

STITCHING UP THE COUNTY

The Government's recent announcement on local government reorganisation for Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland proposes to reorganise the existing 10 councils into two unitary councils.

One authority will be an enlarged Leicester city and the second will be the remainder of the county and Rutland - the 'do-nut', one of the proposals put forward by the city council in the consultation.

Although some areas around the periphery of the city will be lost to the new city council, most of Harborough, including Husbands Bosworth, will be served by the new council for Leicestershire and Rutland.

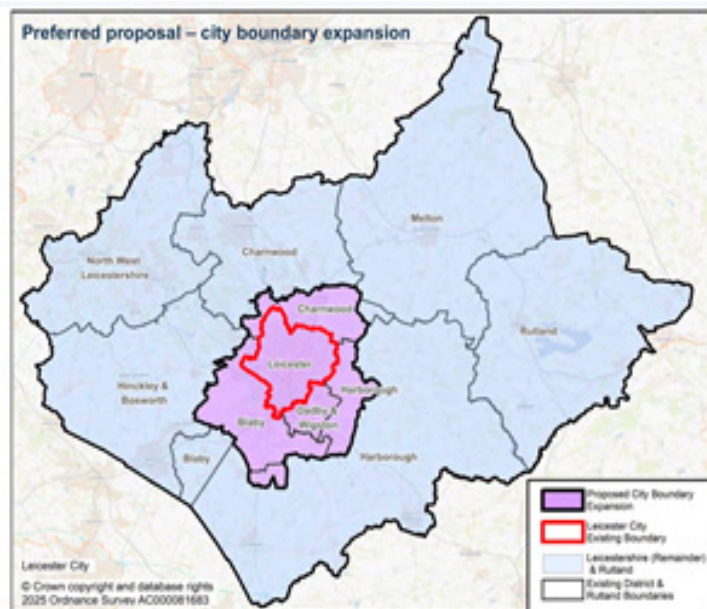
The Government has ordered that the new authorities be up-and-running from April 2028, and delivering all services to residents.

Of course, we all saw it coming - Harborough District Council, local MPs, parish councils and residents across the district have strenuously opposed this format from the start.

Following the announcement, Cllr Whelband, Leader of Harborough District Council, stated that all council services will continue as usual, and has vowed to challenge the outcome.

In Parliament, MP Neil O'Brien questioned the Secretary of State's reasoning, and queried the viability of a single county authority covering such wide and diverse geographical area.

A jointly developed website has been established by all 10 councils – www.futureLLRcouncils.gov.uk – to help keep residents informed. Further information will be added to it in the coming weeks and months. WATCH THIS SPACE...

Our dedicated Road Safety Teams continue to monitor speeds in local village locations in our area on a regular basis. Whilst on-station the Road Safety teams also monitor erratic driving and incidences of seat-belt non-compliance.

A recent visit to High Street, Husbands Bosworth noted 8 offences of speeding within the 30mph controlled area during the period of monitoring.

Whilst we do conduct regular and scheduled legally enforceable speed checks throughout the county, we may, in some circumstances, also be able to authorise and train volunteers to conduct advisory community speed checks.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WALKS ABOUT BOSWORTH...

If you are interested in local history, the outdoors, fresh air and walking, you can combine all these elements in a series of local self-guided historical walks. There are four walks, all starting and ending in the parish, each over easy-going terrain, mainly off-road and of between 3 and 4 miles in distance.

Bomber County explores Bosworth's wartime history, with a walk across the former RAF Husbands Bosworth site, **Tunnel Vision** tells us about the coming of the canal to Bosworth in 1815, **Bridled Passions** takes us down the ancient cattle-droving road towards Mowsley and **Locked Down** follows the story of the Welford Arm of the canal and how, in 1969, it was saved from dereliction.

