

DIGGING THE PAST...

As part of the Leicestershire Festival of Archaeology*, Husbands Bosworth Historical Society, alongside the *Leicestershire Fieldworkers* archaeological interest group, will be hosting an Archaeological Open Day on the village Playing Field, on Saturday, July 25th.

The event is free to enter and is aimed at promoting archaeological interest locally, and giving folk an opportunity to see and participate in a number of aspects of investigative archaeology.

With the kind permission of the Parish Council, we will be demonstrating field walking and interpretational techniques, including test pit digging, geophysical ground penetrating scanning, field walking and metal detecting.

Heritage experts will be on hand to help us look into Bosworth's past and interpret what we find, and help us to build a picture of how, and why, our community has developed, looking back as far as Neolithic times...

In the Pavilion, there will be displays of artefacts, presentations and demonstrations of 'lost' arts, including flint knapping and arrow making. Come along and help us uncover what is beneath our feet, and hopefully develop an enduring interest in the past!

I would just like to add that the 1,000 residents of this camp and 50 similar camps in the UK, were survivors of forced labour, brutal Siberian deportations and concentration camps. Most had been removed from their homes in Poland at gunpoint.

After the war they were left marooned, as their homes had been destroyed and Poland was a satellite of the USSR. Stalin was again in charge. The few who returned, were for historical reasons considered traitors, tortured and imprisoned. However much desired, returning to their homeland was an impossible choice.

If you would like to know more about the Polish residents, I am giving a presentation about the Camp to the Welford and Sulby Historical Society on October 1st at 7.00pm in the Chapel Schoolroom. I'm assured all are welcome.

POLICE FILE



To contact your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) online, use the quick and simple online contact tool - Search *Lutterworth Police*. You will be asked a few questions to make sure your query gets to the right place.

Criminals use 'spoofing' software to intentionally cover up their real caller ID and instead, mirror the phone number of a legitimate organisation. They do this to make it appear that calls or text messages are coming from a trusted organisation like the police, banks or government agencies.

These scam calls may be automated, or from a real person. Their main goal is to trick you into sharing personal information or to transfer money.

These crimes typically begin with an unexpected phone call from someone claiming to be a police officer or bank employee. Victims may be told their account is at risk or that they are assisting with an investigation, before being instructed to make a low-cost sample purchase. Purportedly this is to check that they are looking at the correct account. Of course, in reality, this is the work of criminals, and any bank or personal details that you have given will be compromised.

If you've lost money or have been hacked as a result of responding to a phishing message or scam call, you should always report it to Report Fraud.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Cow parsley, common hogweed or....

If you grew up and played in the countryside, the chances are that you will be able to identify cow parsley, the common weed with the frothy white umbrella of flowers, standing erect on thick, fibrous stems and soft, 'feathery' leaves, that vies with nettles for attention in early spring. The stems are hollow and in country-craft handed down through the generations, you will know that they make great pea-shooters or whistles!

Common hogweed is very similar and is often confused with cow parsley. However, it is usually considerably taller, with ridged and greeny-purple stems and larger leaves. Growing in unimproved grassland, wetlands and waste ground, there are fine examples in our own Millennium Wood. Like cow parsley, common hogweed is particularly attractive to a wide variety

of insects and, with it's long flowering season, the seed heads provide a valuable source for birds and small mammals.

The 'fly in the ointment' however is a malevolent non-native relative - Giant hogweed... Introduced as a decorative plant into Victorian gardens, Giant hogweed is often referred to as Britain's most dangerous plant - and not without good reason. The sap is irritant and can cause blistering and intense pain, often requiring medical intervention.

Thankfully, although widespread, giant hogweed is readily identified, growing up to three metres tall, with distinctive blotchy purple stems and leaf nodes, and usually restricted to derelict land, especially near water courses.

Enjoy the countryside... but be aware that some parts of it may be out to get you!

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

We recently received an inquiry from the grandson of Charles Woodhouse, who ran the Union Anchor Inn at Kilworth Wharf on the Leicester Line of the Grand Union Canal, which passes through Husbands Bosworth Parish. Charlie was a well-known local character, who besides running the Anchor public house, also operated a small fleet of canal boats, carrying coal for a coal yard and lime for burning in kilns on the site.

Our enquirer reminds us that the canal boats at this time were hauled by boat horses, and recounts an incident when Charlie's boat horse slipped into the water and, unable to get out, drowned, causing much upset within the family, and no doubt causing much consternation in the haulage business...

