campaign, we are urging the public to stay cautious when forming relationships online, and to recognise the warning signs:

- Be cautious of individuals who express strong feelings early on
- Be wary of excuses not to meet in person, or to avoid live video calls
- Never send money, cryptocurrency or gift cards to someone you have not met face-to-face

- Be alert to requests linked to investments, medical emergencies or travel costs

- Speak to a trusted friend or family member if something feels unusual or pressured

Friends and relatives are also urged to watch out for signs of this type of crime in those around them.

### E-SCOOTERS AND E-BIKES

A quick legal reminder

Having received complaints about e-scooters and e-bikes being ridden on footpaths and roads, causing concern for pedestrians and other road users, it is worth clarifying the situation with regard to the law.

#### PRIVATELY OWNED E-SCOOTERS

- It is illegal to ride a privately owned e-scooter in public spaces, including pavements/footpaths, roads, parks and other public areas
- Privately owned e-scooters may only be used on private land with the landowner's permission
- If you are caught riding a privately owned e-scooter in public, it may be seized by police

#### E-BIKES Electrically Assisted Pedal Cycles (EAPC)

An e-bike is treated the same as a normal pedal cycle if it:

- has pedals that are able to physically propel it
- has a motor with a maximum continuous rated power of 250 watts
- has a motor which cuts assistance above 15.5mph (25km/h)
- is under the control of a rider aged 14 or over

E-bikes that do not meet these rules (including those with a 'feet-off' or 'twist and go' speed facility) are treated as motor vehicles rather than an EAPC.

#### REPORTING

- If someone is riding dangerously and there is an immediate risk to the public, call 999
- Otherwise report via 101 or online. If possible include: time, location, direction of travel, description, and any relevant footage (CCTV, doorbell or dashcam)

# BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

## WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

### Little Owl

In this series where we have looked at invasive species that have taken up lodgings in our countryside, the predominant theme has been focused on these that have had an unintentional, and usually unsavoury influence on the native populations.

So, it comes as quite a surprise that the Little Owl, which appears to have no known vices, is in fact a non-native, introduced into the UK as late as the 1870s, presumably as a decorative bird in private collections, notably at Lilford Hall, near Oundle.

Native in lowland temperate zones from Denmark through to China and around the Mediterranean maritime rim, and restricted to England and the Welsh borders in the UK, the Little Owl, quite exceptionally lives comfortably alongside our native birds, in its own little niche in nature!

About the same size as a large upright thrush, plump, with dappled grey/brown plumage and rounded wings, Little Owls are not totally nocturnal, and can often be spotted during the day, perched on a fence post or telephone pole, quietly watching the world go by!

Flight is typically short and undulating, with a determined destination. Generally a silent observer, the Little Owl's call is a thin, cat-like *kee-o*, or an urgent *kwif, kwif* when startled or threatened.

Undeniably cute and cuddlesome, across Europe, Little Owls are often referred to as the Owl of Athena - Athena being the Greek goddess of wisdom, the Arts... and war!

## BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

This wonderful photo, dates back to the summer of 1956, and shows the celebration of *Corpus Christi* at the Sulby Polish Resettlement Camp.

After the Second World War the former RAF base at Husbands Bosworth was given over to the National Assistance Board to house displaced Poles, who had chosen not to return to their homeland. The former RAF domestic buildings, located on the Sulby side of the aerodrome site, housed over 500 displaced persons in family units.

Staunch Catholics, the Poles were hard working and strongly family orientated and established a self-reliant community, furnishing their sparse Nissen huts as cosy family homes.



The camp had their own priest, Father Lewandowski, and the former RAF gymnasium was transformed into a chapel, dedicated to Our Lady of Ostrobrama, with elaborate *trompe d'oreil* decorated drapes representing carved marble columns, statues, effigies and religious icons.

The festival of *Corpus Christi* commemorates the Last Supper, and the belief that the bread and wine represent the body and blood of Jesus. Celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity, 60 days after Easter, it features special Masses and public Eucharistic processions, often accompanied by floral decorations. *Corpus Christi* 2026 falls on June 4<sup>th</sup>.

So, to 'retirement' eight years ago .... so many people in such contrasting contexts seeking to live out faithfully their calling as Christian disciples!

I recognise more and more that who I am. How I see and relate to the world, is so deeply formed by the quality of these life-giving relationships, and my only possible response to that is thanksgiving. Add to that the fact that so many folk on this very long list will not even be aware of what a blessing they have been to me, and to Paula. I find that deeply moving. It has been a huge privilege and a blessing to have shared so much in so many lives, for which I thank God.

Perhaps you have your list of people who have been a blessing to you! Perhaps, at the same time, we can all be attentive to how we can be a blessing to others! *Blessings...*