CANAL CAPERS

Dog-walkers and other users of the canal towpath will no doubt have noticed that the Canal and River Trust (CRT) has recently been carrying out much-needed restoration work on the canal towpath and bank-side between Honeypot Bridge and the tunnel eastern portal. Over the years the Parish Council and local residents have been pressing CRT to improve this important link in the local footpath network, but as a permissive path, CRT's remit has always been to carry out the minimum of work. The Parish Council is now looking at proposals to set up an 'adoption' scheme, similar to the one the *Friends of the Welford Arm* run at Welford Wharf, which, with community input, would potentially enable greater local control over the on-going maintenance.

With the support of Walcote Parish Council we are planning an exciting project, 'Finding Hidden Walcote', that will look into the past of Walcote village. This project will focus on the village of Walcote and the surrounding fields and farms, utilising our core disciplines of desk-based research, test-pitting, fieldwalking and geophysics. Unlike TV's *Time Team* however, it will not be over a weekend, but potentially over a year or longer depending on the opportunities that the residents and local farmers offer us. Finding Hidden Walcote will hopefully be a role model that can be replicated across the whole of South Leicestershire in the future.

In preparation for the project we will be running a group test-pitting training day, on Saturday, October 3rd, at Lutterworth Museum. It is a full day, with operational theory in the morning and results analysis in the afternoon. This will be limited to 25, on a first-come-first-served basis. BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

We're a little out of parish with our image from the Archive this month, but still reasonably within context... The picture, of course is of Foxton Locks, and was taken during the drought of summer 1933. Being the summit level of the Leicester Line of the Grand Union Canal, the 22-mile level between Foxton and Watford, relies on water drawn down from Welford, Sulby and Naseby Reservoirs, which has historically been subject to water restrictions.

The back-to-back drought years of 1933 and 1934 put particular strain on the water supply over whole of the national canal system, and probably hastened the movement of traffic off the waterways. The canal company, desperate to maintain traffic, relied heavily on auxiliary pumping systems to move water back up the summit pounds in order to maintain operational depths.

Here we see a portable steam pump being installed over the tail of lock 16, above bridge 61 at the bottom of the Foxton flight, and getting ready to back-pump up the flight - the delivery piping to take water back up to the top, is clearly evident to the left of the picture. A second pump was sited above the middle pound to complete the lift. Of course, the Inclined Plane boat lift, which would have dramatically reduced the amount of water required to move traffic up and down had been abandoned in 1910 and dismantled in 1926.

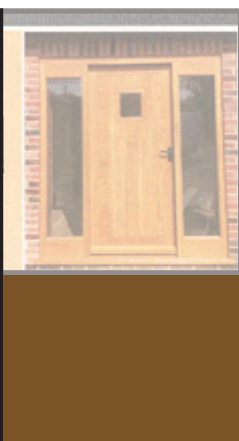

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PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

MAJOR ROADWORKS PLANNED

Leicestershire County Council will be carrying out a major £1.9 million upgrade on Rockingham Road and Gores Lane in Market Harborough, to reduce congestion and improve pedestrian safety. The work, which includes carriageway upgrades and the redesign of the Gores Lane / Rockingham Road junction, adding a turning lane and a new pedestrian crossing, will commence in August and is likely to continue into spring 2027, causing peak-time delays.

Improvements and realignments of the Clarence Street and St Mary's Road junction will also be carried out, aiming to ease traffic flow, and an 18-month trial of a one-way system northwards, will come into place in Clarence Street. This scheme will be monitored to assess traffic effects relating to the amenity of local residents and changes in traffic movements in Albert Road.

Improvements to walking and cycling, which will include widening the shared path between the railway bridge and Rockingham Industrial Estate, alongside improved cycle parking, will be incorporated into the schemes. Street-scene and other environmental enhancements, including tree planting, will also be introduced.

Significant traffic disruption is expected on these routes and surrounding areas as the work continues into spring 2027. Drivers are encouraged to monitor live traffic updates and diversions using the *one.network live* traffic map.