Charlie drew coal for his coal yard by boat from the Erewash valley in Nottinghamshire, and limestone for burning as building lime and agricultural soil conditioner from the Derbyshire quarries, often working two 20 ton laden boats single-handedly up through Leicester to North Kilworth Wharf... an arduous task for a fully-crewed journey!

When the ill-fated Foxton Inclined Plane boat lift was being dismantled in 1927 Charlie's boats were contracted to carry the scrap iron away. However, it is recounted that over-zealous loading resulted in one of the boats breaking its back and sinking in the lift lower basin.

Today the wharf is run as a modern boat yard offering permanent moorings, day-boat and longer term boat hire, boat building and paint-shop facilities.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 6th June 2026

Present: Four Councillors, no members of the public

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr. Forman & Cllr. East.

The minutes of the Annual Meeting and Ordinary Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 5th May 2026 were read and approved.

Matters arising from the Ordinary Parish Council Meeting (for report only)

- ❑ Clerk confirmed litter pick equipment requested previously, had been ordered
- ❑ Cllr. Hobson updated Council on challenges meeting the criteria, laid down by Highways, to site a mobile Speed Indicator Device (SID) in the village, and that all five lamppost sites proposed were rejected, despite three of these having previously been approved. Additionally each site would need a site licence and must undergo an annual structural survey. After discussion, it was agreed that Council would abandon the funding application from the Police & Crime Commissioners Road Safety Fund.

Finance

- ❑ The monthly schedule of receipts and payments for May 2026 were received and confirmed.

Internal Audit Report

- ❑ Clerk reported that the examiner was satisfied that the internal controls and general governance are robust and in very good order. Recommendations focused on improving the information available on the website and minor improvements to information relating to expenditure, which the Clerk understood and will carry out. Cllr. Hobson, on behalf of Council, thanked the Clerk for his diligent work

Planning Overview

- ❑ April / May 2026 planning applications overview was presented and agreed in respect of the following applications: 26/00470/OUT & 26/00542/PDN

Millennium Pavilion

- ❑ Wall plaques project - Clerk advised that he was awaiting a revised quote and guidance on their preferred option to transfer the wall plaque images. It was proposed he prepare templates to help decide the location of the images ready for printing up
- ❑ Garage Project - Clerk advised base had been installed as planned and that delivery and erection expected at the end of June. An option to add electrically operated doors to the specification was approved

Acoustic Treatment

- ❑ Clerk confirmed that a Community Grant application for funding sound-deadening for the pavilion meeting room had been submitted

Millennium Wood – Section 106 Projects

- ❑ Information Boards - artwork for two interpretation plaques for the Woodland that had been submitted for printing up
- ❑ Boardwalk - the boardwalk installation has been completed

Parish Maintenance

- ❑ Council approved quotations for installing a new notice board at the allotments, installing three new benches in the cemetery and a 'sleeve' for the new flagpole at the pavilion
- ❑ Councillors agreed a quote to clear the drainage ditch next to the Scout Hut
- ❑ Tree survey - Council agreed a quotation for a tree survey too be undertaken

CHURCH NEWS

All Saints Parish Church & St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church

ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting was held in All Saints church after the Wednesday service, on May 13th. This was an opportunity for everyone in the parish to find out what has been going on in the last year (2025) and was preceded by a short meeting to elect the Churchwardens - we are allowed two.

Peter Bugge agreed to serve another year, but Jeremy Ingram did not stand for re-election due to pressure of other work. Jeremy does, however, continue as Treasurer to the PCC, and the PCC are grateful for his past work in both roles. Peter Jones continues as Secretary to the PCC the other members being Di Jones, Jeremy Ingram, Jean Hutchings, Amy Kendrick, and new member, Mary Timson. Finances remain just about in balance, income against expenditure, and our Parish Share - what we give to the Diocese towards the costs of funding the Church's mission and ministry - was £5,000.

The sale of the Church Hall is ongoing and we hope to sell with outline planning permission for the site with one or two dwellings, which should make it much easier to sell. Some expense has been incurred to ensure there are no restrictions from the Diocese or the Charity Commission, but the sale was too complex to take forward without professional help.

The other project taking up time and effort is replacing the heating in the church. The Diocese are very particular about what can and can't be done, and just when we thought we were making progress we have had to stop and think again!

Fund-raising events last year included the Pudding Evening and the Christmas Tree Festival, but without more support it will be difficult to keep these going.

While the five yearly (Quinquennial) inspection report for 2020-2025 indicated that the building was generally sound, a large piece of plaster has recently fallen from an internal wall so there will be another drain on our limited funds to rectify that.
